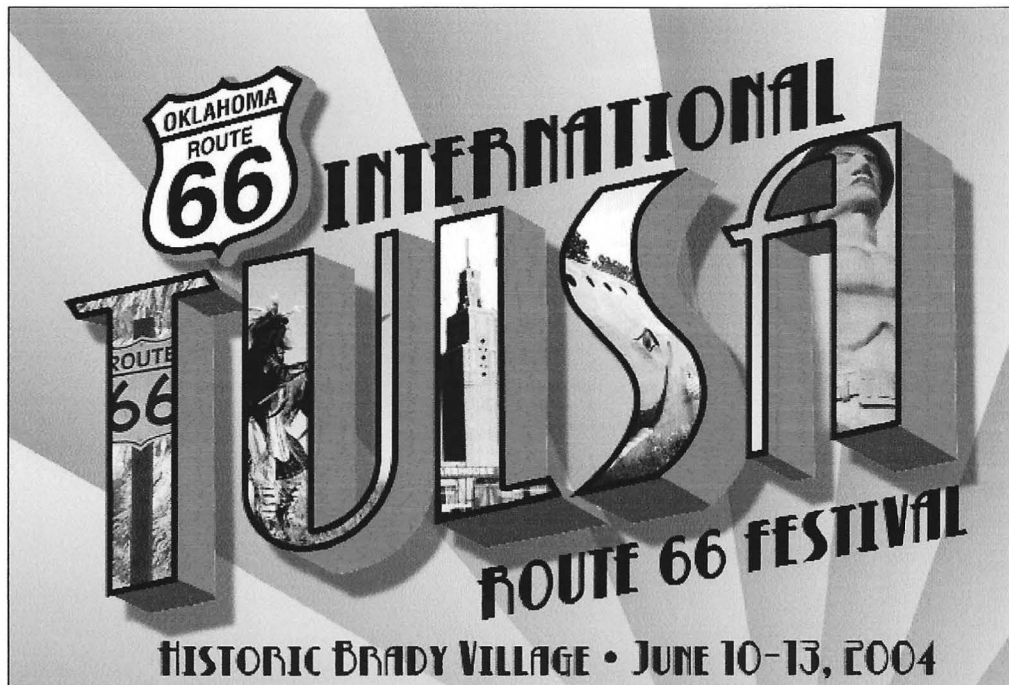

Mark your calendar now and make plans to spend June 10-13 in Tulsa as the International Tulsa Route 66 Festival comes to town.

The festival, which celebrates the history of the Mother Road in the hometown of Cyrus Avery, the "Father of Route 66," kicks off the evening of June 10 with a concert by Asleep at the Wheel and the opening of vendor booths and exhibits by Route 66 authors and artists. The booths and exhibits will remain open all weekend.

June 11 brings the annual John Steinbeck Awards Evening, which honors some of the "movers and shakers" of Route 66 and culminates in the presentation of the prestigious Cyrus Avery and John Steinbeck awards. The Cyrus Avery Award honors an exceptional historic preservation project on Route 66, and the Steinbeck Award honors an individual who has made a significant contribution to the Mother Road.

Tours of Tulsa attractions including the Boston Avenue Methodist Church, Mayo Hotel and other historic sites will be offered June 12. The "Route 66 CPA Run," a 5K run/walk, is also scheduled for the morning of June 12, along with a Route 66 road rally. A tour of the historic Greenwood district is slated for June 13 and will cover the area of Tulsa once known as America's "Black Wall Street." Read on for details about these events and more.

Dinner to honor 'movers and shakers'

Steinbeck evening
not to be missed

From authors to preservationists to just plain road warriors, the John Steinbeck Award has been presented to some of the Mother Road's best-known and best-loved citizens.

The tradition began on an October evening in 1997, under a tent in Landergin, Texas, where the National Historic Route 66 Federation presented the first-ever Steinbeck Award to Tulsa's own Michael Wallis, author of *Route 66: The Mother Road*.

Since then, this award — presented annually to an individual who has contributed significantly to the preservation of Route 66 — has been presented to a historian (Tom Teague of Springfield, Ill.); a guardian angel (Angel Delgadillo of Seligman, Ariz.); a pathfinder (Jim Ross of Arcadia); a pair of preservationists (John and Lenore Weiss of Wilmington, Ill.); and a road warrior who serves as an informal ambassador for Route 66 (Jeff Meyer of Chicago, Ill.)

The tradition will continue June 11 at the Adam's Mark Hotel in Tulsa, where another diehard roadie will be honored with the prestigious Steinbeck Award.

Route 66 musical slated for festival

Northern Arizona University Theatre will present the musical *Route 66: A Celebration of America's Main Street* during the International Tulsa Route 66 Festival.

This musical revue combines history, literature of the road, images and songs featuring a cast of seven young professionals, the storytellers of Route 66, who play more than 100 different roles.

The show will be presented at 2 p.m. June 11 and 12 on the campus of Oklahoma State University-Tulsa.

Advance tickets, which must be purchased by **June 1**, are \$12.50 for adults and \$5 for children 12 and under. Tickets also will be available at the door; prices are \$15 for adults and \$7 for kids 12 and under.

The Route 66 CPA Run, a 5K run and walk, will begin at 8 a.m. June 12 at Skelly Stadium, located at the intersection of 11th Street (Route 66) and Florence in Tulsa.

The race, established by the Bama Companies, Oklahoma Soci-

ety of CPA's Accounting Principals and Tulsa University, is a fundraiser for the Citizen's Crime Commission.

The run will follow Route 66 between Harvard and Utica, finishing on the 50-yard line of Skelly Stadium.

The route will take participants past such historic sites as the Tulsa Monument Co. and Rossi's filling station.

Those who don't feel like running can enjoy a relaxing walk down Route 66 instead.

The cost is \$18 in advance or \$20 on race day and includes a free race T-shirt, two free TU football tickets and plenty of food.

Activities abound for auto enthusiasts

Car lovers will see paradise by the dashboard lights this summer in Oklahoma as classic car shows, road rallies and cruises make their way up and down the Mother Road all season.

The fun begins June 4-6 in El Reno, where “**A Small Town Weekend**” will include hot wheel races, a legal Route 66 burnout and closed cruise. Admission is free.

In eastern Oklahoma, admirers of custom hot rods can cruise a few miles off 66 to Grove to check out **Darryl Starbird’s Rod and Custom Car Show** on June 5 and 6.

Make a weekend of it and head down to Sapulpa on June 5 for the **Route 66 Blowout**, which includes a classic car, truck and motorcycle show, among other activities.

The next weekend brings a host of activities to get your motor running at the International Tulsa Route 66 Festival:

- The **32nd Annual Leake Car Show and Auction** — the nation’s largest indoor collector car auction — will be held June 11-13 at Expo Square in Tulsa. This event will feature 600 cars, including antiques, classics, customs, rods, muscle cars and more. Admission is \$10 for

adults and \$5 for kids; doors open at 9 a.m. daily.

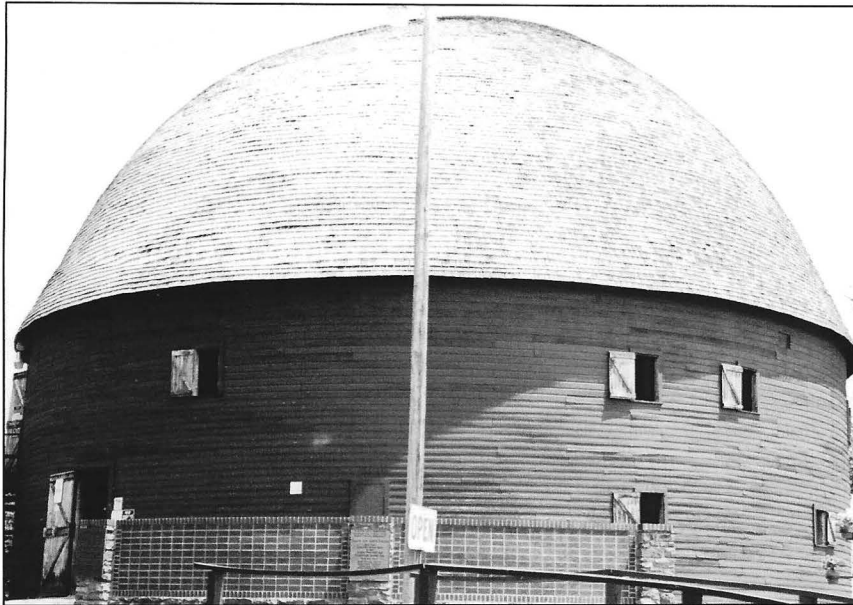
