THE CRUISE IS COMING JUNE 11TH!

The KRUSE International Car Auction was a success for the route 66 Association. We made many contacts, provided information about the association to those interested and circulated information about the upcoming cruise. We thank Rocky Santiago for inviting our Association to participate in the car auction again this year.

Speaking of the **Route 66 Cruise**, plans are being formulated now for the June 11th event. The cruise will begin in Oklahoma City or Quapaw with closing ceremonies to be in Oklahoma City at Shepherd Mall on Saturday, June 11th. The mall is located on 23rd St. which is part of the original Route 66 alignment through Oklahoma City. The cruise will be a poker run, as in the past, with participants acquiring a minimum of 7 validations at check points in the communities along Route 66 (no more than 1 validation per town). The activities will consist of car show, trade show, community exhibits, concert and entertainment. Many other activities are in the planning stage and information will be forthcoming.

On June 10th pre-cruise parties are planned at Shepherd Mall and in Miami.

The purpose of our association is to promote tourism and economic development. There has been much talk about how the cruise should be done. Some say we try to do too much and there is not enough time to make the distance. Others say we are not helping the communities and the businesses in the towns along Route 66 because there is not enough time for cruisers to frequent their shops. Our board has wrestled with the problem for three years to try to come to some conclusion pleasing to all concerned. We are going to try to run two separate events this year, the first on June 11th covering the eastern half of the state. The second event will be in mid-September and will be for the western half of state. By doing this, we hope to help both sides of our great state and give all those involved more time to see what our state and communities have to offer.

All businesses along the Route that wish to be check points need to contact the office no later than May 1st. We need to get to you your stamps, check point posters and rules packet for this cruise.

We are also requesting donations of prizes to be given as door prizes at the closing ceremonies.

KOMA Radio in Oklahoma City will be our major coordinator for advertising the Route 66 Cruise. Stay tuned for more information and good oldies music. Don't forget the **James Leake Car Auction on June 4th and 5th at the Tulsa Fairgrounds.**

Preservation News from Sally Ferrell Chair, Preservation Committee ONE MORE FOR THE ROAD

In the last newsletter's item about Route 66 roadside properties nominated to the National Register of Places, we listed 20. One got overlooked. To set the record straight, please add the old Stroud Hotel building. There may and probably will be more after the next National Register Review Committee meeting set for July 21, 10 am at the Oklahoma Historical Society Board Room. Members will consider several more properties that have been awaiting owner notification process.

If you want to know more about this nomination process, plan to attend the meeting and meet the members. Susie Clinard, Director, Oklahoma Main Street Program, serves as chair and Architectural Historian. Other positions include Historian: Dr. Leroy Fischer, Stillwater; Historical Archeologist: Towana Spivey, Ft. Sill; and Architect: Bill Peavler, AIA, Oklahoma City.

We'll stay tuned in and report when the whole Route 66 nomination "package" of properties is on its way to D.C. and national approval for this distinction.

ENDANGERED LIST FOR '94

Many Route 66 Association members may not be aware yet of a new statewide organization formed to promote and aid historic preservation in Oklahoma. Chartered in 1990 and named **PRESERVATION OKLAHOMA, INC.**, it is headquartered in Oklahoma City with Robert Erwin as director and Hiram Champlin of Enid is president.

An annual project (the first was last year) is assembling a list of Eleven Most Endangered Historic Properties in Oklahoma. Deadline for '94 suggestions is April 1 with announcements to be made at the annual Preservation Conference in Ft. Sill, May 12-14. If you wish to make suggestions, call or write:

INVITATIONS SENT BUT NO ONE CAME

Oklahoma Historical Society Route 66 Project Director Sandy Stratton sent letters to owners of National Register Route 66 properties, advising of a meeting March 14 to explain the "Design Assistance" program. Results were a few phone calls and no attendance. True, Monday morning is a business day for most and some of us might feel if we have an early day picture of our building that's all we need for restoration.

The statewide program, allotted only \$10,000 of the large Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act grant, is to pay 80% of an architect's fees to address your building's architectural details and exterior maintenance so the building can be restored properly and enhance the number of Route 66 travelers. Our buildings are a large part of what tourists come to see.

Oklahoma's Unsolved Mysteries

"The Tri-State Spook Light"

One of Oklahoma's oldest unsolved mysteries came to public attention around 1886 when residents near Hornet, Missouri, 11 miles southwest of Joplin, became alarmed about a giant ball of light bouncing over the hills and through the fields, scaring cattle and causing dogs to howl.

Although Missouri first promoted the phenomenon, the light concentrates most of its appearances along the Devil's Promenade Road northeast of Miami, Oklahoma.

Different people describe the light in different ways. Some say it floats head-high; others say that it divides into two or three parts that go bouncing over the countryside like bright balloons. It might dance within arms length, then retreat, disappear and suddenly reappear behind you. It seems impossible to approach the light; if you get too close it simply fades. Photographers wait for hours to get a picture of it, but seldom are able to get closer than a mile away.

Having been sighted for over a 100 years, many legends surround the "Spook Light".

The oldest legend was handed down by the Quapaw Indians that lived in the vicinity. A handsome young Quapaw brave fell in love with a beautiful Indian maid but her father, the Chief, wouldn't allow them to marry. The couple eloped and the chief immediately sent warriors in search of them.

Knowing they would be captured, the couple decided to commit suicide by leaping from a high bluff overlooking Spring River. The bluff, known as Lover's Leap, is close to Devil's Promenade bridge along spook light road toward the town of Quapaw. According to legend, the spook light burns as a symbol of love between the Indian brave and his maiden.

This story is interesting because it has been pretty well substantiated that the young Indian lovers did exist and did commit suicide at Lover's Leap. As for substantiating that their spirits have returned, well...?

For those who insist on scientific reasons for the "Spook Light", there are theories that it is a refraction of car lights from **Highway 66 near Quapaw**, nearly 15 miles away. It has also been suggested that the light is simply a glow of minerals and gases from lead and zinc

mining once done in the area. The problem with these explanations is that the light was sighted long before cars, highways or mining were even in the area.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at Camp Crowder, Mo., studied the spook light in 1946. After several weeks, the group concluded the phenomenon was "a mysterious light of unknown origin."

People come from long distances in hopes of viewing the weird spectacle and no matter how practical one may be, the spooky nature of the aptly named apparition always creates a "goose-bump" feeling. Damp misty nights always seem best for viewing the eerie spectacle. However, it can be seen in all kinds of weather.

The area is not heavily settled and for the most part is timber land. Roads are not paved and by day, take you through scenic rolling country--especially at this time of year before the leaves have given up the ghost.

To find the "Spook Light", take the first Missouri exit east of the turnpike toll gate, double back west along the south outer road to state line road (gravel), and take state line road four miles south to the spook light road.

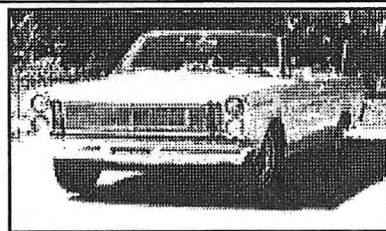

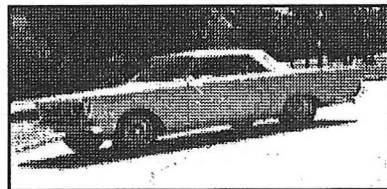
