KAB again hits "The Road" running in Sapulpa

SAPULPA, OKLAHOMA Members of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association gathered on a mild spring day to celebrate the beauty and continued preservation on the Mother Road. The Rock Creek Bridge in Sapulpa was the meeting place of what has become an annual event: Keep America Beautiful's Great American Clean-up.

The official theme of this year's event was "Green Starts Here." In addition

to collecting litter and debris around the area of the Bridge, aluminum and other reusable material were separated and delivered to appropriate areas in an effort to enhance the concept of preservation through recycling.

Along with these efforts, several men also man-icured the roadsides with

weed-eaters and clippers.

"This work is in preparation for larger clearing and renovation projects around the Bridge," explained Sapulpa business owner and Creek District Rep Frank Gierhart. Major foliage clearing was performed last year, securing against further compromise of the structure. Frank continued, "This doesn't even look like the same place as last year! Eventually this will serve as a trailhead for other trails in the area."

Association Administrator Marilyn Emde has additional plans for the area around Rock Creek. "We want to build a retro park with picnic tables and benches, flowers, a flag pole ... things to make those who visit feel they're back in the good ol' days."

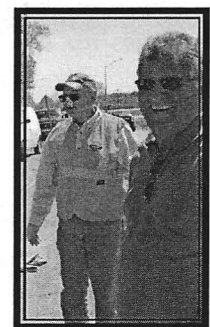
As the crew wrapped up their day, they visited briefly with Alan and John. These gentlemen from Melbourne, Australia

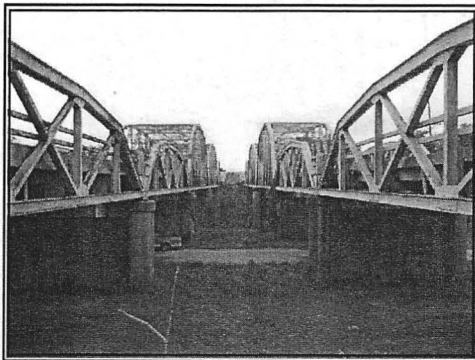
Mitigating Loss of Bird Creek Bridge

State Historic Preservation Office, Oklahoma Historical Society - Later this summer the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) will begin demolition of the historic Bird Creek Bridge on SH 66 near Catoosa, Rogers County. Originally scheduled for 2012, ODOT was forced to expedite the project due to the bridge's condition.

The 1936 bridge carries westbound traffic on the four-lane, divided highway. It will be replaced with a completely new structure, but its "twin" (built in 1956) which carries the eastbound traffic will remain in service.



The legacy of the "Mother Road" is treasured by Oklahomans and people from around the world. Historic bridges, such as the Bird Creek Bridge, are part of this legacy, a major part of Oklahoma's heritage tourism industry. *Economic Impacts of Historic Preservation in Oklahoma* (<http://www.okhistory.org/shpo/publications.htm>), clearly documents the effects of these travelers on Okla-

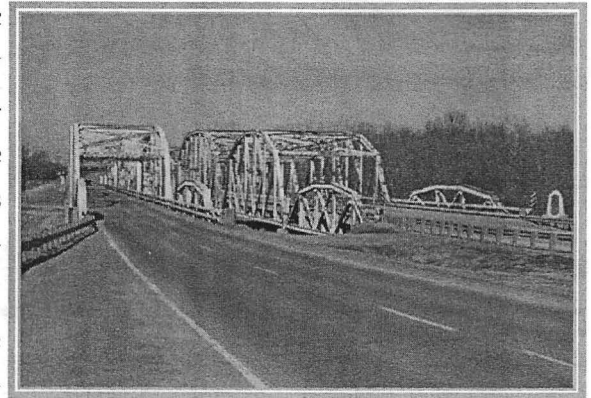
homa's economy. Historic Route 66 offers the opportunity to serve everyday transportation needs, as well as provide memorable visitor experiences to thousands of heritage tourists every year.

"The Bird Creek Bridge (formerly known as the Verdigris River Bridge) is a 824 feet long, mixed truss type bridge was built in 1936 by M. E. Gillioz and is comprised of six trusses, the longest of which is 209 feet. Riveted construction was used for this twenty-four feet wide structure. The original bridge plate remains in place."

(See <http://okbridges.wkinsler.com/birdcreek9.html>.) ODOT and the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) agreed that the bridge is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places for its association with historic Route 66.

So, historic preservation advocates may ask why will the Bird Creek Bridge be demolished when it is eligible for the National Register? Other people may ask if the eligibility caused delays in ODOT's plans to replace the bridge. Both questions show a lack of understanding of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).

Section 106 of the NHPA requires Federal agencies and their authorized designees to consider the effects of their undertakings on archeological and historic



properties listed on or eligible for the National Register. Because ODOT will use federal funding from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for the Bird Creek Bridge project, it had to comply with Section 106 of the NHPA, as well as other federal laws. To comply with Section 106, FHWA and ODOT consulted with the SHPO and others as provided in the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's (ACHP) regulations which set the framework for the process. The regulations require agencies to begin their consultation as early as possible so that all project alternatives can be considered and that construction delays can be avoided.

The first step in the process is to determine if there are historic properties in the project area, and as mentioned above, ODOT and the SHPO found the Bird Creek Bridge to meet the National Register criteria. The next step is to determine if planned work will have any effects on such historic properties. Because demolition of Bird Creek Bridge was proposed, the project would obviously have an adverse (next page)

effect on the structure as defined in the ACHP regulations. Next, FHWA and ODOT consulted further with the SHPO and others to determine if these adverse effects could be avoided or minimized and, if not, how the effects could be mitigated. Because an adverse effect finding existed, FHWA informed the ACHP, and ACHP exercised its option to participate in the consultation.

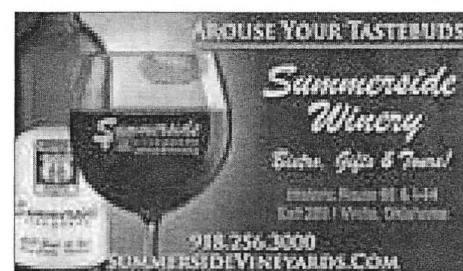
Additionally, FHWA and ODOT invited tribal governments, preservation organizations and agencies, the City of Catoosa, and the public to take part in the consultation. When concerned citizens express their views, it helps an agency reach the best possible decision about how a project is carried out. (See the ACHP's new edition of its Citizen's Guide to the Section 106 Process, <http://www.achp.gov/pubs.html>.) The City of Catoosa; Preservation Oklahoma, Inc.; the National Park Service Route 66 Corridor Preservation Program; the Oklahoma Route 66 Association; and the Historic Bridge Foundation (Fort Worth, Texas) joined the consultation. After evaluation of several design alternatives, it was confirmed that demolition of the historic bridge was the only feasible course of action. As stipulated in the ACHP's regulations, a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) was developed to document the steps FHWA and ODOT would take to mitigate the adverse effect. The MOA was signed in March 2011.

The MOA's stipulations include (1) documentation of the Bird Creek Bridge and its setting to meet Historic American Engineering Record (HAER) standards, (2) production of a video documentary about the history of the "twin bridges" to be made widely available to the public, (3) bridge trusses will be provided to the City of Catoosa for preservation and interpretation in a city park, (4) ODOT will carry out regular maintenance and conduct inspections of the 1956 "twin bridge" and report results of those inspections to all the consulting parties, and (5) ODOT and the SHPO will develop an interagency agreement to better coordinate programs that impact historic Route 66 and its resources.

FHWA and ODOT recognize the special significance of Route 66 and its related resources and the many positive economic impacts of heritage tourism along the historic highway, and the Oklahoma SHPO understands the critical need for safe and efficient transportation corridors. It is mutually agreed that these issues can be balanced for Route 66 to provide maximum public benefits and that a formal plan of action is vital to accomplishing this mutual goal. Within eighteen months, ODOT shall produce a draft agreement with the SHPO concerning how ODOT will approach highway improvement projects along the Route 66 corridor for which it has jurisdiction or for which

it provides financial assistance. Additionally, ODOT shall incorporate preservation strategies into the agreement to support provisions of the Corridor Management Plan for Oklahoma's Route 66 National Scenic Byway and identify activities ODOT can carry out with the SHPO and others as partners to preserve the intrinsic qualities of the historic highway.

Because the Bird Creek Bridge is a significant part of the Route 66 corridor, its loss is unfortunate. However, preservation of historic resources in place is not always feasible. But, it is hoped that the mitigation measures from the Section 106 process will not only document the history of the bridge but also lead to decreased loss of other character defining resources of the "Mother Road." "It's wonderful to view the collection and realize the important role that Route 66 played in the history of our country," Emde said.

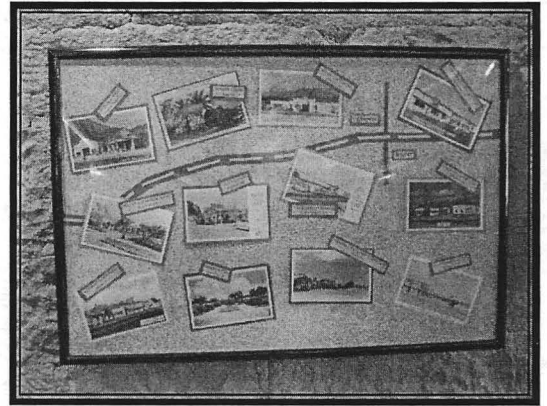
