Depew, a small town on a 1926 to 1928 alignment of Route 66 just off Oklahoma 66 between Bristow and Stroud, is home to several historic buildings, some of which are suffering from age and neglect.

The most severely damaged properties were threatened with demolition in late June, but historic preservationists, property owners and city officials instead agreed to work together to







Save66.com: Officer to run 26.2 miles for Route 66

Emily Priddy, eastern vice president of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, has launched a new Web site to raise funds for historic preservation projects on the Mother Road.

The site, *Save66.com*, is a portal to Priddy's online journal detailing her experiences as she trains to run the Oklahoma Marathon on Nov. 19 in Tulsa.

Priddy is asking Route 66 enthusiasts to make permile donations based on either the marathon itself or all the miles she runs as part of the training leading up to the race. A marathon is 26.2 miles long.

"I was puttering around Borders one night when I found this book called *The Non-Runner's Marathon Handbook.* It struck me as the most ludicrous thing I'd ever heard, so of course I bought it," Priddy said. "I got started reading it and thought, 'Ah, what the hell.' I couldn't really justify taking that much time away from Route 66 projects, though, so I decided I'd just make the marathon a Route 66 project."

Priddy set up an online journal in April, outlining her plans and documenting her training runs.

Each journal entry ends with a motivational quotation. Photographs and other features are planned for the site, which includes information about how to make donations.

"There are two ways people can help," Priddy said. "They can either donate so much for every mile I run in the marathon, or they can make donations based on all the miles I run leading up to the marathon, too."

At press time, Priddy had logged more than 212 miles, with more than 330 miles of training ahead.






