## GET YOUR KICKS HELPING ROUTE 66!

Members of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association's historic preservation committee have teamed up with local residents and government officials to give downtown Depew a facelift.

Depew, a small town on a 1926 to 1928 alignment of Route 66 just off Oklahoma 66 between Bristow and Stroud, is home to several historic buildings, some of which are suffering from age and neglect.

The most severely damaged properties were threatened with demolition in late June, but historic preservationists, property owners and city officials instead agreed to work together to improve the appearance of these properties and seek funding to shore them up and perhaps return them to productive use some day.

Working hand-in-hand with the Association, Depew is slowly improving public awareness of its Route 66 connection through a variety of projects, including improved signage, a Web site and newsletter created by Association member Pam Reeder, and several downtown murals, including a series painted by local children with help from the Association.

On Aug. 6, a dozen Route 66 enthusiasts converged on Depew with shovels, wheelbarrows, chainsaws, weed eaters, paintbrushes and power tools to help local residents spruce up the downtown area and increase awareness of Route 66 in the local area.

Participants included property owners Karin Goins and Linda Spangler and their families; Depew Mayor Dionna Marker and her son, Trey; Association members Blaine Davis, Ron Jones, Pam Reeder, Ron Warnick, Eastern Vice President Emily Priddy, Randy Chevrier, Julie Bradley, Tulsa County Representative Brad Nickson and Creek County Representative Frank Gierhart; and visitors Bill McLain of Iuka, Miss., and Dave Eames of Lee's Summit, Mo. The fun starts at 10 a.m. and continues until 5 p.m.

Each year, more attractions are added.

# Flamingo Restaurant gets new owners, menu

Phillip Bell moved around a lot in his life: from McAlester to Albuquerque, N.M.; then in 1949 from New Mexico to Elk City, where his parents had a café on main Street and ran the Royal Coffee Shop on West Third; then to California in 1953, and finally, in 1961, back to Elk City, where he opened the Flamingo Restaurant next to his father's Flamingo Motor Hotel on Route 66.

Twenty-seven years later, in 1988, he sold the Route 66 landmark.

For the next 17 years, a second owner, Mickey Brower, ran the restaurant. Loyal employees made the Flamingo a bustling business.

Brower sold the restaurant to new owners this past June. This will give him more time for family, especially the grandchildren.

The new owners, Pedro Lopez and John Beecham, plan to change the name and menu from classic American to Mexican cuisine ... but despite the change, they plan to carry on the tradition of welcoming Route 66 travelers.

# Association board meets in Tulsa

Following is a summary of the minutes from the Oklahoma Route 66 Association's July 24 board meeting at Ollie's Station Restaurant in Tulsa:

- Treasurer Kim Evans reported that the checking account balance is \$19,761.91.

- Eastern vice president Emily Priddy reported on recent and upcoming preservation efforts in Depew and recapped the June cruise, which drew only seven vehicles. Normal turnout is 150 to 200 cars. Emily expressed appreciation and concern for business owners who opened on Sunday just for the cruisers. She also reported that she has acquired bowling pins from the Rose Bowl, which will be placed in museums.

- Mike Stokes reported on the upcoming cruise and

poker run slated to coincide with the Sept. 24 Oklahoma Route 66 Museum Hall of Fame Awards in Clinton.

- Emily Priddy made a motion to accept Nancy Sanders as the Beckham County representative. Motion seconded by Kim Evans and approved by all.

- Mike Hickey called for volunteers to form the Hall of Fame Selection Committee. Brad Nickson, Emily Priddy, Kim Evans and Ron Burden appointed.

- Marilyn Emde distributed Summer 2005 issue of American Road magazine displaying Oklahoma Route 66 Association advertisement and displayed ads for American Iron and Cycle World magazines.

- Mike Hickey stated the Association has been looking for a car club coordina-

tor to liaison with the 350-plus car clubs in the state. (EDITOR'S NOTE: Anyone interested in this position is asked to call (405) 258-0008 to volunteer.)

- Kim Evans will represent the Association at activities associated with the Route 66 Rendezvous Sept. 13-18 in California. Emily Priddy made the motion to allot up to \$1000 for Kim's expenses on the trip. Motion seconded by Brad Nickson and all approved. Emily Priddy and Ron Warnick also plan to attend.

- Emily Priddy made a motion to form a 2006 Cruise Committee. Kim Evans seconded and all approved. Members assigned include Pam Reeder, Mike Stokes, Kim Evans, Emily Priddy and Cletus Simpson. The committee will discuss options

for the coming year and present their recommendations at a future meeting.

- Mike Hickey reported he has found a vendor, Taylor Made Signs, who can provide signs directing travelers to Route 66 for about \$19 each. Motion made by Mike Stokes to purchase a dozen of the signs for use. Seconded by Frank Gierhart and approved by all.

- Ron Burden noted the ads in the 2005-06 trip guide were not always consistent with the pages. Emily reported that ad placement was changed as a result of condensing the guide from 96 to 64 pages. Kim reported the reduction in pages cut printing costs from \$16,000 to \$7,000.

- The next meeting is scheduled for Oct. 23. Location and details TBA in a separate mailing.

## Save66.com: Officer to run 26.2 miles for Route 66

Emily Priddy, eastern vice president of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, has launched a new Web site to raise funds for historic preservation projects on the Mother Road.

The site, *Save66.com*, is a portal to Priddy's online journal detailing her experiences as she trains to run the Oklahoma Marathon on Nov. 19 in Tulsa.

Priddy is asking Route 66 enthusiasts to make per-mile donations based on

either the marathon itself or all the miles she runs as part of the training leading up to the race. A marathon is 26.2 miles long.

"I was puttering around Borders one night when I found this book called *The Non-Runner's Marathon Handbook*. It struck me as the most ludicrous thing I'd ever heard, so of course I bought it," Priddy said. "I got started reading it and thought, 'Ah, what the hell.' I couldn't really justify taking that much time

away from Route 66 projects, though, so I decided I'd just make the marathon a Route 66 project."

Priddy set up an online journal in April, outlining her plans and documenting her training runs.

Each journal entry ends with a motivational quotation. Photographs and other features are planned for the site, which includes information about how to make donations.

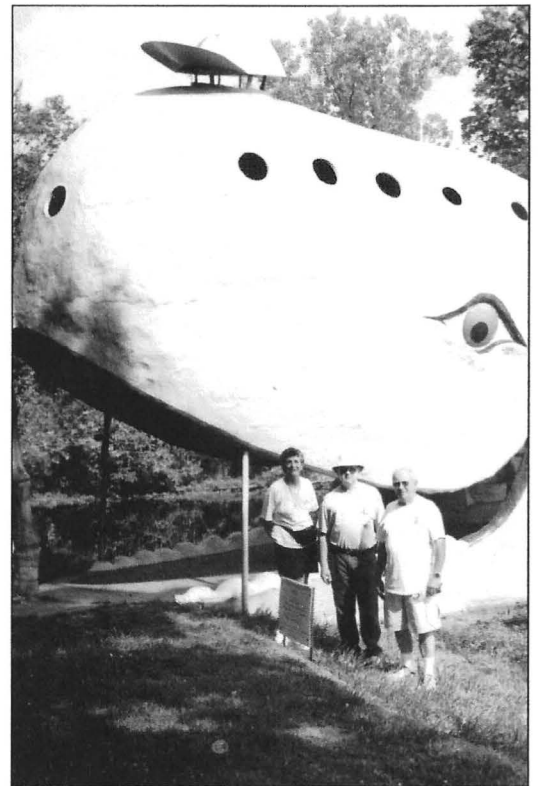
"There are two ways people can help," Priddy

said. "They can either donate so much for every mile I run in the marathon, or they can make donations based on all the miles I run leading up to the marathon, too."

At press time, Priddy had logged more than 212 miles, with more than 330 miles of training ahead.

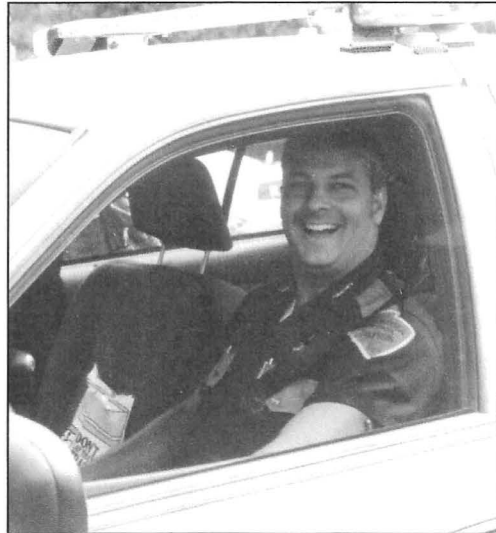

The Oklahoma Route 66 Museum at Clinton will be celebrating 10 years of promoting the Mother Road and educating the public on the story of America's Main Street. Anyone interested in Highway 66 is invited to the celebration at 2 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 24.

Michael Wallis, noted author and Route 66 booster, will be master of ceremonies for the short program, which will include entertainment.

Proclamations have been made by Gov. Brad Henry and Clinton Mayor Lynn Norman to designate the day as Oklahoma Route 66 Day in the state of Oklahoma and the city of Clinton.

Dr. Bob Blackburn, executive director of the Oklahoma Historical Society, will speak about the Route 66 story in Oklahoma.

Several special guests have been invited. Rep. James Covey and Sen.

Robert Kerr are always on hand to show support for Route 66 events, and newspaper coverage from the *Daily Oklahoman* and the *Tulsa World* are expected.

The Oklahoma Route 66 Association will induct two more people into the Oklahoma Route 66 Hall of Fame. This is a biennial event. The two honorees contributed to the promotion and preservation of U.S. 66.

Refreshments will be

served, and participants will be admitted into the galleries for free. Anyone with a classic vehicle is invited to be part of a display in the parking lot. A special "Spirit of Route 66" trophy will be awarded to one vehicle.

The winner of the raffle to raise funds for the Will Rogers historic marker at Lucille's will be drawn, and winners of an Association-sponsored poker run — also to be held that day — will be announced.

## Frankoma back in business

After a six-month closure, Sapulpa's Frankoma Pottery reopened in July with a new owner.

According to the *Sapulpa Daily Herald*, the business closed Dec. 31. It reopened in July after being purchased by Det Merryman, owner of the Merrymac Collection.

According to a June 29 *Herald* article, Merryman had talked to the previous owner, Richard Bernstein, about merging the two operations several years ago.

The Merrymac Collection is manufactured in China, but the Merrymans hope to bring the production line back to the United States, the *Herald* reported.

The plant was to reopen with 20 employees, and Merryman hoped to have a total of 150 employees by next June.

Frankoma uses Oklahoma clay to make ceramic dishes, coasters and commemorative items that are popular with collectors.

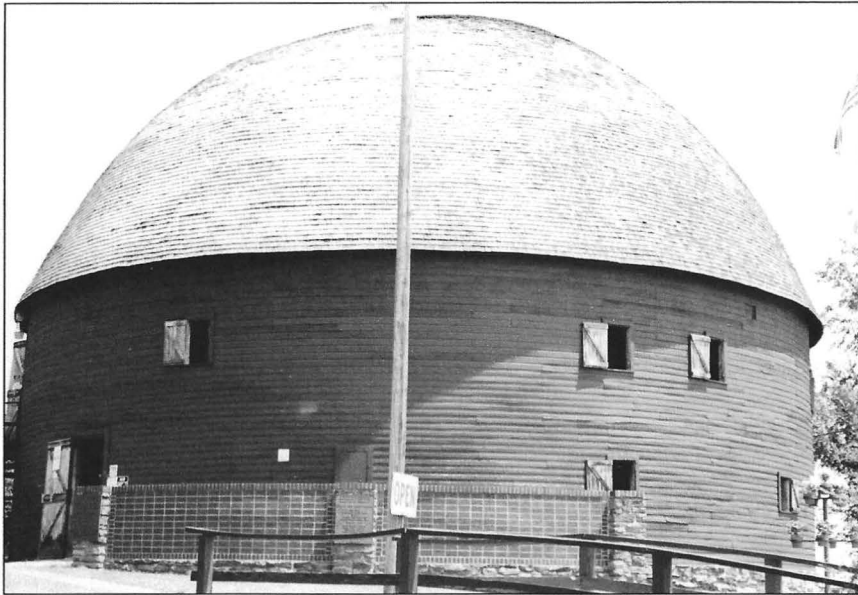
