Planned stops include the Coleman Theatre, Main Street Diner, Blue Whale, Shoe Tree, Rock Café, Seaba Station and more.

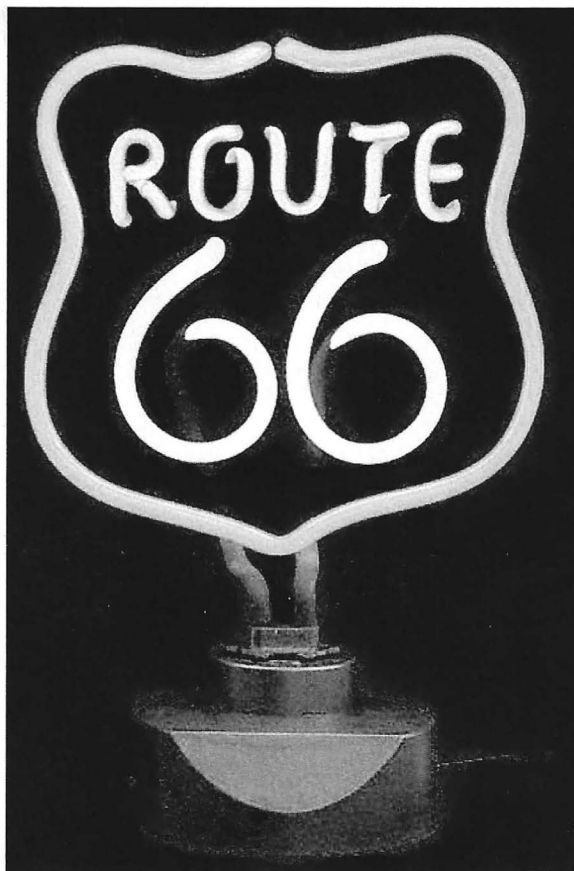
The first 200 participants will receive goody bags. Those completing passports will receive a special award and will be entered in a drawing for exciting prizes, including signed artwork by Oklahoma's

# What to do after a news interview

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the fourth and last in a series of articles about how to work with the press to focus positive attention on Route 66.

So you've written a successful press release, gotten a reporter's attention and survived an interview. What now? Here are some dos and don'ts to help you after the interview:

- Don't ask to see a copy of the story before it runs. The answer is no. The only person who should see a story before it goes to press is the editor. Period.

- Don't just ask for a copy of the article. Reporters do a lot of interviews, and it's hard to remember who asked for a copy of which article. To make sure you get a copy of the story, mail the reporter a self-addressed, stamped envelope, along with a note reminding him who you are, when he interviewed you, and when the article ran. Send your request promptly so he doesn't have to look all over to find a copy of the paper with your story in it. If he still forgets, call him and ask (politely) whether he got the envelope.

- Give the reporter a number where you can be reached if he has additional questions when he's writing up the story. Sometimes reporters think of questions while they're writing their stories, and sometimes editors come up with questions the reporter never thought to ask. In both cases, it's good to make yourself available at the last minute. Reporters appreciate your accessibility, and it reduces the risk of errors if the reporter and his editor can verify information during the editing process.

- Don't overreact to errors. If the date or time of the event is wrong, your Web address is misspelled, or the phone number is printed wrong, call and ask for a correction. Otherwise, think carefully. By demanding a correction, you stand a good chance of getting the reporter in trouble. Is it worth it? If the error affects the success of your event or people's perceptions about 66, by all means, call and complain. If you must complain, be polite, and be very clear in explaining the error. If the error doesn't hurt anything, let it go. You can always correct the reporter next time you work with him. And learn from someone else's mistake. I've had reporters make mistakes in stories because I talked too fast, gave them so many details at once that they couldn't keep track of all of them, or said something in a way that confused them. Those mistakes taught me to be more clear and concise while being interviewed. You can't change the past, but you can always learn from the past to make the future better. And isn't that what Route 66 is all about?

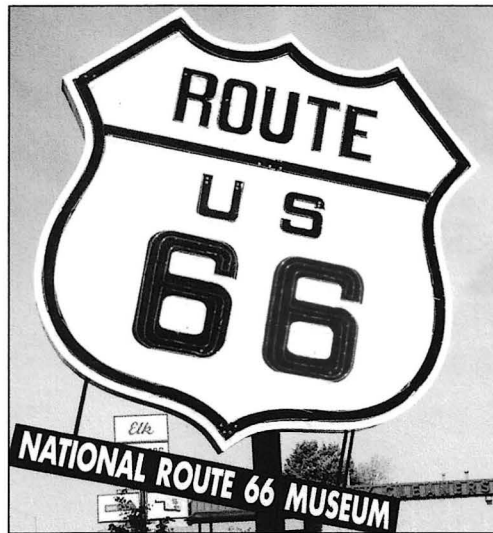

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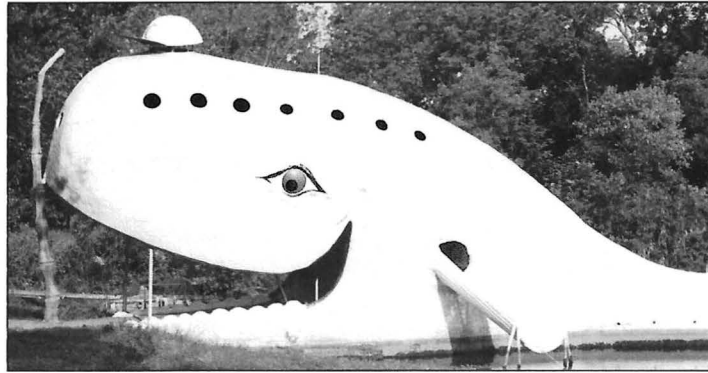
# Car shows: Not just for classics any more
