Route 66 Interpretive Center to open soon

Chandler's latest attraction will hold its grand opening May 19

After many years and thousands of volunteer hours, the Old Armory Restorers (OAR) are proud to announce the grand opening of the Chandler Route 66 Interpretive Center, on Saturday, May 19th 2007, at 11:00 a.m. Everyone's invited. The public will have a chance to view a new concept of the interpretation of Route 66.

Hans Butzer, armory principal designer for TAP Architecture, has envisioned a place where "with lights, sounds and visuals, a memorable sensory experience of America's favorite highway will be created." It is a unique, historic Route 66 location. Butzer is known for his design of the Oklahoma City National Memorial.

During the depression years, the WPA created jobs in local communities. In Oklahoma the WPA built 54 National Guard Armories with local labor. Only two of these Oklahoma armories were built on Route 66, one in Oklahoma City and the one in Chandler. Abandoned in 1971 and left alone to the elements, this derelict, massive Chandler native stone structure is now nearly rehabilitated and once again will serve America's citizens. It is listed in the National Registry of Historic Places.

The rehabilitation, inside and out, is simply awesome, and the positive comments we hear daily justify the years of hard work on this project. After 14 months of work, the general contractor is now putting the finishing touches on the first phase of the armory's rehabilitation.

The Interpretive Center, which is housed in one section of the armory, contains six viewing areas. Guests may view short, educational, entertaining videos about Route 66. The Center has two travel planners, which are enclosed areas for visitors to sit and plan their trip along the route. One planner holds brochures for attractions east of Chandler, and the other planner is for attractions west of Chandler. Donations of these brochures are welcomed.

Another part of the Center features a theater section for larger groups. Fifteen historic theater chairs are arranged in front of a large screen TV where longer video productions may be viewed. Part of the armory will house a gift shop featuring items of local interest as well as items related to Route 66.

The 10,000-square-foot drill hall is part of phase II of the rehabilitation, although the windows and

roof have been completed. In November, this massive room will be the site of the Oklahoma Centennial Military Ball.

Throughout the project, many people have joined the "Friends of the Armory." The yearly donations are as follows: *Private (individual membership): \$15; Corporal (family/couple membership): \$25; Sergeant (patron/corporate membership): \$100.*

Many supporters have elected to sponsor or "adopt" certain items in the building to help preserve this historic structure. Names of sponsors will be displayed for all visitors to see.

Offered for adoption are the new panes of glass in the armory. Only 11 are left of the 484 now in place. For your tax-deductible contribution of \$66, a pane of glass in the armory will be named in honor of you, a loved one, a friend or an organization.

Fifteen of the 28 doors are still available for sponsorship or adoption. For your tax-deductible contribution of \$1,000, a door in the armory will be named in honor of you, a loved one, a friend or an organization. Bays demolished as part of restoration project

Through the determined efforts of its owner, Bill Fernau, the Phillips 66 station located at 701 Manvel in Chandler is on its way to restoration.

Fernau has spent the last 10 years gathering original parts and equipment to bring this station back to the way it was in 1930.

In 2002, Fernau was nominated and won the National Historic Route 66 Federation's coveted Cyrus Avery

Award for the Best Preservation Project.

As part of the restoration work, the two bays that were added to the station in 1957 had to be removed.

Because of the hours of planning and preparation, the bays imploded within five minutes. The demolition was performed by Richard Houston and crew from Cushing, and the brickwork will be restored by Mark Grayson of Chandler.

Input sought for Route 66 Corridor Management Plan

Part of that process includes the development of a Corridor Management Plan, a document that will guide future efforts to preserve and promote the highway.

As Oklahoma celebrates the 50th anniversary of the Interstate system, it is important that we give a tip of the hat to roads and bridges that served us so well prior to the construction of that expanse of concrete and as-

phalt we call the Interstate.

Roads that we now refer to as "secondary" were once the lifeblood of our nation, our State, and our communities.

The original Route 66 is probably the most famous of such roads. The asphalt and concrete ribbon we have come to know as the Mother Road was critical in the early development of our state and nation.

In Oklahoma, we have recently honored the contributions of Route 66 within our borders by designating it as an official State Scenic Byway.

The intrinsic qualities that promote Route 66 as a Byway are the same qualities that endear the road to those who have a passion for America's Main Street.

Route 66 is a reminder of days gone by, of a simpler time when life was less complicated and one of the purest joys was just traveling on the Mother Road.

Route 66 is an old friend that helps us recall fond memories and speaks to us of the history, not just of Oklahoma, but of every city and town along the Route.

As we begin drafting the Corridor Management Plan for the Byway, it is important that we remember, and share, that history. The Corridor Management Plan is a statement of what Route 66 was, what it is, and what it could be.

It is important that every person along The Road provide input to the folks that are crafting

the document.

Route 66 has, for years, faithfully served the people of Oklahoma. It is time to honor that service by assisting in the preparation of this document that will forever serve as a guidebook for the future development of The Mother Road.

It is altogether appropriate that we celebrate the birth of the Interstate System. It is equally important that in that celebration, we acknowledge the contributions of the original roads and bridges that were the paths of our youth.

Remember that when you have an opportunity to contribute to the Corridor Management Plan, and share your stories, your ideas, and your vision of Route 66 with us.

ly has a balance of \$13,736.26.

In the Administrator's report, Marilyn Emde stated there was a \$248.98 savings with e-mailing the newsletter. Marilyn has also sent out 103 letters to previous advertisers for the Trip Guide and has 36 repeat and 12 new customers so far. Ms. Emde has started looking for grants but is unable to file for any due to the Association's 501 (c) 3 tax exempt status being suspended. As soon as it is reinstated, she will start filing for grants.

In old business: Chartering meetings were discussed. Meeting dates will be set at a later date. The 2007 festival was also mentioned; Carol Duncan is helping with the car show. She also informed the group the Summit would be Thursday, the preservation project and the banquet Friday.

Officer elections were held: Frank Gierhart nominated Gerald Ashby for Canadian County Representative, and Brad Nick-

son for Tulsa County Representative by acclamation, Emily Priddy seconded, motion unanimously passed. Ron Burden nominated Cletus Simpson for the Eastern Vice President by acclamation, Emily Priddy seconded, motion unanimously passed. BaLinda Miller nominated Jeanne Miller to be and At-large Representative by acclamation, motion passed. Ron Burden nominated Mike Hickey for President by acclamation, Emily Priddy seconded, motion passed.

Board members were given the opportunity to tour the Rt 66 Interpretive Center.

After the tour Frank Gierhart made the motion to "hold moving to the Route 66 Interpretive Center due to the office size," Brad Nickson seconded, motion unanimously passed. Marilyn Emde will check on the lease agreement for the current office.

Noted Route 66 photographers' work appears at museum

Exhibit — on display through June 24 — features images by Jim Ross and Shellee Graham

Through June 24, the Oklahoma Route 66 Museum in Clinton is hosting "Drive in the Past Lane: Images from Route 66," an exhibit of Mother Road photographs by Jim Ross and Shellee Graham.

Jim Ross and Shellee Graham have been shooting photographs from Route 66 for two decades.

They actually met in Lander-gin, Texas, at a Route 66 event back in 1996. Ten years later, they launched a new Web site, a resource for Mother Road photographs called route66photographs.com.

The idea came from an ongoing demand from photo editors and individuals alike for images relating to Route 66 and roadside culture in general.

Route 66 historian Jim Ross has been exploring, mapping, photographing, and writing about the Mother Road since 1990.

He is author of the book

Oklahoma Route 66, publisher of the acclaimed *Here It Is! The Route 66 Map Series*, and is a co-founder of *American Road* magazine.

As a preservationist and advocate of vintage highways, he has appeared in numerous television productions, and in 1998 he co-produced the documentary film, *Bones of the Old Road*.

In 2001, Jim was inducted into the Oklahoma Route 66 Hall of Fame, and later that same year became the fourth recipient of the prestigious John Steinbeck Award for historic preservation.

Jim lives on an original stretch of America's Main Street near the tiny Mother Road town of Arcadia, Oklahoma.

The name Shellee Graham is perhaps the most widely recognized among Route 66 photographers.

She has published two books about the road: *Return to Route 66*, and *Tales from the Coral*

Court: Photos and Stories from a Lost Route 66 Landmark (named "Book of the Year" in 2002 by *Route 66 Magazine*).

Her work has appeared in regional, national and international shows, to include venues as distant as Samara, Russia.

For over a decade, her traveling Route 66 photo exhibition has circulated all over the U.S. and is booked well into the future.

An advocate of vintage and endangered highways, she has worked on countless restoration projects and fundraising initiatives aimed at preserving our historic highway heritage.

In 2004, she co-produced the documentary film, *Built for Speed: The Coral Court Motel*, which chronicles the rise and fall of St. Louis' legendary Route 66 landmark, and in 2005, she became the eighth recipient of the coveted John Steinbeck Award for historic preservation.

Shellee lives in St. Louis with her son, Trevor, but it looks like she will be moving west to Oklahoma sometime in 2007.

The museum is open 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday and 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday from Memorial Day through Labor Day.

Admission is \$3 for adults, \$2.50 for seniors 65 and over, \$1 for children ages 6 to 18, and free for children under 6.

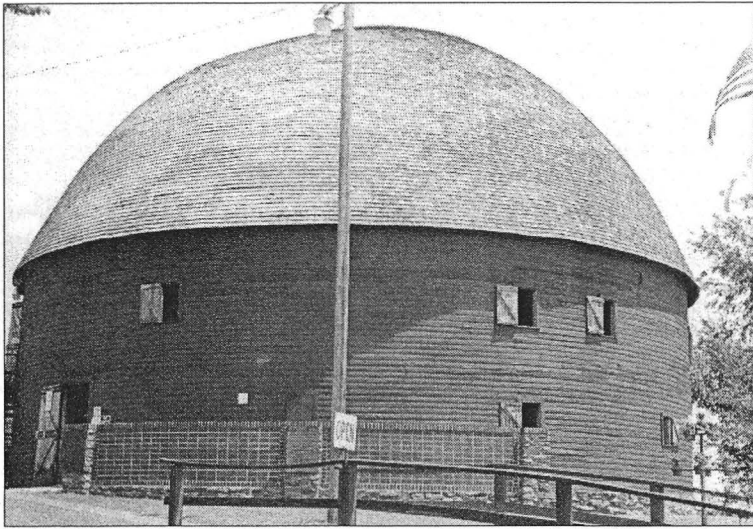
