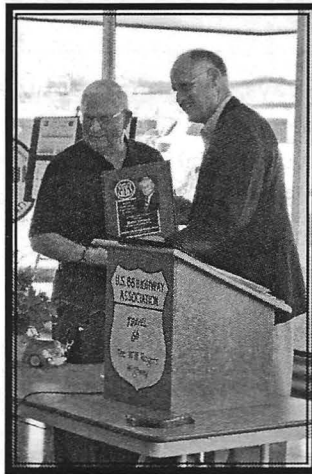
## Route 66 Museum hosts two major celebrations

The Oklahoma Route 66 Museum in Clinton was the site of dual festivities on a mild September day in 2010.

September 19, 2010 at the Oklahoma Route 66 Museum's 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration in Clinton.

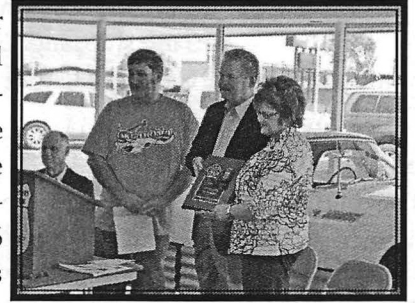
Davidson, who serves at the Custer/Washita/Beckham Area Rep, is a charter member of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association. He has served as

a faithful volunteer with the group and several of its committees. Born in the Route 66 town of Elk City, he was a recent owner-operator of Route 66 Thunderbirds and was owner-operator of a Lincoln-Mercury dealership in Weatherford for more than 40 years.

Marion has worked tirelessly to inform the public of the importance of Route 66 and its preservation. Also, he has demonstrated a true appreciation for the Heartland of America Museum.

Stansberry served as a curator of Elk City's Old Town Museum on Route 66 for more than 30 years. The museum complex later added the National Route 66 Museum. She also served on the Western Oklahoma Historical Society and the Elk City Museum Commission.

Lucy had a real love for Route 66, and enjoyed

meeting and sharing her vast knowledge with travelers. She was greatly disappointed when the city manager chose to keep her in charge of Old Town, instead of making her curator of the Route 66 museum, but she didn't let it affect her performance. Stansberry died on May 1, 2010, at the age of 91. The presentation was followed by food and fellowship.

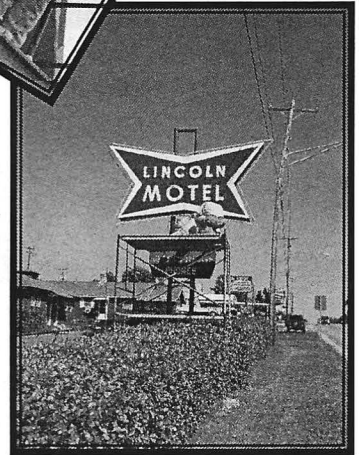
Workers met in front of the Motel at 8am on Saturday, September 11, 2010 for two days of hard but rewarding

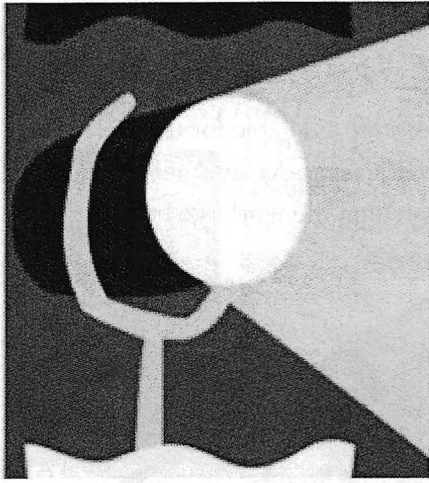

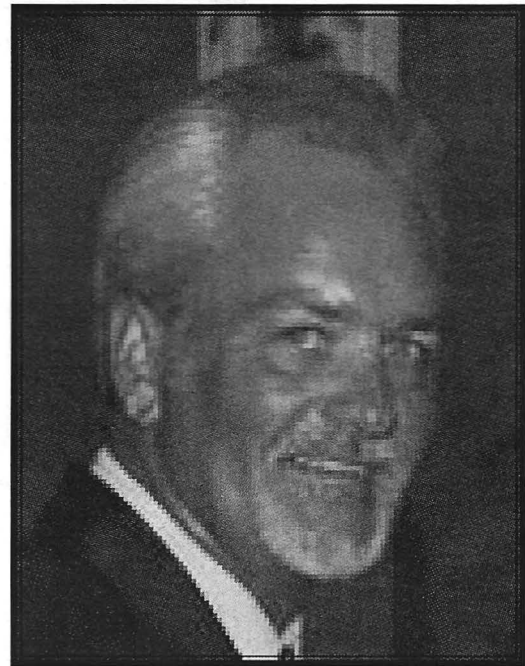

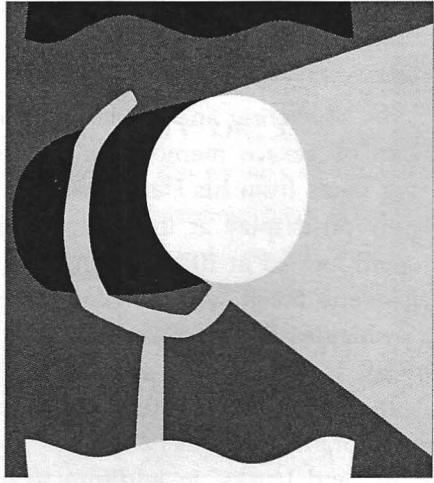
## Larry Nance, Canadian District Rep

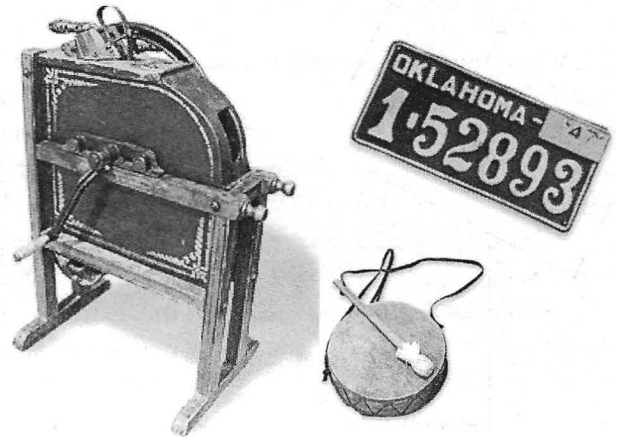

## Edmond Historical Society and Museum



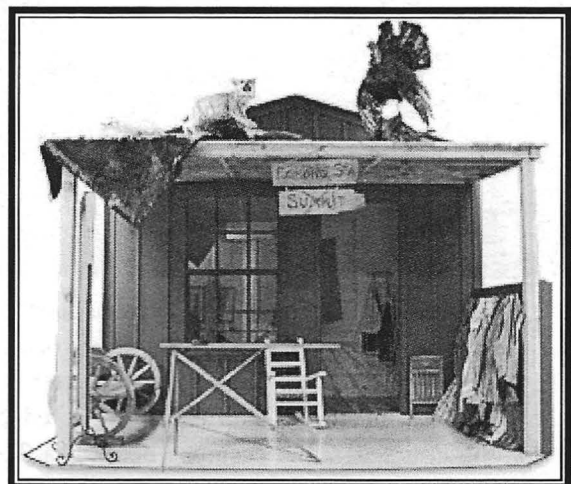
Step through the front door of the Edmond Historical Society Museum and you immediately enter the community's history. From prehistoric times through the Land Run, World War II on to the present, Edmond's heritage is housed in the WPA-built, former Armory of the 179th Infantry, 45th Division of the Oklahoma National Guard.

The common area is the site of many local and national art and history exhibits. Historical resources include the museum collection with over 30 thousands of artifacts and historic photographs, a non-circulating research library with books and documents related to Edmond and Oklahoma, newspaper on microfilm, and a computerized genealogical research area cosponsored by the Edmond Genealogical Society. Computers with CD-ROM records are available to the serious researcher. There is a Children's learning center, and group tours are available.

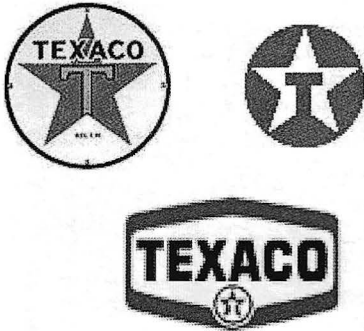

# Miami's Dobson Museum displays unique Texaco memorabilia



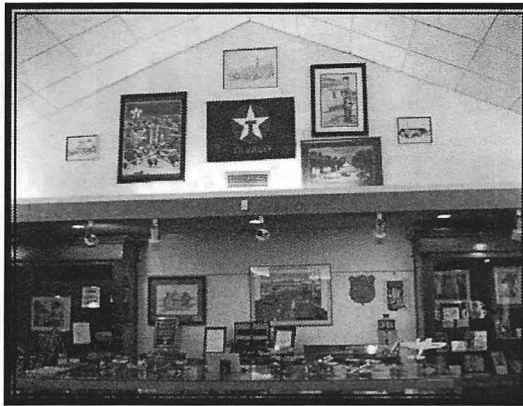
The Texaco Brand lives on Route 66 in Miami, Oklahoma and you must see it!

Miami is an iconic historical city that was once a favorite Route 66 rest stop to motorists traveling anywhere between Chicago and Santa Monica. During the several decades when 'The Mother Road' passed directly through the heart of every town, travelers could refuel at the Texaco Service Stations, dine and spend the night at either hotels or motels before they hit the road again.

Today is different only because many travelers view Miami as a destination stop in itself, due to the many attrac-



tions in the area including the historic Coleman Theatre, Waylan's Kuku Drive-In, NEO A&M College, the Vintage Motorcycle Museum, Chapters Bookstore, golf courses, many casinos,



good dining and the largest WPA constructed swimming pool in the State.

For early travelers, Texaco was a favored gasoline brand along Route 66. Texaco had over 40,000 full service stations in the USA where customers could use their Texaco Credit Card to access a full line of Texaco products and find clean "Registered Rest Rooms". Ottawa County, in the extreme northeastern corner of Oklahoma, had several Texaco service stations and a wholesaler who distributed petroleum products from a bulk plant located adjacent to the old Frisco Railroad coming through town.

One of the Miami Texaco stations was owned and operated by Odell Conard. His station was located on North Main Street and was very conveniently located not only for townspeople and travelers, but for the huge workforce employed by one of the largest B.F. Goodrich Tire plants in the United States. Odell's son, Jim, became a 32-year employee of Texaco

USA Marketing and his large collection of Texaco memorabilia, including items from his Dad's station, are now on display at the Dobson Museum located at 107 South A Street – just one block west of Main Street, the historic Route 66.

Jim Conard's collection of Texaco memorabilia includes airplanes, racecars, and trucks, in addition to belt buckles, hats, books, letters, art and photographs -- all bearing the Texaco logo. The collection gives one a unique look into the history of the distribution of gasoline that powered the growth of automobile travel. Today's travelers who are exploring Route 66 through Ottawa County will have a treat in store as they study this colorful and informative display.

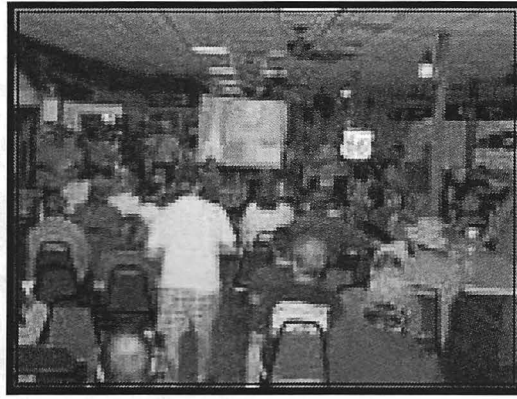
# Final Frame at the Route 66 Bowl

## OKLAHOMA CITY, OKLAHOMA

No longer will the sounds of rolling balls and clattering pins echo along Historic Route 66 on the west side of Oklahoma City. Neither will the neon-adorned giant bowling pin light the way for travelers from its former vantage point at 3810 NW 39 Expressway. For the famed 66 Bowl, a Mother Road icon since 1959 is no more, its contents and majestic sign auctioned off on October 1 of 2010, to make way for Spices of India food store.

Established in 1959, the 66 Bowl was purchased by former owner Jim Haynes in 1978. Interest in the auction ran high among the media, with representatives from most area TV stations and the Associated Press on hand to record the demise of this historic house of recreation.

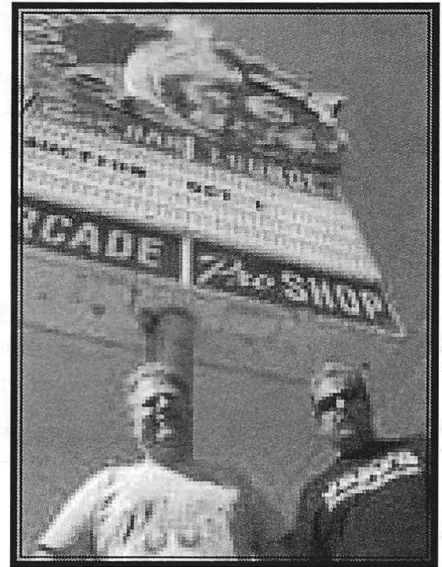
event, leading to a temporary postponement. Auctioneer Louis Dakil of Dakil Auctioneers Inc. had estimated that the sign would fetch between \$10,000 and \$100,000, however, when bidding resumed a bit later the results were quite a bit lower than expected. The winning bid of \$3,900 came from business partners Chuck Clowers of Luther and Cameron Eagle of OKC, who run Junk Yard Daddies, a commercial design firm specializing in custom-themed interiors. Clowers grew up in the immediate area, having lived along 66 all his life, and both have strong ties to the region and Route 66.

Other items of interest were the neon sign on the front of the building, a backlit sign on the buildings rear that said "66 Bowl" (which went for \$50) and various other signs and souvenirs. A genuine US 66 sign sold for around \$500.

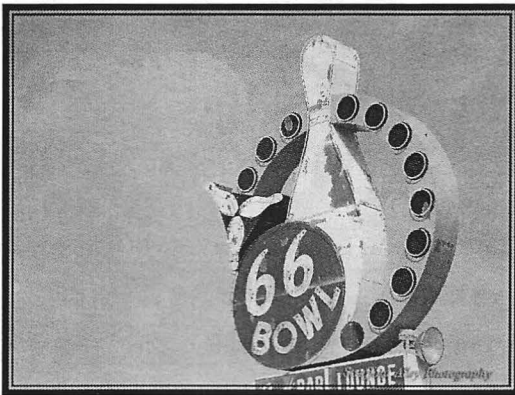
But most of the offerings were of little historic interest, being comprised of items like trash cans and bags, ladders, office equipment and other various sundry of a long-term business.

Many bidders came for the bowling equipment, such as the wooden lanes, bumper bowl systems, scoring apparatus, pin setting equipments, and huge lots of bowling balls, pins and shoes.

# Minutes from the Oklahoma Route 66 Association quarterly meeting

The Oklahoma Route 66 Association held its 2011 annual meeting on Sunday, January 9, 2011 at 1pm. The meeting took place at the Chandler Public Library Meeting Room, 1023 Manvel Avenue, Chandler, OK. After President Mike Hickey called the meeting to order, there was an introduction of the quarterly meeting attendees. Frank Gierhart made a motion to approve the minutes from the October quarterly meeting, Brad Nickson seconded, motion passed.

## Officer Reports

President Mike Hickey passed photos of the Oklahoma Bridge Projects, and gave a report of current bridge work. Mike advised that the Oklahoma Route 66 Preservation Workshop will be May 14 at the Interpretive Center in Chandler. The cost is \$20, and includes lunch. There was discussion of the purpose of a retreat, and a date of February 19-20 was chosen. Eastern Vice President Brad Nickson reported that the Friends of the Blue Whale created a Christmas light display. The city of Catoosa made an offer on the Blue Whale property. The property will become a park. The Mother Road 100 Ultra Marathon from Afton to Vinita was a success. Brad advised to look at the Illinois and Missouri Facebook pages for ideas for the Oklahoma Route 66 Association Facebook page. Custer/Washita/Beckman Rep Marion Davidson re-

ported that Weatherford is working to get more signage in town. Canadian/Blaine/Caddo County Rep Larry Nance reported that the second El Reno mural is complete. Union Pacific has made a donation of \$5000 toward the completion of a third mural depicting the history of the railroad, to be done next. Treasurer Kim Evans was not in attendance for the meeting. Marilyn Emde reported the unofficial checkbook balance is \$13066.57. Administrator Marilyn Emde reported that there were 7 new members and 65 renewals in the last quarter.

## Old Business

Creek Area Rep Frank Gierhart reminded the members of the Board to get in contact with their Chambers and communities to encourage involvement and action in the Keep Oklahoma Beautiful project on Oklahoma Route 66. Administrator Marilyn Emde stated to let her know as soon as possible what community projects are available. Marilyn Emde advised that Ottawa County will be the official sponsor of the Afton Marker Project. All forms were submitted to ODOT in November, but no response has been received. Laurel and David Kane will maintain the Marker once it is placed. Mike Hickey stated that there may be grant funding available for future projects like this one through the National Scenic Byways. The Board reviewed the proposed budget for the 2011 calendar year. Brad Nickson questioned the cost of the upcoming Trip Guide. Marilyn Emde stated the costs should be close

to the same as last year except the quantity may need to be smaller this year. Secretary Jill Ann Church made a motion to accept the budget. Frank Gierhart seconded. Motion passed. Marilyn Emde reported that ad sales for the 2011-12 Oklahoma Route 66 Trip Guide are coming in slowly so far. Marilyn advised District Reps be in touch with area businesses concerning existing ads, and to seek new businesses for ads. At the time of the meeting, the Oklahoma Department of Tourism has not advised if they will pay for any advertising or additional Trip Guides this year. Discussion was held on the quantity of Trip Guides to print this year, no decision was made. 2011 Multi-State Tour: After much discussion, the Board decided to for-go the Multi-State Tour this year, and after further discussion with the Missouri and Illinois Associations, will begin plans for a 2012 Multi-State Tour soon.

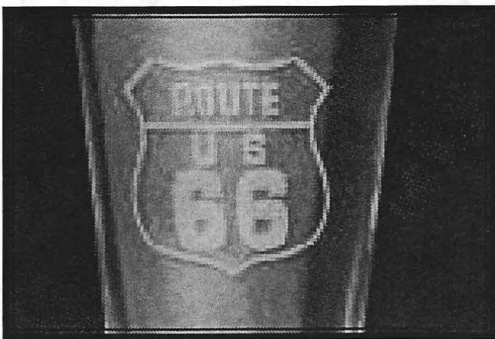

Jill Ann Church reported that the bridge went through several stages of possible repair, and after much public input, the bridge will be restored to its natural state, at an estimated cost of \$12,000,000, to be completed in January 2012. Jeanne Miller asked if businesses could pay in advance to reserve specific Trip Guide ad space. Letters will be sent out to previous advertisers to offer this service, and 30 days will be allowed to respond. Ron Gimondo made a motion to allow payment in advance for reserve Trip Guide ad space. Brad Nickson seconded. Motion passed. Larry Nance, Marion Davidson, and Mike Hickey discussed Oklahoma Route 66 highway stenciling. Brad Nickson motioned to adjourn. Ron Gimondo seconded. Meeting adjourned.
