How to talk to a news reporter

By Emily Priddy

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the third in a series of articles about how to work with the press to focus positive attention on Route 66.

Being interviewed by a reporter seems scary, but it really isn't a big deal if you're prepared. Here is a list of advice to follow and pitfalls to avoid when being interviewed:

1. Know your subject.

2. If you don't know the answer to a question, admit it — then do some research and call the reporter back with the answer to his question or the name and number of someone else who can help him.

3. Be positive. An interview is not the time to air your dirty laundry. Talk about what's right, not what's wrong.

4. Speak in complete sentences. "Yes" and "no" are not quotable.

5. Don't speak too quickly. If you talk too fast, you increase your risk of being misquoted, because reporters are more likely to write something down wrong if they're going too fast. If you're being interviewed in person, watch the reporter's pen. If he's writing furiously, stop at the end of your sentence and let him catch up. If you're being interviewed by phone, listen carefully; if there's a long silence or a lot of scribbling sounds after you complete a thought, you're probably going too fast. Slow down.

6. Be patient. Most reporters have no clue what you're talking about. Be prepared to answer a lot of silly questions. Be prepared to repeat yourself. The reporter isn't stupid. He's just trying to make sure he gets the story right.

7. Think before you speak. If you say something — especially on the record — and then try to take it back, you put the reporter in a very uncomfortable position. Should he put himself in the unethical position of letting a source control the content of a story? Should he risk making a source mad? Whatever he does will be wrong. Don't trap him like that.

8. Don't ask personal questions.

9. Don't touch the reporter ... or his notebook.

10. If your event would make a good photo, suggest it. If there's something really cool on the premises — monster truck, live rattlesnake, world's largest corn dog, whatever — make sure the photographer knows. If he wants to photograph you, LET HIM. Even if you're having a bad hair day. A picture of a person will draw in a lot more readers than a picture of an inanimate object.

Next issue: What to do after the interview.






