## State Scenic Byway designation celebrated

*Ribbon-cutting paired with groundbreaking for Old Armory restoration*

Oklahoma Route 66 Association members, officers, and state and local dignitaries participated in a ribbon-cutting ceremony Jan. 14 in Chandler to mark the designation of Route 66 as a state Scenic Byway.

The event was held in conjunction with the "Arms Around the Armory" groundbreaking ceremony to kick off renovations to the old National Guard Armory in Chandler.

Howard Dickman of Old Armory Restorers, Route 66 Association President Mike Hickey, former Oklahoma Adjutant General Don Ferrell, Chandler Mayor Carl Reheman and others spoke about the history and

significance of Route 66 and the Armory.

As part of the ceremony, participants surrounded the Armory in a "group hug," holding streamers to form a human chain around the building.

According to Dickman, construction on the Armory — a Works Progress Administration project — began in 1936 and was completed in 1937. The Armory has hand-chiseled walls that are 20 inches thick and can withstand tornadic winds.

The walls also have withstood the ravages of time.

The building served the Oklahoma National Guard until a new Armory was built just north

of Chandler in 1971.

After the Guard left the Armory, it fell into disrepair. It housed a van conversion company and later served as a maintenance building for the Chandler Fire Department, but time and weather took their toll, and the roof and walls began to suffer damage. After a failed attempt to save the building in 1993, local residents rallied around the structure in 1998, raising funds for its restoration.

When restoration is complete, the Armory will house the Oklahoma Route 66 Interpretive Center, and the Oklahoma Route 66 Association will have its headquarters there.

# Board member offers 'Great Experiences'

Children enjoy few things more than digging in the dirt, making mud pies . . . and eating pizza. Board member Jerald Ashby and his family turned these activities into fun and educational experiences for kids at their farm in Yukon.

Since 2002, thousands of children have enjoyed school field trips to the Pizza Farm in Yukon and for the past two summers more have learned to appreciate gardening through a unique camp.

The Pizza Farm, originally created by Darren Schmall of Madera, California, was created to educate and entertain "city folk" of all ages about how their food is grown. The Pizza Farm is a "living" demonstration farm that conducts guided tours for schools and families and teaches them about agriculture and organic gardening methods. The Pizza Farm is a ½ acre circular garden that is divided into 8 slices like a pizza. Five slices are filled with tomatoes, peppers, corn, garlic, onions, herbs (such as basil and oregano), and wheat (to make the crust); while the remaining three are home to cows, representing beef and milk for cheese, and hogs for the pepperoni.

The Connection Summer Camp, held on the Ashbys' farm, involves kids in daily chores in the Pizza Farm garden and feeding the animals. The Connection campers, ages 6 to 13, are involved in planting, weeding, harvesting, irrigating, and getting rid of pests.

Jerald and Marilyn Ashby and daughter Julie McKenzie own and manage Great Experiences Oklahoma, a company dedicated to providing a "great experience" to all who visit the Pizza Farm, their three other school field trips, annual fall pumpkin patch, laser tag arena and event facility.

She attended Catoosa Public Schools from second through 12th grades.

She graduated in 1963 and attended the University of Tulsa until 1969.

She taught at Catoosa Public Schools for 23 years before retiring in 2003.

She married Dick Belt on June 19, 1971. He survives.

Dee Dee Belt was preceded in death by her parents.

She is survived by her husband; a son and daughter-in-law, Lee and Brenda Belt; a daughter and son-in-law, Keri and Jimmy Hampton; her brother, Blaine Davis of Catoosa; six grandchildren; numerous family members and friends.

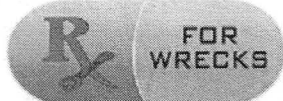

# Council to advise National Park Service on Route 66

A federal advisory council for the Route 66 Corridor Preservation Program has been established to advise the Secretary of Interior on matters relating to the Route 66 Corridor Preservation Program. The council will make recommendations on ways to best preserve the most representative and significant properties along Route 66, grant and cost-share awards, and types of technical assistance the National Park Service should provide partners along

the route. Fifteen members have been appointed by the Secretary of Interior for four-year terms to represent various agencies and organizations that have an established interest in Route 66. Nominations were solicited from State Historic Preservation offices, Departments of Transportation, Bureau of Land Management, U.S. Forest Service, Federal Highway Administration, Route 66 organizations, and tribal governments. The council's first meeting was

in February.

Conkle, California Route 66 Preservation Foundation; David King Dunaway, University of New Mexico; Melvena Heisch, Oklahoma Historical Society; Michael Jackson, Illinois Historic Preservation Agency; David Knudson, National Historic Route 66 Federation; John W. Murphey, New Mexico Historic Preserva-

tion Division; MaryAnn Naber, Federal Highway Administration; Carolyn Gallagher Pendleton, Kansas Historic Route 66 Association; Tommy Gene Pike, Missouri Route 66 Association; Jim Ross, Oklahoma Route 66 Association; Phyllis T. Seitts, Bureau of Land Management; Gregory William Smith, Texas Historical Commission; R. Scott Taylor, Missouri Department of Transportation; and Michael Wallis, historian and biographer.

## Tourism director: Erick to get new travel information center

OKLAHOMA CITY — In January, Interim Tourism and Recreation Department Director George Nigh announced plans to construct a new Travel Information Center building in Erick.

The former Oklahoma Governor said the project was made possible through a partnership with the Oklahoma Department of Transportation. Nigh commended ODOT Director Gary Ridley and his staff for their commitment to the project.

According to officials with ODOT, the project will exceed

\$6 million and should be completed by the state's centennial in 2007.

Nigh announced construction plans while speaking at the Elk City Chamber of Commerce Annual Membership Banquet.

The new building is slated for construction on the site of the current information center. Initial building plans will be developed using the Thackerville Travel Information Center as a model. In addition, the Erick center will include a dog park, a jogging trail and a handicapped accessible playground.

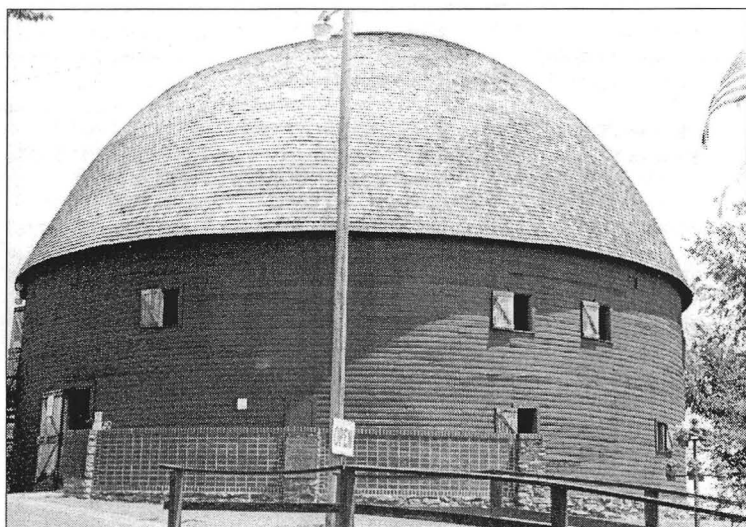
