

## **HELP PRESERVE A MOTHER ROAD ICON**

The bad news: The building that housed the Meadow Gold sign at Lewis and 11th (Route 66) in Tulsa was torn down this summer. The good news: Before the building came down, the sign was removed and put into storage at Claude Neon Federal Sign in Tulsa. Preservationists hope to relocate the sign and restore it. The restoration, excluding installation of the sign in its new home, is expected to cost \$44,150.

During the sign's removal, Rick Schmigle, vice president of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, removed the remaining glass tubing from the sign. A few pieces remain intact. The sections that are broken will be cut into short pieces, fire-polished for safety, and sold to raise funds for the sign's restoration. Some sections will be mounted on plaques for easy display, and a very limited number of the sections will be relit and used to illuminate shadowboxes featuring an image of the sign. Prices have not been set yet, but these rare, historic conversation pieces will be a bargain at any price. Save your pennies — you won't want to miss this opportunity to own one of these tangible links to Route 66 history when they become available!

# Harness the power of the press to raise awareness of Route 66

## **By Emily Priddy**

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the first in a series of articles about how to work with the press to focus positive attention on Route 66.

As a journalist, I see a lot of press releases. Most of them are passable, a few are exceptional, but a substantial number contain errors that range from mildly annoying to absolutely ridiculous.

The number-one error I see in most press releases is omission: Public-relations specialists leave out some important piece of information. EVERY press release you send out should include the five W's that are so basic to journalism: Who, what, when, where, and why.

1. Who: Who's the contact person? Every press release should include the name and number of someone who can answer questions about your group or event.

2. What: A brief summary of

what's going on. Notice the word "brief." You don't need every detail of a three-day festival; just pick the highlights and mention them.

3. When: The time and date of the event.


**4. Where:** The location of the event. And by location, I mean EXACTLY where it's happening. Include the exact address ... and directions, if necessary.

5. Why: The reason for the event. This shouldn't be flowery or elaborate. If it's a fund-raiser, say it's a fund-raiser. If it's a celebration of an anniversary, say it's a celebration of an anniversary.

If your press release includes these basic pieces of information, you'll increase the chances of getting media coverage.

Better coverage means better turnout for your event ... which can only be good for the road.

## Andy Payne's widow, Vivian, dies at age 96

Another milestone has come and gone along the continuum of Route 66 history.

August 6, 2004, saw the passing of Vivian Payne of Oklahoma City at age 96.

Widow of Bunion Derby winner Andy Payne, Vivian was born on Jan. 31, 1908, and later became a schoolteacher.

One of her former students, 20-year-old Andrew Hartley Payne of the Route 66 town of Foyil, made sports history in 1928 by winning the transcontinental footrace that became known as the "Bunion Derby."

Vivian and Andy were married on August 12, 1929, and lived in Oklahoma the remainder of their lives.

Andy (born the day

after statehood on Nov. 17, 1907) went on to become Clerk of the Supreme Court of Oklahoma.

He died at age 70 on Dec. 3, 1977.

Vivian was known as a gracious lady whose door was always open.

Over the years she assisted hundreds of reporters, researchers, authors, and filmmakers in helping create a lasting historical tribute to her famous husband.

Vivian is survived by her daughter, Norma Roupe, who cared for her during her golden years, and a son, Jim Payne of Norman.

As an icon within the Route 66 family, she will be greatly missed by all who consider the road "home."

Rest in peace, sweet Vivian.



## Preservation grants awarded

Roofs aren't glamorous, but they are what keep the weather out, and they are the first-line of defense in stabilizing and beginning the rebirth of many historic properties along Route 66. This year's projects funded by the National Park Service's Route 66 Corridor Preservation Program include a number of these "roofing" projects, along with a number of other important preservation efforts.

The Program distributes cost-share funds to eligible preservation and research projects through a competitive process. Over the first four years of the Program's existence, approximately 50 projects have been funded in the eight states through which Route 66 passes.

The Program received 28 eligible applications for funding in this year's grant cycle.

Three were received from Arizona, two from California, four from Illinois, two from Missouri, nine from New Mexico, seven from Oklahoma and one from Texas.

Thirteen projects have been selected to receive cost-share grants totaling approximately \$121,000 in 2004. They are:

 Soulsby Service Station in Mount Olive, Ill., has received funding to assist in finishing the restoration of this classic service station built, owned, and operated by the Soulsby family from 1926 until 1991. The Soulsby Station Society has been working with the current owner to undertake a first-class restoration of the station, which was listed on the National Register of Historic Places earlier this year.

 The Palms Grill in Atlanta. III., has been awarded costshare funds to develop a Historic Structures Report in order to guide the restoration of this National Register building to its 1940s appearance as a popular eating establishment and bus stop.

 The classic Red Cedar Inn Restaurant, built in 1934 in Pacific, Mo., will receive funds to assist with the rehabilitation of the kitchen. The building was listed on the National Register of Historic Places last year.

• The early 1930s Owl Courts on the Route 66 Beltline in Oklahoma City will receive funds to assist with the replacement of the roofs over the café and motel buildings. The owner intends to restore the motel rooms for heritage travelers on Route 66, and to house his extensive collection of Route 66 memorabilia, a postcard shop, and an office in the other structures on the property.

 The Old Trails Garage, built in 1915, had been used as a dealership in garage and Kingman, Ariz., up through the 1970s. Funds have been awarded to assist with re-roofing the building, which is within the Kingman Commercial National Register Historic District. The owner plans to restore the facade with the Old Trails Garage lettering on the wall, as well as repair and reinstall the old Packard neon sign currently in storage.

· The 6th Street Chevron Station, built in 1939 in Amarillo, Texas, has received cost- share funds to assist with roof repairs, wall repair, re-installation of neon lighting on the canopy eaves, and reinstallation of tin

ceiling on the canopy.Del's Restaurant has been a thriving business in Tucumcari, N.M., since 1956, and will receive funding to assist with the restoration of its neon sign (you know, the one with the cow on top of it).

The 1931 sandstone Lexington Hotel in Gallup, N.M., will receive cost-share funds to assist with electrical upgrade, window repair or replacement, and front- facade repair on this building that was saved from the wrecking ball and put back into service by its current owners.

The 1953 Desert Sun Motel in Winslow, Ariz., will receive funding to assist with the replacement of the roof, which is part of a larger project in which the owner plans to restore the neon sign and repair or replace the windows to keep the motel in good operating condition.


· Phase III of the Route 66 Oral History Project, administered by the New Mexico Route 66 Association, will result in the publication of a Route 66 Oral History Guide; two more workshops; and a listing of extant oral histories, their condition, location and accessibility.

· Northern Arizona University will receive funding to assist

with the dramatic production of Route 66: A Celebration of America's Main Street, which provides an entertaining interpretive and educational venue for examining the highway's historic and cultural significance in American history.

· Funds have also been awarded to assist with a comprehensive survey of transportation-related properties along alignments Route 66 in California, including at least four alignments in the greater Los Angeles area. Information from the survey will be used to establish priorities for preservation



Oklahoma will serve as the focus for this pilot project, because of the high number of road segments in Oklahoma that are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.




