# Getting their kicks on the big screen

Oklahoma Route 66 personalities Dawn Welch, Michael Wallis, others featured in Pixar film 'Cars'

Late one evening five years ago, a team from Pixar Animation Studios descended on the Rock Café in Stroud.

The crew, led by director John Lasseter and Route 66 historian Michael Wallis, sampled one of everything on the menu ... but their favorite treat was the restaurant's proprietor, Dawn Welch, who served them stories, laughter, and inspiration for several hours.

Welch's hospitality to the group — and to subsequent visitors from Pixar — earned her a place on the silver screen.

On June 9, Pixar's latest film, Cars, opened nationwide. One of the movie's main characters — Sally Carrera, a feisty 2002 Porsche 911 — is based, in large part, on Welch.

The computer-animated film tells the story of Lightning Mc-Queen, a self-absorbed racecar who takes a wrong turn on the way to a race and finds himself in Radiator Springs, a fictional Route 66 town populated entirely by automobiles.

The town — and many of its residents — are patterned after real people and places on Route 66.

Mater, a rusty but reliable tow truck voiced by Larry the Cable Guy, was inspired partly by Har-

ley and Annabelle Russell (of Sandhills Curiousity Shop fame) and partly by Dean Walker, president of the Kansas Route 66 Association.

Sally, who runs a motel with rooms shaped like traffic cones (inspired by the tepee-shaped rooms at the Wigwam Motels in Arizona and California), is based primarily on Welch.

Fillmore, a Volkswagen Microbus with a taste for organic fuel, was inspired by Route 66 artist Bob Waldmire of Illinois.

And Wallis — who lives in Tulsa — lends his unmistakable growl to the Sheriff, a 1949 Mercury police cruiser who arrests the speeding McQueen.

Wallis originally was hired as

a consultant for Pixar, but when Lasseter heard his distinctive voice, he asked Wallis to voice a character as well.

Route 66 is critical to the plot of the movie, which deals with the impact of the interstate on the businesses and residents of Radiator Springs.

The movie and its multimillion-dollar advertising campaign and merchandising tie-ins which include Happy Meal toys, prizes in boxes of Kellogg's cereal, and a host of children's books, stickers, toys, clothes and games — should provide a major boost to Route 66 businesses as they raise public awareness of the road and introduce the road to a new generation of travelers.



## Preservation Oklahoma lists 66 among Most Endangered Places

Preservation Oklahoma and the Oklahoma State Historic Preservation Office unveiled the 2006 Most Endangered Historic Places list earlier this year. The designation is intended as a tool to raise awareness and resources for preservation.

Route 66 across Oklahoma was among the 13 entities statewide to receive the designation. Also on the list were downtown Tulsa, which is home to many Art Deco buildings, and mid-century architecture across the state.

In its April newsletter, Preservation Oklahoma also reported that one of the buildings at Fort Reno underwent exterior restoration, which was completed in February, with the help of a 2004 Save America's Treasures grant. The Officers Duplex underwent the first phase of restoration. Historic Fort Reno Inc. is raising matching funds so it can use the rest of its grant to renovate the Commander's Quarters. # **OK Route 66 Association board meeting minutes**

The Oklahoma Route 66 Association board of directors met April 22 at StableRidge Winery in Stroud. Highlights included:

• Treasurer Kim Evans reported income of \$7,688.15 and expenses of \$8,762.83 since the last Association meeting. The checking account balance is \$13,018.06.

• Dawn Welch, owner of the Rock Café in Stroud, spoke to the board about the Pixar movie *Cars*, which is set on Route 66.

• The board considered the possibility of selling the Trip Guide to travelers but ultimately voted to continue to distribute it for free this year. There was a lengthy discussion

• The board voted to survey the Association's business members about various issues concerning the Trip Guide and other Association matters.

• Pam Lewis from OU and Scenic Byways shared her ideas about the new Route 66 Park at Lake Overholser.

• The board voted on logo contest entries. There were 12 total entries. A committee narrowed the group to five, and the board was given copies of these to vote on.

• The board discussed the upcoming Route 66 Festival in Albuquerque. It was decided that Mike Hickey, Kim Evans, Cletus Simpson, and Marilyn Emde will represent the Association at the festival and at the Route 66 Summit associated with the event. The Association will cover up to \$1,000 in expenses for the group to attend the festival.

• Cruise committee Chairman Pam Reeder discussed the lack of communication on the April 22 poker run. She shared the list of proposed events for the current year. She said the committee thought it would be good to promote the road year round with several small cruises rather than once a year with a large cruise. The board voted to change the date of the western minicruise from June 17 to June 10 to avoid conflicts with other events.

• The board set dates of July 22 and Oct. 22 for upcoming poker runs.

• Emily Priddy resigned from the cruise committee, effective immediately. Jeanne Miller joined the committee in her place.

• The board moved to sell "Friends don't let friends drive on I-44" T-shirts through Cafepress.com. We would decide what to sell, and they would handle everything else and send us a check for the profit when items sold.

• Richard Andrews from ODOT advised the board to send a letter to ODOT asking for help getting Route 66 signs installed along the road. He and Pam Lewis also gave an update on the Corridor Management Plan for Scenic Byways.

• Pam Lewis gave several suggestions to the board. She would like to help market and promote the Trip Guide and set up a travel study program. She thinks there may be grant money available to help with the administrator's salary.

• Richard Andrews told the board that Jennifer Kalkman from Oklahoma Tourism has suggested a Route 66 theme for one of the new Tourist Information Centers.

• The board voted not to place an advertisement in *American Road* magazine using tourism tax funds because of problems getting the ad approved in time to get it in the magazine.

• Marilyn Emde read a letter from David Jostes, a traveler who had a bad experience in Arcadia. The board directed Marilyn to send letters to Mr. Jostes, the mayor of Arcadia, and the Arcadia Police chief.


