


MEMBERSHIP REPORT






GET YOUR KICKS !!!

We opened a small craft shop July 1, 1989 as a hobby for me and an outlet for my husband's love of woodworking. Now, 18 months later it has consumed our lives.




The Oklahoma Route 66 Association is seeking volunteers in two different areas:
