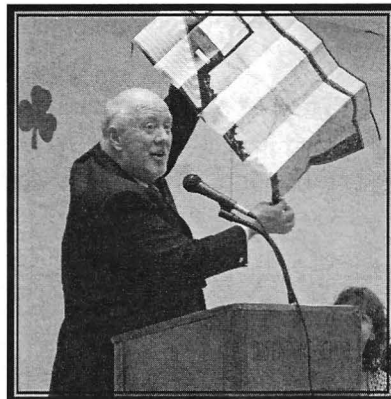

of everyone in attendance through their singing.

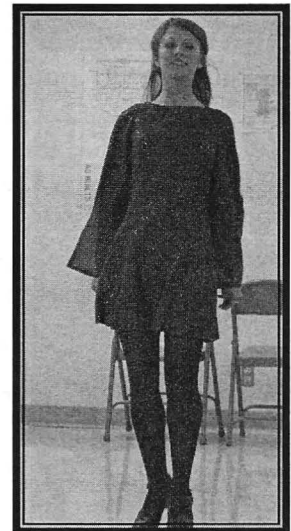

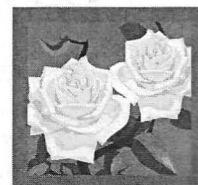

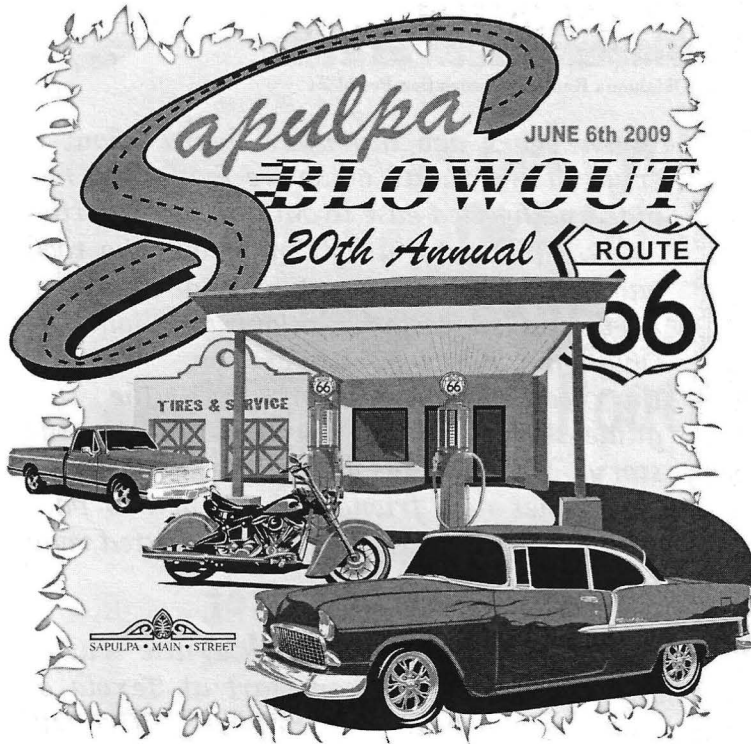

The contest, which opened February 1, will end October 20. Photographers may enter as many times as they want. Each photo entry must have a contest form attached. There is no entry fee.

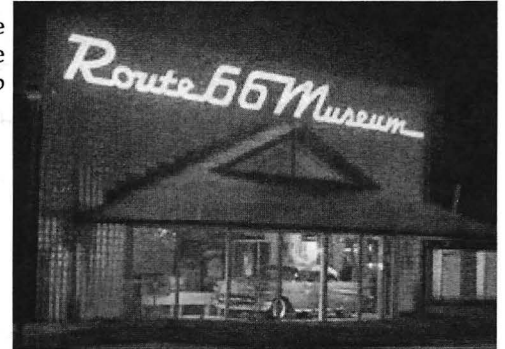
Photos will be judged by a panel of selected experts from Blunck's Studio in Clinton. Entries will be displayed in the front foyer of the museum in Clinton during November.

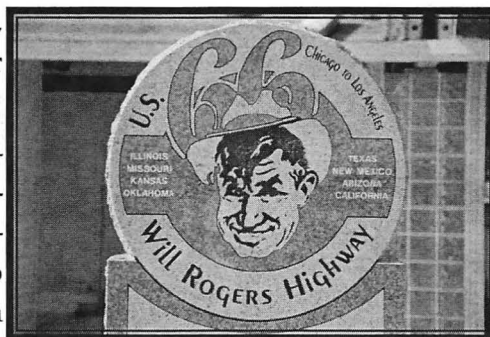

Will Rogers Marker to be placed at 9-ft Stretch by Oklahoma Association

A Will Rogers Highway Road Marker, sponsored by the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, will be placed at the Sidewalk Highway, tentatively scheduled in September 2009.

In 1922 a new nine-foot-wide roadway was completed between Miami and Afton, Oklahoma. Because no standards existed and so few roads were paved, it's width was not unusual for the era. It consisted of a concrete base and edges with a surface of rock asphalt. In

1926 the "sidewalk highway" as it would be known, was adopted by US Route 66.



Route 66 was paved piecemeal from 1926-1937. Since the Miami-

to-Afton section was paved, it became the last segment upgraded to the standards established in 1930. It was also realigned and included a new bridge on the Neosho River.

On September 13, 1937, the opening of the bridge completed the last segment of Route 66 paving in Oklahoma. The 'Sidewalk Highway' thus became one of the early stretches of Mother Road paving to be bypassed and today is the only Route 66 roadway of its type in existence.

Hope replaces fate: positive steps for Route 66 bridges

OKLAHOMA CITY, OKLAHOMA - Jim Ross, Mother Road author and historian, once stated that if a bridge can be made safe and enhanced to stay in service, it should be ... even if repair would be more costly than replacement.

Someone was listening.

Positive action took place over the past few months concerning the future of Oklahoma bridges in general, and Oklahoma Route 66 bridges in particular. State and local authorities have stepped up measures to improve bridge condition and safety, and many of these projects will be completed within the next few years. Following are a few plans already in motion.

The Oklahoma State Senate recently approved legislation to aid counties in reconstruction of structurally inadequate or functionally obsolete bridges. The measure will allow the State to make more substantial and efficient investments for bridge improvement and safety.

One Route 66 bridge that was once in peril is the Lake Overholser Bridge just west of Bethany on NW 39th Expressway. This bridge was constructed in 1924, predating Route 66, and was mentioned in John Steinbeck's "The Grapes of Wrath." Rumors from as recent as last autumn suggested the bridge was going to

close to traffic and become a walking bridge, possibly as soon as the spring of 2009.

Oklahoma Route 66 Association Administrator Marilyn Emde contacted the Oklahoma City Action Center in March concerning the fate of the Overholser Bridge. In a response from David Wrights, "This bridge is a historic structure and will be preserved in as near the original state as possible. At this time plans are being prepared to repair the bridge so that it can be used for vehicular traffic. The schedule is not certain, but should be such that all repairs are completed within 5 years."

One Oklahoma Route 66 bridge that is awaiting a decision of its fate is the Bird Creek Bridge, formerly known as

view ODOT's proposed plan to replace the bridge. FHWA then returned the plan to ODOT and asked for further clarification of the infor-



mation presented. There has been nothing further. I was told that it could take weeks or months."

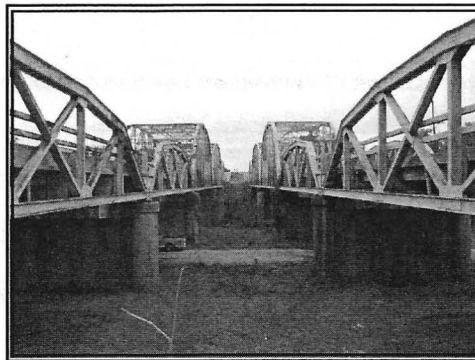

Another OK Rte 66 bridge that may soon get some much needed attention is the Rock Creek Bridge just west of Sapulpa. The bridge was built in 1926 as part of the Ozark Trail, and became part of Route 66 in 1926 when the highway was initiated. The alternate road most traveled now is south of the old alignment, built in 1952.

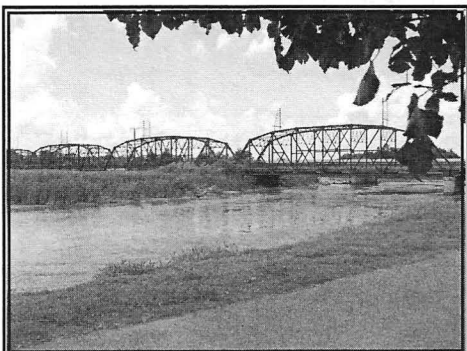
OK Rte 66 Assn Creek County Rep Frank Gierhart recently reported to the Assn that a volunteer crew under the planning of Rich Hendler was gathering information to use in consideration for a clean-up effort in the immediate area of the Rock Creek Bridge. As of this writing, there is no decisions to report, but this is definitely a step in the right direction.

As Melvena clearly stated in her last correspondence, "We are letting ODOT know that it is time to treat Route 66 as a single resource instead of chipping away at it one bridge at a time. We hope you and others will encourage the same approach."



the Verdigris River Bridge, located at Catoosa near the Blue Whale. The 824ft bridge was built in 1936 by ME Gillioz, and carries westbound Route 66 traffic. Its "twin" bridge carries eastbound traffic, and was built in 1957.

A recent inquiry from State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) deputy Melvena Heisch stated that communication between the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) concerning the bridge had ceased at present. "The FHWA decided to have their engineers re-

On The Road celebrates Association's 20th Anniversary



In honor of the upcoming 20th anniversary of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, we will share a bit of its history, its pioneers, and its impact on Oklahoma in the remaining 2009 publications, as well as photographs of ghost signs. Please celebrate with us, and become an active part of the Association's mission to preserve, promote and protect the wonderful heritage of Oklahoma's Mother Road into the future.

The following is information taken verbatim from the premier issue of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association Newsletter {this is SO cool!} ...

Organizational History

This Association was incorporated on October 16, 1989, within the State of Oklahoma. Membership enrollment began October 28, 1989, at a statewide meeting of persons interested in the development and enhancement of old US Route 66 within the state.

During the 1989 Oklahoma legislative session, the economic potential of Oklahoma's Route 66 was recognized by the legislature and the Governor. Through the authority of an Enrolled House Joint Resolution, a task force of individuals representing four agencies of state government was developed. These agencies included the Department of Commerce, the Department of Transportation, the Historical Society and the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department. With the Oklahoma tourism and Recreation Department taking the lead, a survey of the Route was done and a one day workshop conducted. At the workshop, material was presented on historical preservation, developmental enhancement, fund raising, promotions and event sponsorship.

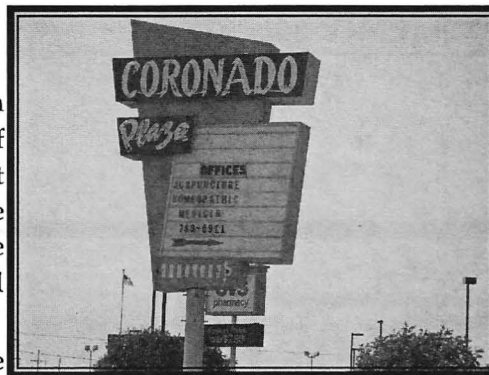
ple attend the initial kick-off. Prior to Oklahoma's conference, the largest group was 50!

Hosted by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department, along with the Oklahoma Main Street Program, Oklahoma Historical Society, and the Oklahoma Department of Transportation, the conference brought together various groups and individuals interested in reviving the economic, nostalgia and heritage of Route 66.

State Highway 66 is still intact in many places in Oklahoma. Oklahoma city to Tulsa is the longest stretch. With a new statewide organization formed as a result of the conference, plans are underway to develop activities and events to bring people back to "America's Main Street."

Michael Wallis, author of Oil Man, has done extensive research on the Route. His newest book, Route 66 The Mother Road, will be released in the spring of 1990. As a part of the program, Wallis read excerpts from his book vividly painting mental pictures of the once grand road linking east to west. Having lived in 7 of the 8 states where the Route lies, he feels a certain kindred spirit toward the old highway. The Oklahoma Department of Transportation has designated "tourism brown" signs with the new Oklahoma route 66 logo to be located on the highway. They should begin appearing along the Route in 1990.

Also presented were workshops providing information about designating structures along the Route for historic preservation and information regarding fund-raising for non-profit organizations as well as a workshop on promotion activity and the development of special events.

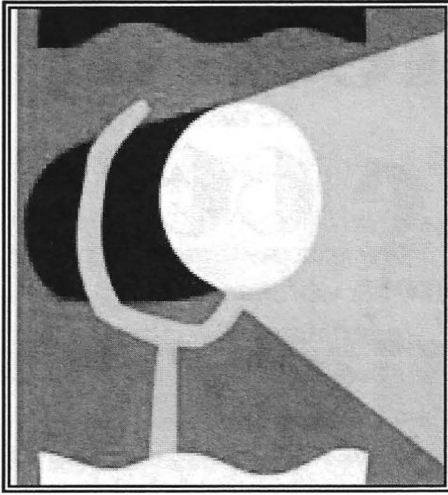

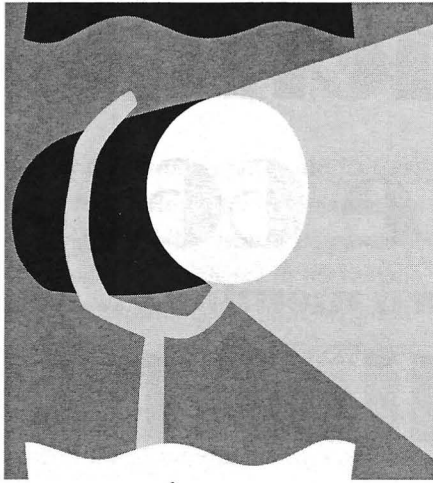

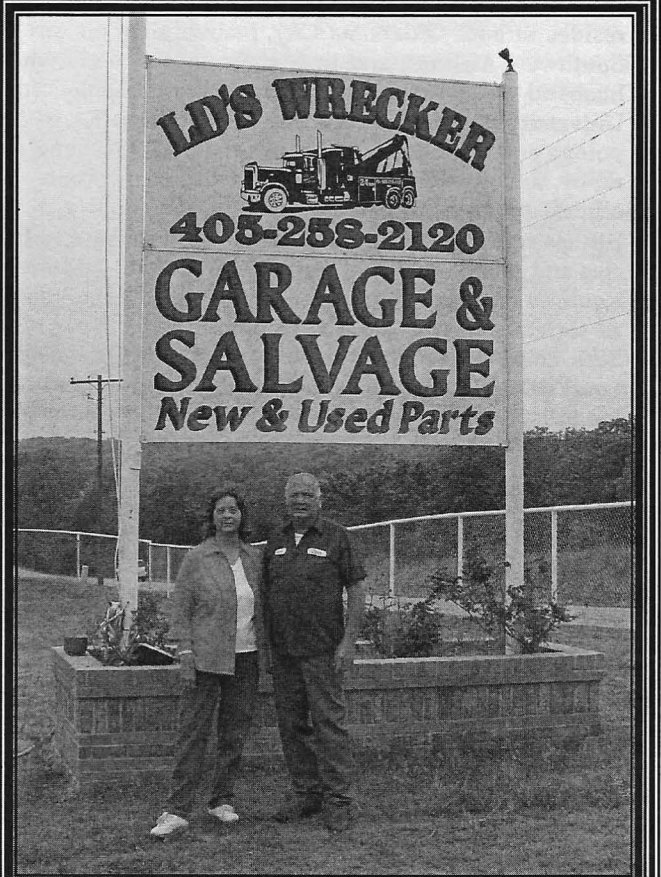

Just like ol' times on Tulsa Route 66

TULSA, OKLAHOMA - The Tulsa sky is a bit brighter these days, and that luminescence will soon radiate all through the City nights, as well. Through time, diligence and a lot of muscle and patience, the Meadow Gold sign once again serves as the nostalgic heart of Tulsa's historic Route 66 Corridor.

Meadow Gold provided top quality dairy products and services throughout the American Heartland for many years. Meadow Gold and its parent company, Beatrice Foods, experienced booming economic success in the years following WW II, and this is clearly displayed by the awesome size and substance of the Meadow Gold sign. With a solid construction metal frame, buzzing neon lights and brilliant porcelain sign facings, the sign became a monumental landmark of both Tulsa and Route 66 when Beatrice Foods constructed it atop a brick structure on the corner of 11th St and Lewis.

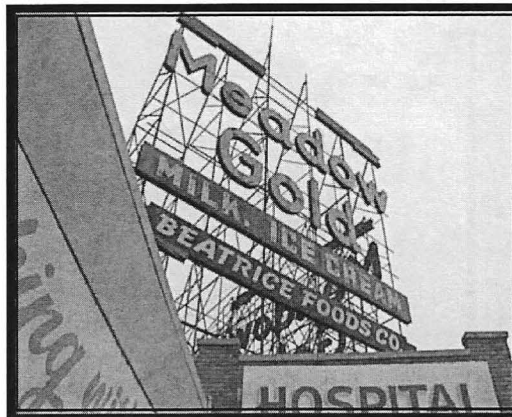
Through time, Beatrice Foods experienced buy-outs, sell-outs, foreclosures and other growing pains, and eventually faded into the shadows of corporate evolution. The same fate awaited the Meadow Gold sign, when in 2004 the property on the corner of 11th and Lewis was purchased by fellow Tulsan Chris Nikels. The brick building was scheduled for demolition, and with it nearly came the end of one of Tulsa-

Route 66's icons.

This fate was changed dramatically, however, by the single-minded efforts of a handful of individuals whose passion is to



save such historic treasures as the Meadow Gold sign. Led by Lee Ann Ziegler, funds were secured to disassemble, hold, and eventually restore the sign to its original condition.

Lee Ann is the executive director of the Tulsa Foundation for Architecture (TFA) and a member of the Route 66 Design Committee of Vision 2025. Her expertise led to funding through National Park Service federal grants as well as funding through Vision 2025 and

private contributions, just to name a few.

Claude Neon Federal Signs (CNF) of Tulsa took on the 5-year project of structurally restore the Meadow Gold sign to like new condition, while holding tight to its vintage charm.

The property at the corner of 11th and Quaker, just a ways from the original site and just behind the Corner Café, was donated to the City, and PSA Dewberry architect Steve Vogt designed the brick pavilion that now displays the resurrected sign.

"I just wanted it to be like I remember when I was a kid driving down Route 66," explained Steve.

A good deal of the project was completed by Builders Unlimited Inc.

The long-anticipated sign construction began the first week in April 2009. Completion may take several weeks, and the clock, long gone from the original Meadow Gold sign, will be replaced as funds become available.

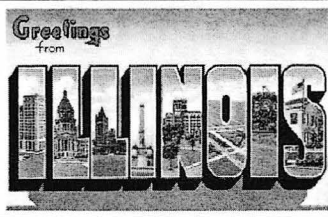
The history of the Meadow Gold sign is a very fine history indeed. It went through a rocky point in the last few years, but thanks to the persistence and unwavering determination of individuals and agencies working hand-in-hand toward a common goal, Route 66 shines a bit brighter, just like ol' times.

It's good for the spirit to preserve the past ...Route 66 proves that every day.

One of the prime stops on Illinois' stretch of 66 is the **Soulsby Station** (1926-1993), the oldest station on the road. It always sold Shell gasoline. After being bypassed in 1944, Russell Soulsby began repairing TVs.

Times are bad for this relic of bygone era. The exterior was lovingly restored to its original appearance, but unfortunately, nothing was done with the interior and now termites have done considerable damage, threatening the structure. A \$10,000 matching grant has been awarded to the station to solve the problem. {Route 66 author and historian} John Weiss said some of the matching funds can be raised with "in-kind work" where volunteers are accounted for ... their efforts. **Info from RoadDog** (Thank you!)

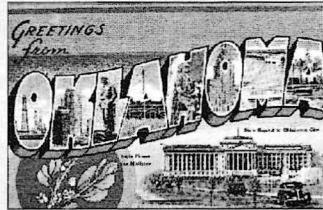

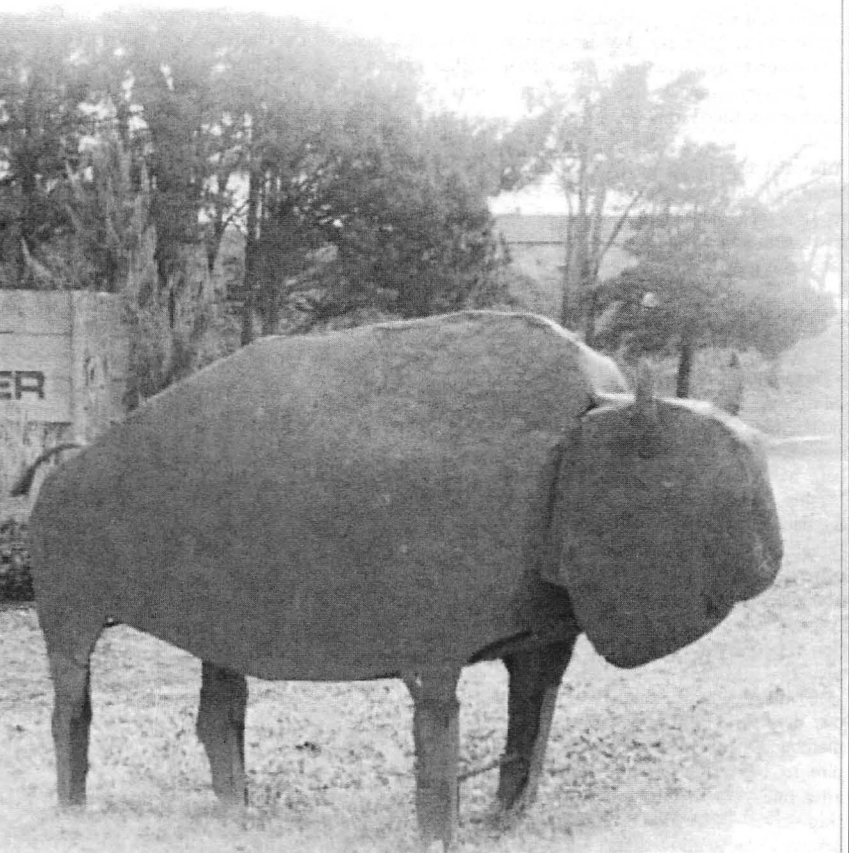

Minutes from the Oklahoma Route 66 Association quarterly meeting

The Oklahoma Route 66 Association held its spring quarterly meeting at 1pm, April 19, 2009 at the Oklahoma Tourist Information Center: NE 122nd and I-35 in Oklahoma City.

President Mike Hickey called the meeting to order. Marion Davidson made the motion to approve the minutes from the January annual meeting, Frank Gierhart seconded, motion passed.

Administrator's Report

Marilyn Emde gave the administrator's report. The Association acquired 19 new members and 71 renewals since January's meeting.

* Old Business

- New Membership Drive

Marilyn Emde reiterated that in the yearly membership drive, each Association member that brings in 5 new members will receive one year paid membership. After some discussion about the decided length of each membership drive, Jill Ann Church motioned to officially designate the April Association meeting date through the October Association meeting date as the duration of each year's drive. Jeanne Miller seconded. Motion passed. There was some discussion about allowing previous members who have allowed their membership in the Association to expire to be counted as new members after one year in the annual membership drive. Mike Hickey made an executive order to allow this.

- Kid's Club Update -

On behalf of BaLinda Miller, Marilyn Emde presented that BaLinda will be contacting Oklahoma Museums to request discounts and other special offers for Kid's Club members.

- Trip Guide Update

Marilyn Emde reported that all the Oklahoma Route 66 Trip Guide information has been submitted to Emily Priddy. There is going to be a special four-page timeline dedication in (probably) the center of the Trip Guide honoring the 20th Anniversary of the Association. The submission of Emily's work to American Road Magazine for printing is scheduled for the first weekend in May. The final product should be delivered to drop-points by mid- to late-May. There were 39 new business ads placed in the Trip Guide, whereas 29 ads were dropped. The estimated total for publication and distribution of 40,000 copies of the Trip Guide is \$14,200. A total of \$23,810 was brought in for ad sales, of which all but \$1,280 have been collected.

- 2009 Events and Cruises

* The Down on Main Street/RedFork event is scheduled for May 2. Brad Nickson gave a brief presentation of the event's schedule.

* The Davenport Nettie Davenport parade is scheduled for May 9. Jeanne Miller gave a brief presentation of the event's schedule and encouraged Board members to attend and promote Oklahoma Route 66.

* The Sapulpa Blowout is scheduled for June 6. Frank Gierhart gave a brief presentation of the event's schedule and stressed the need for volunteers to man the Association booth.

* The Oklahoma Route 66 Statewide Cruise/Poker Run is scheduled for June 20. Marilyn Emde prepared fliers for the event that were distributed during the meeting. Mike Hickey stressed that participation is the key to success of this event. T-shirts will be sold at the starting points and at the Interpretive Center, and the price per shirt was set at \$12.

* The Clinton Hot Dogs and Hot Rods Festival is scheduled for June 27. Carol Duncan gave a brief presentation of the event's schedule.

* The Motor Madness Fly-In & Car Show is scheduled for September 12. Carol Duncan gave a brief presentation of the event's schedule.

* The Route 66 Festival/Will Rogers Awards is scheduled for September 11-13 during the Flagstaff Route 66 Days. Decisions about participation in this event will be made at next meeting.

- Will Rogers Marker in Afton

Carol Duncan presented a report on the Will Rogers Marker to be placed in honor of the 9 ft wide stretch of Route 66 between Miami and Afton. The price for creation, placement and delivery is \$3,920, approximately \$1,500 of which has been pledged at the time of the Board meeting. Carol desires that the Association gets full credit for the Marker. Mike Hickey stressed concern of overtaxing members with donation requests. Rick Schmigle suggested that if 40 members donated \$66 in honor of the Marker, the remaining cost would be covered. Brad Nickson pledged to match the first \$500 donated by members. An estimated time for placement is October, in honor of the 20th Anniversary of the Association. Jeanne Miller made a motion to use funds earmarked for the Will Rogers Marker in Afton to be used for its purchase. Brad Nickson seconded. Motion passed.

- National Scenic Byways

Pam Lewis presented the NSB update, along with a few other reminders. The Denver NSB Conference, tentatively set for August 23-26, is open to all. Cost

per person is \$350 early-bird/\$450 regular. National Designations will possibly be announced at that time. May 11-15, 22 visitors from the Czech Republic will tour Route 66. They will be in OKC May 13. Pam suggested having an event for them in the City. There will be a State-wide Route 66 Farmer's Market Program starting this summer, sponsored by grants from ODOT and the Dept of Agriculture. There will be ATM machines available for customers at the Farmer's Market locations. Marilyn suggested a Farmer's Market Car Cruise with a cookout at the end, utilizing the purchases from the Cruise. The Dennis Adams workshop was cancelled. The CMP will be available online May 1 to all. ODOT is putting together several high quality videos for distribution and loan, and one will be on Oklahoma Route 66.

* New Business

Sale of T-shirts

Marilyn Emde stressed that the Association will need T-shirts to sell at upcoming events. Two options were presented to the Board. A mix of light and dark colors were suggested, and all sizes. Marilyn reiterated that sizes above adult XL and dark colors will be \$2 extra per item. Jill Ann Church made a motion that the Association purchase up to 150 shirts of all sizes from the Chandler business. Frank Gierhart seconded. Motioned passed.

Oklahoma Route 66 Association 20th Anniversary in October

The anniversary of the Association is Saturday, October 16. Jeanne Miller suggested that we have a booth at the Oklahoma State Fair, but the suggestion was challenged by Marilyn Emde, who stated that it was very difficult to find someone who can man it for the entire two week period. Marilyn Emde suggested that we do something special for the original members. Mike Hickey suggested we do something special for the new members from this year, encouraging them to attend the festivities, as the October meeting will also wrap up the 2009 Membership Drive. It was also suggested that we have a special place such as the Round Barn for that meeting.

Social Networking Sites

Brad Nickson suggested utilizing Facebook, Twitter, or other websites to draw attention to Oklahoma Route 66 events, as this would attract more interest from a younger audience. Brad said that he would do more research into this.

- Route 66 Pulse Advertising

Jill introduced the Route 66 Pulse to the Board through a bit of its history, its intent, its value as a tool for revenue, and its renewal. She further requested that the Board choose to place an ad in the upcoming issue of the Pulse, to be distributed in June. One objection was made by Marion Davidson. He mentioned that in the past, an issue arose when businesses that were purchasing ads in the Pulse were ceasing ad purchase in the Trip Guide. Blaine Davis suggested that we place a membership application in the ad with whatever other information was placed there. After a request by Brad Nickson that this issue be tabled until the end of the meeting (as time was an issue to cover the agenda), Alvin Harrell made a motion that the Association purchase a quarter page ad in the upcoming Pulse. Frank Gierhart seconded. Motion passed.

- Association Telephone Needs

Mike Hickey suggested that we purchase a more economical phone service for Marilyn's needs. After several suggestions from the Board, the executive decision was made to conduct some research on prices and quality, and readdress the issue at the July meeting.

* Other Business

- Marilyn Emde reported that MODOT is having a dedication of the new Tourist Information Center on Route 66 in Conway, MO.

- The National Trust for Historical Preservation Conference will be held in Nashville, TN on October 13-17, 2009.

- Brad Nickson requested that Jill Ann Church bring before the Route 66 Alliance that they allow the State Associations to, as a Good Faith builder, place membership applications in the Pulse (in future editions) at no charge.

- Marion Davidson asked for verification that County Reps don't have to take care of membership renewals. Marilyn verified that she took care of those.

Brad Nickson motioned the meeting to adjourn, Frank Gierhart seconded, motion passed. Meeting adjourned.
