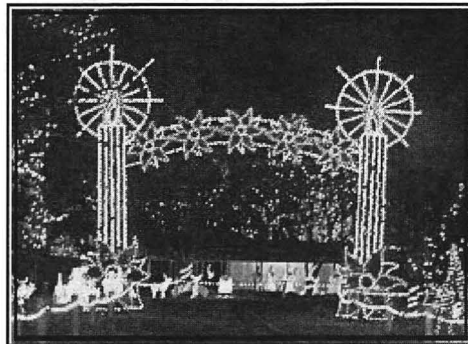

The evening began at Johnny Carino's in Yukon. Our Mother Road "extended family" met for an early dinner, enjoyed by the warmth of a crackling fireplace.

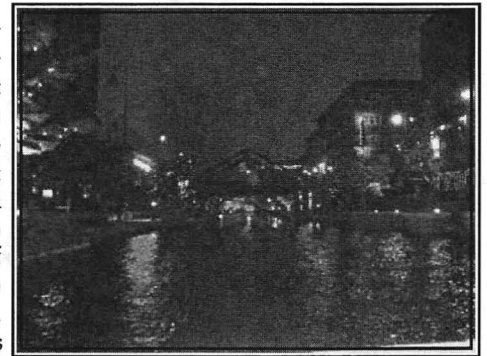


The entrance to the Yukon City Park Holiday Light Display.

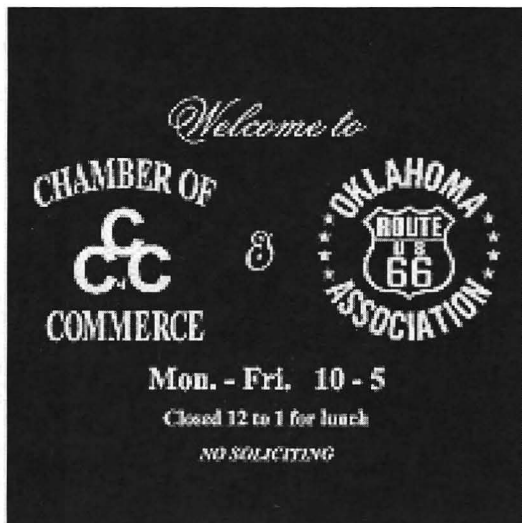

The Oklahoma Route 66 Association Office has moved to the Old Armory Building at 400 East Route 66 in Chandler. Its new location will be both more visible and more convenient for those in search of the finest Oklahoma Route 66 resources available.

Joplin, Missouri is organizing their second annual "KITES OVER ROUTE 66", asking communities to organize groups to fly kites over The Mother Road on Saturday April 24th, 2010 at 10am central time. Just got back from our annual trip out west which was quite the experience. We ventured down a couple of pre-1937 alignments through the desert to avoid I-40 closures for weather and accidents. We left Albuquerque headed south 20 miles then took an old alignment we hadn't been on before, and headed west. We immediately hit heavy snow, which had not been forecast, then it started blowing. The road was a two lane, no shoulders, and ditches. At 25 mph it occurred to me what it must have been like for travelers in the 1930's with primitive tires and weather forecasting and no communication. Route 66 - always an adventure!

Oklahoma Route 66 designated National Scenic Byway

The US Department of Transportation recently revealed the 2009 National Scenic Byways preferences, and Oklahoma Route 66 was on that prestigious list. Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood made the announcement on October 16.

This announcement will impact Oklahoma Route 66 in a very positive manner, and it couldn't come at a better time. The pinch of the recent economic slump has slowed revenue in the travel industry, in both the public and private sector. NSB designation will provide much needed funding in the form of grants to create and continue education, enhancement, and promotion of one of Oklahoma's greatest historical attractions.

"It's fantastic!" said Sapulpa business owner Frank Gierhart. "Tourism is a big deal around here."

Frank is the Oklahoma Route 66 Association Creek County District Representative, and very proactive in creating awareness of the importance of Route 66 preservation. Recently, he worked closely with the Oklahoma Vegetation Management Association, in partnership with OG&E, PSO, NRS and the City of Sapulpa, to save the historic Rock Creek Bridge from nature-gone-wild damage, to recapture a tranquil part of Sapulpa's history to enjoy for generations to come. Funding for projects such as these



is crucial to the ongoing improvements for Oklahoma Route 66.



Association President Mike Hickey was full on unbridled enthusiasm as he made the announcement of the NSB designation at the Association's 20th Anniversary celebration this past October.

"It took four years, and a lot of work by a lot of people throughout the state to make this happen," Mike declared. He also stated that there are more projects coming down the road that will involve coordinating with individual communities to publicize them. He looks forward to helping commu-

nities and travelers with the benefits that will come from the NSB.

The National Scenic Byways Program is part of the US Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration. The program is a grass-roots collaborative effort established to help recognize, preserve and enhance selected roads throughout the United States. Since 1992, the NSB Program has funded 2,832 projects for state and nationally designated byway routes in 50 states, Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia.

The US Secretary of Transportation recognizes certain roads as All-American Roads or National Scenic Byways based on one or more archeological, cultural, historic, natural, recreational and scenic qualities.

The NSB Discretionary program provides funding for byway-related projects each year, as part of the FHA's Discretionary Grants Program. Projects to support and enhance National Scenic Byways, All-American Roads and State-designated byways are eligible, and these provide revitalization opportunities for the three Route 66 states of New Mexico, Illinois, and now Oklahoma, to enhance the presentation and all around respect of the Mother Road.



Perhaps one of the underlying principles for the program has been articulated best by the Byway leader who said, "the program is about recognition, not regulation."

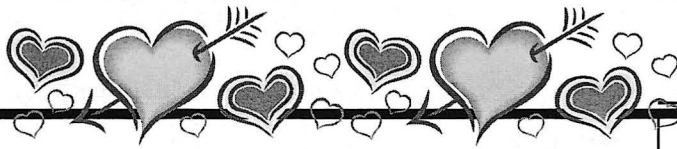

Jerald Ashby, Western Vice President

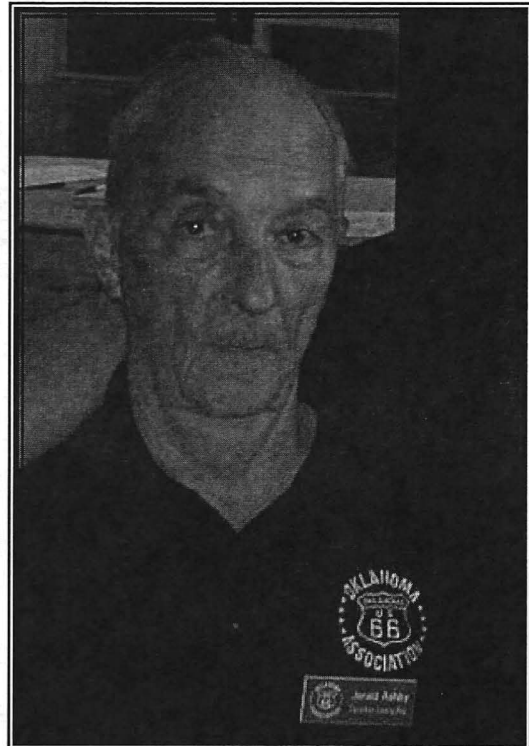

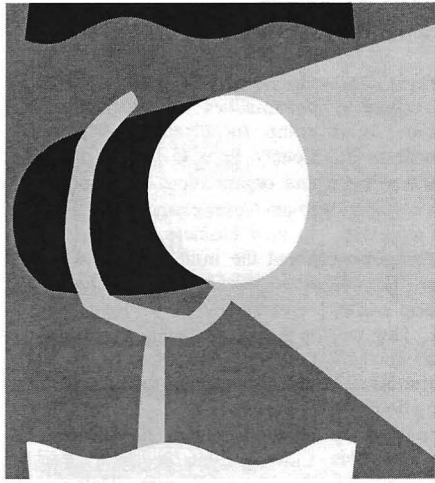

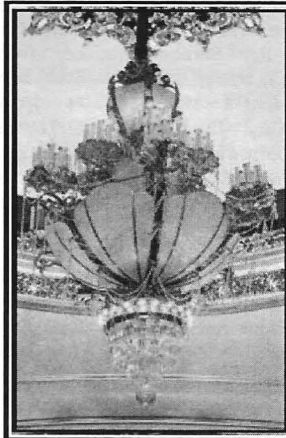
The Coleman Theatre



Originally a vaudeville theatre and movie palace, the "Coleman Theatre Beautiful" opened to a full house of 1,600, at \$1.00 a seat, on April 18, 1929. Built by George L Coleman Sr, local mining magnate, the opulent structure with Louis XV interior design dazzled the audiences of the day. From that day forward the Coleman has never been "dark".

The historic structure was donated to the City of Miami by the Coleman family in 1989. Restoration and renovation of the theatre has become a "labor of love" in the community. Efforts have included returning the "Mighty Wurlitzer" pipe organ to its original home and restoring the magnificent chandelier. Hundreds of volunteers have given countless hours of labor, raised funds and promoted a variety of events for all tastes and ages. They have formed a non-profit organization for the ongoing project and have named themselves the "Friends of the Coleman".

The Coleman Theatre promise to the next generation will be met by the people of this generation. The restoration of the Coleman is a project in process. Our vision is a highly functional theatre restored to its former elegance and grandeur. In the years to come the children of today will have access to live performances of all kinds. Renovation of an original upstairs meeting hall will provide a multi-purpose facility and community center.

Minutes from the Oklahoma Route 66 Association annual meeting

The 2010 Annual Meeting of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association was called to order at 1:05 pm by President Mike Hickey. 28 members and guests were present. Brad Nickson made the motion to accept the previous meeting's minutes, Ron Burden seconded, motion carried. Larry Nance, the Canadian County Representative informed the group of a County Commissioner candidate in his county that wants to tear up part of Route 66 to make way for development. He will keep the Association informed on this matter.

Treasurer Kim Evans gave the Treasurers report and asked the Association to develop a budget committee. Ms. Evans also talked to the group about the recent consolidation with the Chandler Chamber of Commerce with the office space and Administrator Marilyn Emde. No Secretary's report was given.

Marilyn Emde gave the Administrator's report. She informed the group that 55 people attended the Anniversary Celebration in October. Ms. Emde has also sent out 55 requests for payment for the Trip Guide from general inquiries and has had only one respond back.

Jonathan Gardner with Oklahoma Scenic Byway informed the Association that although Route 66 received National Scenic Byway designation, there has been no press release from the Oklahoma Department of Transportation; however, he will work with Marilyn Emde to try to get press releases out from the Association and

forward them to ODOT and try to get them to release them. Everyone was asked to come up with ideas for a "Big Celebration" to celebrate the designation. Mr. Gardner also mentioned that the 2010 grant cycle will probably open sometime from late February to early April and that any town on Route 66 will be eligible. He also talked to the group about a rational TV crew from the Czech Republic that will be here in late April to travel Route 66. He will let Marilyn know the dates as soon as he has them.

Emily Priddy and Marilyn Emde talked about Trip Guide ads; the deadline for the ads will be March 1. Ms. Priddy gave dos and don'ts about ads and told the group that if anyone should have a question they can contact her personally. Photos were passed out to determine the cover; Emily will take the top three choices and see which one will print the best. Kim Evans made the motion to use the same printer as last year, Ron Burden seconded, motion carried; a copy number will be determined at a later date after Marilyn Emde and Mike Hickey talk to Tourism and determine how many copies they will need. Ms. Emde also mentioned that the P & H on Trip Guides has gone up to \$5.95.

Upcoming and annual events were discussed. Frank Gierhart made the motion to participate in the Sapulpa Blow-Out June 5, 2010, Kim Evans seconded motion carried. After discus-

sion it was decided not to participate in the Clinton Festival this year. Brad Nickson will take a mini booth to the Main Street Redfork event if they have it again this year.

Frank Gierhart would like to work with the Oklahoma Vegetation Management Association again this year. He and Marilyn Emde will contact them and try to find a project for this year. They will keep the Association updated. The MS Bicycle Rally will be September 25, 2010; they will continue using Route 66 as their theme. Larry Nance made the motion to work with them again this year and help as needed, Brad Nickson seconded, motion carried. Jerald Ashby said he would like to do the holiday light cruise on the Eastern side of the state this year, details will be made available at a later date. The National Main Street Conference will be held the 1st week in May. Marilyn will get more information. The Association's cruise is set tentatively for June 12. It will be held in conjunction with the International Route 66 Festival to be held June 10, 11 and 12 in Joplin, MO. Carol Duncan said the Will Rogers Memorial Marker fund had reached its goal and that the stone will be ordered around the first of February and the stone should be set around April 1. She will let Mike Hickey and Marilyn Emde know the details as soon as she has them. Frank Gierhart talked about "Adopt Route 66". Through the Keep Oklahoma Beautiful Program, our

communities will be eligible for \$250 grants for clean-up. He needs the County Reps to help organize groups and organizations to adopt section of Route 66 for clean up.

In new business, Larry Nance talked about the murals being painted in El Reno. Jill Church would like to invite a representative of the Route 66 Alliance to the April meeting; everyone agreed. Officer Nominations were made and elections were as follows: Jill Church - Secretary; Kim Evans - Treasurer; Ottawa County Rep-Amanda Davis; Custer/Washita/Beckham Rep-Marion Davidson; Rogers /Delaware/Craig County Rep-Blaine Davis and Frank Jugler; Confirmation of Western Vice President Jerald Ashby and Canadian / Caddo/ Blaine County Rep-Larry Nance. Ballots were given out. Frank Jugler was elected at Rogers/Delaware/ Craig County Rep with Blaine Davis helping as he is available. All other officers were confirmed. Emily Priddy made the motion to elect all officers, Frank Gierhart seconded motion carried.

Emily Priddy thanked the Association for its help with one of her classes. Kim Evans asked the status of the "Save the Rio Sign"; Larry Nance will check with someone about painting it, no decision was made.

Kim Evans made the motion to adjourn the meeting, Alvin Harrell seconded, motion carried; meeting adjourned.

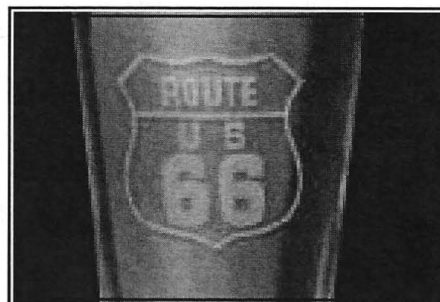

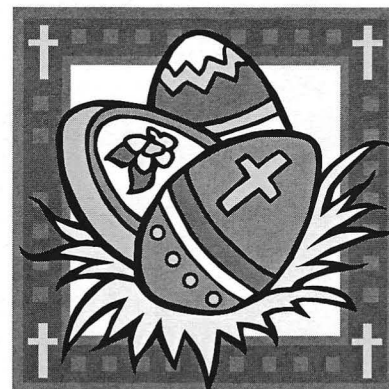
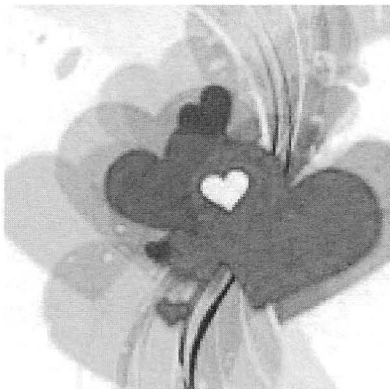
