PRESERVATION PROJECTS ABOUND ON 66

The Oasis Drive-In sign on Route 66 in El Reno, which marks the site of a 1960s-era drive-in restaurant, underwent restoration this fall with help from a National Park Service matching grant. Local Route 66 enthusiasts raised money for the match with a "Luau at the Oasis" fundraiser featuring food and entertainment last year.

The National Park Service, through its Route 66 Corridor Preservation Program, provides federal cost-share grants to support historic preservation and restoration projects along the entire length of Route 66.

The National Park Service recently announced its 2005 cost-share grant recipients. Ten projects were chosen to receive a total of \$114,226 in grant funds. Two of those projects were in Oklahoma.

Seaba Station, on Route 66 between Chandler and Wellston, was awarded a \$23,000 grant for a new roof, electrical upgrades and masonry repairs to the main building, along with a new roof, window and door and masonry repairs to its privy, which still has its original commodes.

The station was built in 1921 and operated continuously as a gas station and engine repair shop until it closed in 1994. It was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1995 and reopened as an antique and gift shop.

Arcadia's Round Barn was awarded a \$10,500 grant for repairs to the roof, siding, door frames and window frames.

The Round Barn was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1977. In 1988, its roof collapsed, prompting a communitywide restoration effort.

Applications for the 2006 cost-share grant cycle will be accepted from Jan. 30 to April 28. For more information or an application package, call the program office at (505) 988-6701 or visit www.cr.nps.gov/rt66.

Overman, who owned and operated the Carlyle Motel in Oklahoma City,





Raffle winner



Oklahoma Route 66 has been granted state Scenic Byway status, and the Association plans to celebrate with an event next month in Chandler.


The Oklahoma Route 66 Association's annual membership meeting will begin at 2 p.m. Jan. 14 at Chandler Library.
