Come Celebrate the Mother Road's 76th Anniversary with Us!

Plans are underway for the 2002 Cruise and Car Show/Rod Run. Inside you will find a Registration Form. Mail in the form before May 1 to receive the pre-registration discount. If your membership has expired as of May 1, renew on the same form in order to take advantage of the membership rate. We will mail you a confirmation letter after we receive your form and payment.

After May 1, do not mail us the form. Simply bring it with you on June 7 or 8 to either of the two start points. Fees will be higher at that time. Make sure your membership is current (bring your membership card), or plan to renew at that time - you will lose the membership discount otherwise.

Our two start points this year are the Old Hotel Bed and Breakfast in Sayre and Waylan's KuKu Burgers in Miami. We are in need of volunteers to help at these two locations. This would include explaining to people how to fill out the forms, selling our tee-shirts and other merchandise, signing folks up, answering questions from newbie cruisers, stuffing cruise packets, etc. We also need volunteers on late Saturday afternoon in Chandler to help decorate for the sockhop, check-in cruisers, and set up tables for the Association. As for activities: on Thursday night, there will be a Dutch-treat dinner at the Steak House near the Old Hotel Bed and Breakfast in Sayre and the Pizza Hut Express in Miami. In Sayre for Thursday evening, we are trying to arrange for a private, escorted tour to the usually-inaccessible concrete alignment of 66 to the ruins of the old bridge crossing. Miami is working on a mini-car show for Thursday and Friday nights while El Reno will have events Friday night and Saturday that west start cruisers may want to check out. On Saturday night, we will have our own sockhop in Tilghman Park in Chandler, after Chandler's Ice Cream Festival. Sunday morning there is a pancake breakfast to benefit Chandler seniors, tours of the Old Armory which is undergoing restoration, the Car Show/Rod Run, and of course, our closing ceremonies. As more information becomes available, we will update our web site. We hope to have one more newsletter out before the cruise, but if for some reason we don't, the web will be your best source of the latest news - including information on our grand door prize - a '66 T-Bird!

Also, be sure to check out our Mailbox Photo Contest. Deadline is May 1 so you don't have much time to capture the most unique mailbox on Oklahoma Route 66!

President's Corner

Preservation projects, the Cruise and Car Show/Rod Run, the Trip Guide, and more – there is a lot going on right now with your Association.

Jim Ross and I completed the Roadbed Survey Documentation Project and turned over the materials to the State Historic Preservation Office. This was financed through funds made available through the Route 66 Corridor Act/National Park Service. We are awaiting feedback on what photos they'd like turned into prints. The project has moved into the next phase, where another team is trying to come up with strategies to maintain the integrity of the roadbed and its intrinsic structures (old bridges, railroad trestles, etc.) while keeping an eye on public safety and realistic maintenance costs.

For those of you who attended the annual meeting, you heard Rob Gragg of the Oklahoma Scenic Byways office talk about the advantages of 66 becoming an official Byway. We are hopeful that within the next few months the Tourism Department will officially announce that Oklahoma Route 66 and the Talimena Drive are the State's first two Scenic Byways. Many thanks to Bill Fernau for having the fortitude to wade through the paperwork and government speak.

Preparations for the Cruise and Car Show (technically the Car Show is a Rod Run, but we are putting the two terms side by side for those of us not into the arcane language of car clubs) and the updating and production of the Trip Guide are happening simultaneously. Both require much care and time to ensure a great result.

The search for an Executive Director continues. This position is critical to maintaining a good relationship with the Tourism Department and our ability to receive some state funds to help offset certain expenses. We also still need county reps. As our Association grows, it is on the county level where more and more things will be occurring.

I encourage as many of you as can do so to become actively involved – we really need your help. Even submitting something for the newsletter would be greatly appreciated!

**Limited Edition Postmark
Envelope/Cachet Still Available**

We still have a number of our unique, limited edition special commemorative postmark envelopes/cachets.

The envelope features two custom pieces of art. The first design is imprinted on the linen envelope itself. A montage of pen and ink-style vintage Oklahoma Route 66 landmarks shares space with a special slogan about Oklahoma and the official logo of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association.

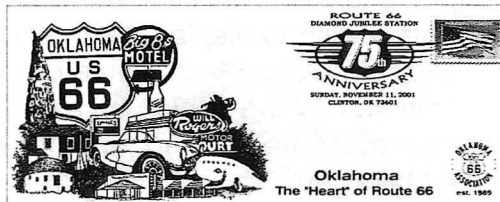
The second custom piece of art is the actual postmark. The striking design is adapted from the official Oklahoma Route 66 Association 75th Anniversary logo which is used only during the year 2001. This unique postmark was only available from the Clinton, Oklahoma post office and, like all event postmarks, was destroyed 30 days after first issue.

To complete the special cachet, the Association chose the stirring "Honoring Veterans" flag stamp. This stamp proved to be extremely popular nationwide and is now out of print.

The date of first issue, appropriately enough, was November 11th – which has the twin distinctions of being the official 75th Anniversary

"birthday" of Route 66 and Veteran's Day. The envelope's rarity is further demonstrated by a Sunday postmark.

Only 1000 cachets were printed. They are available in white or cream linen envelopes with either black or blue ink for the postmark.

Hidden Treasures

This is a new column we are debuting in this issue. If you are familiar with the literature and videos done about Route 66, you know there seems to be a "standard" group of businesses and places that are "must-see" locations. But as we all know, there are lots of equally cool places along the road that don't get the same kind of notice.

We'd like to feature in this column those lesser-known kinds of places. We ask that our readers submit their "hidden treasures" and then we will reprint their finds in their own words.

We ask that businesses NOT submit something on themselves for use in this column. If you are a 66 business and have something going on, we will be glad to share the information, just not under this heading.

Our first "hidden treasure" comes from Bill Fernau, who, in fact, suggested the idea for this column while uncovering all kinds of neat places and meeting lots of wonderful people during his

quest to restore the old Phillips 66 station in Chandler.

"If you like junqueing as much as I do, a must-stop is James Meabon's Classic Junk and Construction Metals at 15373 West Highway 66, just west of Sapulpa. His yard is located near the Turner Turnpike/Highway 33 ramp to Route 66.

"James' business has been located on the Heartland Highway for three generations of Meabons and is worth a look-see for great stuff.

"The least you'll walk away with is a rich 66 experience – you may even get a free candy bar!"

In Passing

Since our last newsletter, several people with deep ties to the Road have passed away.

Jim Gilbert of St. Louis MO died in late January. Jim was the driving force behind the Chain of Rocks Bridge project, which resulted in it now being open to bicycle and pedestrian traffic.

Ginny Waldmire, mom of 66 artist Bob Waldmire (and 4 other brothers), and wife of Cozy Dog inventor Ed Waldmire, passed away in early February.

Each has left their own special imprint on the character of Route 66. They will both be missed.

Award Nominations Now Being Accepted

The National Historic Route 66 Federation is now accepting nominations for the John Steinbeck Award and the Cyrus Avery Award, to be presented at the International Route 66 Mother Road Festival in Springfield IL in late September.

The Steinbeck Award goes to an individual deemed by the National Historic Route 66 Federation and the John Steinbeck Foundation to have contributed significantly to the preservation of Route 66. Past winners have been Michael Wallis, Tom Teague, Angel Delgadillo, and Jim Ross.

The Avery Award is presented to a state Route 66 Association or other group with the most outstanding Route 66 preservation project. This award was first presented last year in Albuquerque - the winner was the Illinois Route

66 Association for its work on the Odell filling station.

Nominations for both awards may be made by any individual or organization. Written nominations should be sent to the National Historic Route 66 Federation, P.O. Box 4223, Tujunga CA 91043. Nominations will be accepted up to July 31, 2002.

Students to Travel 66

Students from Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore MD, will be conducting an independent study of Route 66. While traveling the Route, they will attempt to chronicle what has become of the Mother Road nearly 20 year after the Interstate bypassed the last town.

One of the things they want to accomplish is study the changes that decommissioning and bypassing brought to the people who live and work along the Road. They are eager to interview as many people as they can, giving them a chance to share their stories of life along the road – both pre and post Interstate – and how their lives were changed when the road was finally bypassed in their area.

TEXAS ROUTE 66 EVENT DRAWS CELEBRITIES

The 1st Annual Route 66 International Roadie Gathering on August 17th, originally scheduled to take place in Adrian, Texas, has been moved to the near-by community of Vega, located on Route 66 north of Interstate 40 at exits 35, 36, and 37 (exits 35 and 37 are Route 66) in the Panhandle, approximately thirty-five miles west of Amarillo. The new location was selected to provide better accommodations for the public (ie: adequate rest rooms, meeting rooms, motels, and cafes). Vega is also the original location selected for the awards banquet, featuring celebrity guests Martin Milner of the TV series *route 66*; and author/historian Michael Wallis.

Scheduled activities include a Show and Shine, Artists and Photographers' Exhibit, Writer's Seminar and Book Signing, Q&A Period with Marty Milner, Autographs from Artisans, Entertainment by The Quest (Rhythm and Blues Band from England), and Tours to the nearby Cal Farley's Boys Ranch.

The Pizza Farm is a one-half acre demonstration farm that connects students with the origin of their favorite food – pizza! It is circular (like a pizza), is divided into 8 pie-shaped "slices" (like a pizza), and is growing or grazing all the ingredients needed to make a farm-fresh pizza.

Guests at the Pizza Farm see, touch, and learn about wheat farmers for the crust, tomatoes for the sauce, dairy cows for the cheese and even pigs for the pepperoni. Experience wholesome family fun down on the farm!

The Grand Opening will be in the Spring. Tours are guided and last about 1 hour. Pre-K through Seniors are welcome. Admission will be 4.50 for kids and seniors, 5.50 for adults. Group rates of 4.00 each are available.
