



Hope replaces fate: positive steps for Route 66 bridges


Jim Ross, Mother Road author and historian, once stated that if a bridge can be made safe and enhanced to stay in service, it should be ... even if repair would be more costly than replacement.

Someone was listening.

Positive action took place over the past few months concerning the future of Oklahoma bridges in general, and Oklahoma Route 66 bridges in particular. State and local authorities have stepped up measures to improve bridge condition and safety, and many of these projects will be completed within the next few years. Following are a few plans already in motion.

The Oklahoma State Senate recently approved legislation to aid counties in reconstruction of structurally inadequate or functionally obsolete bridges. The measure will allow the State to make more substantial and efficient investments for bridge improvement and safety.


One Route 66 bridge that was once in peril is the Lake Overholser Bridge just west of Bethany on NW 39th Expressway. This bridge was constructed in 1924, predating Route 66, and was mentioned in John Steinbeck's "The Grapes of Wrath." Rumors from as resent as last autumn suggested the bridge was going to



close to traffic and become a walking bridge, possibly as soon as the spring of 2009.

Oklahoma Route 66 Association Administrator Marilyn Emde contacted the Oklahoma City Action Center in March concerning the fate of the Overholser Bridge. In a response from David Wrights, "This bridge is a historic structure and will be preserved in as near the original state as possible. At this time plans are being prepared to repair the bridge so that it can be used for vehicular traffic. The schedule is not certain, but should be such that all repairs are completed within 5 years."

One Oklahoma Route 66 bridge that is awaiting a decision of its fate is the Bird Creek Bridge, formerly known as



the Verdigris River Bridge, located at Catoosa near the Blue Whale. The 824ft bridge was built in 1936 by ME Gillioz, and carries westbound Route 66 traffic. Its "twin" bridge carries eastbound traffic, and was built in 1957.

A recent inquiry from State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) deputy Melvena Heisch stated that communication between the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) concerning the bridge had ceased at present. "The FHWA decided to have their engineers re-

view ODOT's proposed plan to replace the bridge. FHWA then returned the plan to ODOT and asked for further clarification of the infor-



mation presented. There has been nothing further. I was told that it could take weeks or months."

Another OK Rte 66 bridge that may soon get some much needed attention is the Rock Creek Bridge just west of Sapulpa. The bridge was built in 1926 as part of the Ozark Trail, and became part of Route 66 in 1926 when the highway was initiated. The alternate road most traveled now is south of the old alignment, built in 1952.

OK Rte 66 Assn Creek County Rep Frank Gierhart recently reported to the Assn that a volunteer crew under the planning of Rich Hendler was gathering information to use in consideration for a clean-up effort in the immediate area of the Rock Creek Bridge. As of this writing, there is no decisions to report, but this is definitely a step in the right direction.

As Melvena clearly stated in her last correspondence, "We are letting ODOT know that it is time to treat Route 66 as a single resource instead of chipping away at it one bridge at a time. We hope you and others will encourage the same approach."





Just like ol' times on Tulsa Route 66

TULSA, OKLAHOMA - The Tulsa sky is a bit brighter these days, and that luminescence will soon radiate all through the City nights, as well. Through time, diligence and a lot of muscle and patience, the Meadow Gold sign once again serves as the nostalgic heart of Tulsa's historic Route 66 Corridor.

Meadow Gold provided top quality dairy products and services throughout the American Heartland for many years. Meadow Gold and its parent company, Foods, experienced Beatrice booming economic success in the years following WW II, and this is clearly displayed by the awesome size and substance of the Meadow Gold sign. With a solid construction metal frame, buzzing neon lights and brilliant porcelain sign facings, the sign became a monumental landmark of both Tulsa and Route 66 when Beatrice Foods constructed it atop a brick structure on the corner of 11th St and Lewis.


Through time, Beatrice Foods experienced buy-outs, sell-outs, foreclosures and other growing pains, and eventually faded into the shadows of corporate evolution. The same fate awaited the Meadow Gold sign, when in 2004 the property on the corner of 11th and Lewis was purchased by fellow Tulsan Chris Nikels. The brick building was scheduled for demolition, and with it nearly came the end of one of Tulsa-

Route 66's icons.

This fate was changed dramatically, however, by the singleminded efforts of a handful of individuals whose passion is to



save such historic treasures as the Meadow Gold sign. Led by Lee Ann Ziegler, funds were secured to disassemble, hold, and eventually restore the sign to its original condition.

Lee Ann is the executive director of the Tulsa Foundation for Architecture (TFA) and a member of the Route 66 Design Committee of Vision 2025. Her expertise led to funding through National Park Service federal grants as well as funding through Vision 2025 and

private contributions, just to name a few.

Claude Neon Federal Signs (CNF) of Tulsa took on the 5-year project of structurally restore the Meadow Gold sign to like new condition, while holding tight to its vintage charm.

The property at the corner of 11th and Quaker, just a ways from the original site and just behind the Corner Café, was donated to the City, and PSA Dewberry architect Steve Vogt designed the brick pavilion that now displays the resurrected sign.

"I just wanted it to be like I remember when I was a kid driving down Route 66," explained Steve.

A good deal of the project was completed by Builders Unlimited Inc.

The long-anticipated sign construction began the first week in April 2009. Completion may take several weeks, and the clock, long gone from the original Meadow Gold sign, will be replaced as funds become available.

The history of the Meadow Gold sign is a very fine history indeed. It went through a rocky point in the last few years, but thanks to the persistence and unwavering determination of individuals and agencies working hand-in-hand toward a common goal, Route 66 shines a bit brighter, just like ol' times.

It's good for the spirit to preserve the past ...Route 66 proves that every day. One of the prime stops on Illinois' stretch of 66 is the **Soulsby Station** (1926-1993), the oldest station on the road. It always sold Shell gasoline. After being bypassed in 1944, Russell Soulsby began repairing TVs.

Times are bad for this relic of bygone era. The exterior was lovingly restored to its original appearance, but unfortunately, nothing was done with the interior and now termites have done considerable damage, threatening the structure. A \$10,000 matching grant has been awarded to the station to solve the problem. {Route 66 author and historian} John Weiss said some of the matching funds can be raised with "in-kind work" where volunteers are accounted for ... their efforts. 

Minutes from the Oklahoma Route 66 Association quarterly meeting

The Oklahoma Route 66 Association - 2009 Events and Cruises held its spring quarterly meeting at 1pm, April 19, 2009 at the Oklahoma Tourist Information Center: NE 122nd and I-35 in Oklahoma City.

President Mike Hickey called the meeting to order. Marion Davidson made the motion to approve the minutes from the January annual meeting, Frank Gierhart seconded, motion passed.

Administrator's Report

Marilyn Emde gave the administrator's report. The Association acquired 19 new members and 71 renewals since January's meeting.

* Old Business

- New Membership Drive

Marilyn Emde reiterated that in the yearly membership drive, each Association member that brings in 5 new members will receive one year paid membership. After some discussion about the decided length of each membership drive, Jill Ann Church motioned to officially designate the April Association meeting date through the October Association meeting date as the duration of each year's drive. Jeanne Miller seconded. Motion passed. There was some discussion about allowing previous members who have allowed their membership in the Association to expire to be counted as new members after one year in the annual membership drive. Mike Hickey made an executive order to allow this.

- Trip Guide Update

Marilyn Emde reported that all the Oklahoma Route 66 Trip Guide information has been submitted to Emily Priddy. There is going to be a special four-page timeline dedication in (probably) the center of the Trip Guide honoring the 20th Anniversary of the Association. The submission of Emily's work to American Road Magazine for printing is scheduled for the first weekend in May. The final product should be delivered to drop-points by mid- to late-May. There were 39 new business ads placed in the Trip Guide, whereas 29 ads were dropped. The estimated total for publication and distribution of 40,000 copies of the Trip Guide is \$14,200. A total of \$23, 810 was brought in for ad sales, of which all but \$1,280 have been collected.

- * The Down on Main Street/RedFork event is scheduled for May 2. Brad Nickson gave a brief presentation of the event's schedule.
- The Davenport Nettie Davenport parade is scheduled for May 9. Jeanne Miller gave a brief presentation of the event's schedule and encouraged Board members to attend and promote Oklahoma Route 66.
- * The Sapulpa Blowout is scheduled for June 6. Frank Gierhart gave a brief presentation of the event's schedule and stressed the need for volunteers to man the Association booth.
- * The Oklahoma Route 66 Statewide Cruise/Poker Run is scheduled for June 20. Marilyn Emde prepared fliers for the event that were distributed during the meeting. Mike Hickey stressed that participation is the key to success of this event. T-shirts will be sold at the starting points and at the Interpretive Center, and the price per shirt was set at
- * The Clinton Hot Dogs and Hot Rods Festival is scheduled for June 27. Carol Duncan gave a brief presentation of the event's schedule.
- * The Motor Madness Fly-In & Car Show is scheduled for September 12. Carol Duncan gave a brief presentation of the event's schedule.
- The Route 66 Festival/Will Rogers Awards is scheduled for September 11-13 during the Flagstaff Route 66 Days. Decisions about participation in this event will be made at next meeting.

- Will Rogers Marker in Afton

Carol Duncan presented a report on the Will Rogers Marker to be placed in honor of the 9 ft wide stretch of Route 66 between Miami and Afton. price for creation, placement and delivery is \$3,920, approximately \$1,500 of which has been pledged at the time of the Board meeting. Carol desires that the Association gets full credit for the Marker. Mike Hickey stressed concern of overtaxing members with donation requests. Rick Schmigle suggested that if 40 members donated \$66 in honor of the Marker, the remaining cost would be covered. Brad Nickson pledged to match the first \$500 donated by members. An estimated time for placement is October, in honor of the 20th Anniversary of the Association. Jeanne Miller made a motion to use funds earmarked for the Will Rogers Marker in Afton to be used for its purchase. Brad Nickson seconded. Motion passed.

- National Scenic Byways

They will be in OKC May 13. Pam suggested having an event for them in the City. There will be a State-wide Route 66 Farmer's Market Program starting this summer, sponsored by grants from ODOT and the Dept of Agriculture. There will be ATM machines available for customers at the Farmer's Market Marilyn suggested locations. Farmer's Market Car Cruise with a cookout at the end, utilizing the purchases from the Cruise. The Dennis Adams workshop was cancelled. The CMP will be available online May 1 to all. ODOT is putting together several high quality videos for distribution and loan, and one will be on Oklahoma
