## Group wants to preserve Stroud's old school

I asked Mr. Jim Beech of OK. Dept. of Transportation about the 1927 Rt. 66 WPA sandstone Stroud four-room, one story school building. "I'm trying to find somebody now to tear it down," he said. "We've talked to the City of Stroud and "the historical society" and nobody's interested...it's in horrible shape."

I said that the county historical society was never contacted about it and perhaps would have some interest in it as they are committed to preservation of county heritage. This is a Lincoln County property that is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is alongside Route 66, soon to be an American Scenic Byway. If this building is entitled to a stay of execution, the time is now or never.

"Sure, get a key from Tom Bigby at the Turnpike Gate and go on and take a look," he said.

The Stroud schoolhouse was damaged in the tornado of May 3, 2000 which destroyed the Stroud Tanger Mall and caused much other damage in the area. It is owned by the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority or Oklahoma Department of Transportation.

A number of people were present at the visit, including architectural experts. All agreed that all the stone walls are very sturdy and intact. All of the tall, double-hung window frames are intact, many still boarded up. Some glass is broken of course, and half the roof is missing. The interior is full of debris but the

lowered ceiling would be eliminated anyway. The stage area is to the north; it was originally a two-room school.

What a wonderful place to do many things or for travelers just to circle around and look at it. The massive hand cut stones are beautiful and the ribbon-like protruding mortar almost art. I believe the following generations will be appalled that we did not save it for them to see and use.

The Lincoln County Historical Society has discussed and tentatively agreed to sponsor a feasibility study funded by the Preservation Services fund, National Trust for Historic Preservation if the match funding (estimated \$1,000) could be obtained and there is interest in saving the property on original site.

To find the place? Coming from the East, it is exactly one mile west of the Hwy 99 & 66 intersection; watch for crossing and 45 mph sign; turn right, north for couple of blocks across overpass.

Coming from West? Turn North, left, first crossroad after passing hospital on right... intersection isn't real noticeable... if you miss it, just turn around and come back, looking for that yellow crossing sign.

### **Protest held on threatened section of Spur 281**

A small but dedicated group of protesters gathered at the Cherokee Trading Post in Canadian County on Tuesday March 28<sup>th</sup>. After a quick meal at the Restaurant, where various members of the media caught up with the group, everyone headed west out to the section of Route 66 slated for destruction by ODOT.

Jim Ross had been scouting the area ahead of time and had made contact with the construction company's job superintendent. He discovered that they had been instructed to help us out in any way possible. And indeed, they went out of their way to find us a good

spot to park and protest.

As the Burma Shave-like protest signs were hammered into the ground, the two television stations and the Learning Channel video crew that came for the event swooped in. When Lucille Hamons held up one of the smaller shield-like protest signs, the still photographers went crazy.

There were about a dozen of us holding signs and waving at the cars and trucks whizzing by (many of which waved or honked back in sympathy). Standing by the side of the road, it was hard not to be somewhat bitter. The road crews had been busy carving out new lanes and looking at all the land that is being utilized, we couldn't help but wonder why ODOT just didn't make 66 a frontage road like it had for the parts that parallel I-40. Surely there could have been enough room...

Another thought that crossed my mind was how big Oklahoma is. Our state faces so many different threats to the Route – loss of pavement as well as buildings – but with active members being so scarce, it is like trying to put out a fire one eyedropper of water at a time.

Now allow me to editorialize a bit.

Are you a car club member that likes to cruise Route 66? You need to get actively involved in preservation – otherwise there won't be a 66 left to cruise.

Do you like to drive old 66 to see the wonderful architecture? You need to get actively involved in preservation – otherwise there won't be any neat old buildings left to see.

Do you like to shop or eat along 66, meeting the owners and reveling in the ambiance? Then you need to get actively involved in preservation – otherwise the struggling owners won't be able to get the much-needed preservation funds that will be available under the Route 66 Corridor Act to maintain their buildings so they won't burn to the ground from aging wiring, etc.

Bottom line, folks, the current active leadership is burned out. We are too few and the state is too big for a mere handful to continue on. John Ackenhausen, our president who has been running himself ragged trying to cover the entire state because we have virtually no county reps, will be stepping down. Joe Kisicki, our Executive Director who has been keeping the Association database, networking with a number of

groups and working with the state so we will qualify for some matching state funds, will be moving out of state. And I am wearing so many different hats for the Association as secretary, answering the mail, doing the newsletter, putting together the annual Trip Guide and helping with preservation issues that I simply can't take on any more hats (in fact I need to shed a few) and still earn a living.

The need for preservation is acute. So is the need for people willing to undertake a more active role in the Association. If we could get 15 or 20 people to truly participate, no one individual would have to shoulder too much responsibility. Won't you consider being a county rep? Or how about volunteering to staff the office in Arcadia? Or taking over the computer? Or what about joining the preservation committee? Most state 66 Associations have a good 40 people or more who participate in preservation projects. We are doing good if we have that many show up for our annual meeting! Most state 66 Associations have hundreds and hundreds of cars show up for their cruises. We've had to stop doing ours for the moment because less than 20 cars ever show up.

This is your state Association – it is time for YOU to get involved. Because, frankly, if you don't, the Association will cease to exist. And our demise will mean the end of 66 and all that she represents here in Oklahoma. The forces of destruction are too great. And we will only have ourselves to blame.

### **Calmez Hotel threatened with destruction**

The six-story Calmez Hotel in Clinton may well be demolished as the city plans to open the bidding process in August on a new conference center.

It was built in 1929 and the latest estimates to rehabilitate the downtown landmark have come in at \$3.5 million. Preservation, Oklahoma has tried to interest a number of private investors in rescuing the building since 1995 but none have shown any interest.

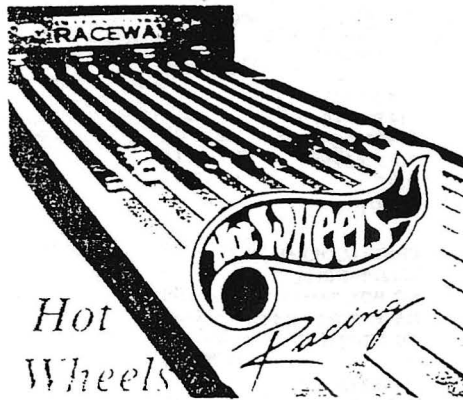

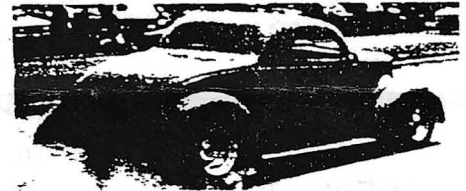
