

## These were my kicks on Route 66 By Juanita Stroup, Sapulpa, Oklahoma

The most magnificent landscapes of our traveling are found on Route 66. The fond memories are etched in our minds and we sincerely hope they never fade away.

While traveling through New Mexico in 1957, we stopped at a roadside stand where Navajo Indian girls were selling necklaces made from seeds and nuts found in their area (also some made of colorful beads). They were shy and could not speak English very well, but were thankful we had purchased their jewelry.

While visiting my parents who lived on Route 66 in Stroud, Oklahoma, the sirens started blaring as there was a tornado sighted. We hurredly ran to the closet, got our coats (as it was pouring down rain), and headed for the storm cellar. To our amazement it was nearly full of people we had never seen before. They were traveling on Route 66, heard the sirens, saw the cellar, and made a fast dash for it. There was much wind damage but were thankful those in the cellar were safe.

We not only got our kicks, but pricks on old 66. I remember the first time we drove to California in 1952. As we went through the desert the cacti were in full bloom. My mother and I thought they were pretty. We parked the car and picked some of the flowers from a cactus bush. To our dismay, we had a hard time pulling out the painful hard to see prickles from our tender skin.

#### These Were My Kicks on Route: 66 By L. W. Barber, Yukon, Oklahoma

Oh, the thrills and chills of old Route 66, and what memories. Nothing in my travels can come close. I was born on old 66 in 1918, 5 miless east of Clinton, Oklahoma. Closest elevator and general store: Indianapolis, OK. I attended 1st grade at the Red Rock one room school. 66 was a dlin road, muddy when rainy. 66 followed section lines and when the road turned it was a sharp 45 degree (no problem at 5mph). In 1934 I had a worn out 11927 Ford T coupe and was going up Golf Link Hill om 66 east of Clinton. About <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> to the top, moving 3mph, and foot on the low band pedal; a freight line truck (Roadway) came up behind me amd gave me a push, say 10mph. At the top of the hill, I pulled over real quick, waved thanks, and he wentton his way. Coming or going across the New Mexico, Arizona, and California desert, I always had a 50lb chunk of ice wrapped in a blanket. Usually traveled by night: saved tires, car, and did not have to pay \$1.00 for a cabin with a dirt floor or \$2.00 for one with a floor and water cooler (window swamp bucket, they called them). I can remember 1936-39 just west of Hydro on 66 a filling station was selling bootleg whiskey, short pint, for 50 cents (screw cap). Good whiskey, too!

On a trip through the desert on 66 driving at night I was told aspirin and Coke would keep you awake like NoDoz. Sure did. I forgot to get gassed up and ran out of gas about 2am. I stayed awake for sure. So old 66 has not only been a thrill but a necessity, almost.



#### **HOW TO GET INVOLVED**

The Board of Trustees met on October 4. 1990 at the Association's office in Bethany. Kent Martindale, Creek County Trustee, was selected to head up the Nominating Committee for the upcoming election of the 1990-91 Board of Trustees. The by-laws provide that there shall be 15 Trustees elected, 13 from the counties of Route 66, and 2 from the membership at large. The Counties include Ottawa, Craig, Rogers, Tulsa, Creek, Lincoln, Oklahoma, Canadian, Blaine, Caddo, Custer, Washita, and Beckham.

Each of the counties is to select a representative and notify Kent by Friday, November 9th. If a county position is not filled, the nominating committee will choose someone from the general membership.



## **HELP PLANT TREES IN TULSA**

Historic Route 66 along Eleventh Street between 73rd East Avenue and 119th Street in Tulsa will have a new look soon thanks to volunteers from the Tulsa Chapter of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association and corporate donors. Volunteer Sixty-Sixers will be planting trees on November 13.

Shirley Hoppes, project coordinator, said, "our goal is to preserve and promote economic development along the old highway. One way of doing that is to plant trees. We're planting for tourism and for beautification of the Route."

Also on November 13, a sign will be erected on the southeast corner of 11th Street and Memorial Drive in honor of the planting and to acknowledge the companies that have donated materials and money to purchase the trees.

These companies are: Public Service Company of Oklahoma, Yamaha of Tulsa, Oklahoma Natural Gas, Purity Oil Company, Guaranty Bank and Trust, American Red Cross, Crow Brothers Toyota, Pick-Up Partners, and Trim Rite.

Hoppes said the cost of purchasing, planting, and maintaining the trees for two years is estimated at \$29,000. After two years the city of Tulsa will care for the trees. Please join in the planting and help beautify Historic Route 66 in its hometown of Tulsa.

#### **BUSH SAYS: STUDY ROUTE 66**

President Bush signed a bill recently asking the National Park Service to conduct a study on the impact Historic Route 66 had on American culture. Senator Pete Domenici, sponsor of the bill, said the study will determine the best ways to preserve, commemorate, and interpret "America's Main Street". Representative Wes Watkins of Oklahoma was a co-sponsor of the bill. Domenici said Route 66, first designated in 1926, represents a bygone era in America, a time of some of the most significant population shifts of this century. The study will address the feasibility of preserving, through private and public efforts, what remains of the 2,400 mile highway and the facilities associated with it. A group of delegates from each of the Route's eight states (including Oklahoma, the home of Route 66) will be organized to conduct the study.
