men who are a group of Artisan Blacksmiths which will enlighten attendees about the art and skill of blacksmithing.

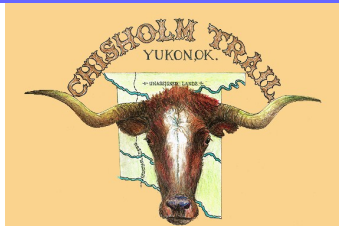

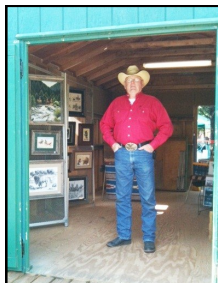

Did you know.....

There is a new way finding marker in Tulsa. It is located at 11th and Mingo in East Tulsa. It points the way to the 1926-32 alignment and to the 1932-1973 alignment. In 1973 Rt. 66 was re-routed to the Skelly Bypass (I-44 service road). The new signage is another part of the \$15 million Route 66 Vision 2025 project approved by Tulsa County voters a few years ago. To the south of this intersection, as pointed out by the new sign, is an interpretive plaza. It will have some concrete columns with informational plaques mounted on them.

The drive-in went up in flames in September 2010 when the all-wood, nine-story, double-sided screen tower burned to the ground.

Architect Shelby Navarro of Tulsa's ONE Architecture, donated his services in designing the steel-paneled, open-ended screen tower that looms above the new concessions area and restrooms.

When it burned down, there were many people at the gate, lamenting the memories that were made at this once great Route 66 landmark.

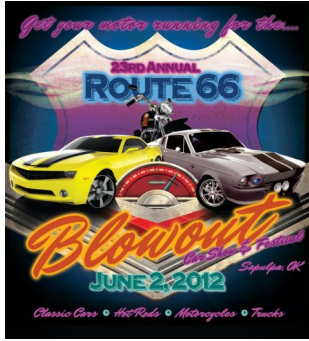

Sapulpa Main Street



According to Kallie McGuire with the Sapulpa Main Street, Sapulpa became an official Main Street community in 1990. The idea being to contribute to the economic development of

the community. This is all accomplished through a national four-point approach focused on quality and long-term improvement. The four points are: Design, Economic Restructuring, Promotion and Organization.

In the past 22 years, \$33 million in private and public funds were put into downtown brick and mortar projects.

There is a current focus on continued recruitment of diversified, specialized retail and development of upper floor spaces into housing and offices.

The Sapulpa Main Street Promotes and helps in the organization of the Sapulpa Blowout, which just celebrated it's 23rd



year this past June (featured in this newsletter) and the Jingle Bell Sweepstakes now in it's 15th year which gives away \$10,000 each November.

Look for Concerts on the Corner every 4th Thursday from June to September as well as Shopping promotions for Sapulpa Retailors.



Route 66 travelers will be able to experience the all NEW Sapulpa Historic walking tour in the spring of 2013.

The Main Street will continue its economic development by working to ensure Sapulpa's distinguishing characteristic remain vital while supplying the rest of us with fun and exciting activities the year round.

Route 66 Corridor Preservation Winners For 2012 Announced

The Route 66 Corridor Preservation Program provides funding assistance in the form of cost-share grants, to support the preservation of the most significant and representative historic Route 66 buildings, structures, road segments, and cultural landscapes in the eight states through which the route passes. Program cost-share grant funds are provided

through congressional appropriations, which are determined each new fiscal year. Project eligibility criteria requires a minimum 50% (1:1) cost-share match provided by the applicant.



In 1999, in response to the recognized need to preserve the rich resources of the historic highway, Congress passed an Act to create the Route 66 Corridor Preservation Program. Administered by the National Park Service, the program collaborates with private property owners; non-profit organizations; and local, state, federal, and tribal governments to identify, prioritize, and address Route 66 preservation needs. The Route 66 Corridor Preservation Program is administered by the Na-

tional Park Service's National Trails System Office in Santa Fe, New Mexico. Designed as a "seed," or stimulus, program, it is scheduled to legislatively terminate at the end of fiscal year 2019, at which time the National Park Service will appoint a non-federal entity (or entities) to continue the program's purpose.

In 2012 a total of \$103,487 was awarded to 10 projects with an additional \$103,487 contributed in cost-share match.

In Oklahoma The Circle Cinema Theatre in Tulsa, OK was one such recipient. Amount: \$23,261 NPS, \$23,261 match. The Circle Cinema was built in 1928 on land east of Tulsa, Oklahoma that would soon after become Tulsa's first suburban development. The original construction cost was \$77,000, including a Robert Morton organ

that would accompany vaudeville acts and silent movies. The Circle Cinema remained popular into the 1960s, when interstate construction brought decline to the area. By the 1980s, the theater was in poor condition and condemned for demolition until it was purchased by the Circle Cinema Foundation in 2003 as part of community development grant. As the only pre 1960s theater remaining in Tulsa, it was listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The foundation has since undertaken extensive restoration work and reopened the theater. The grant project will complete facade restoration, including entry doors and ticket window.

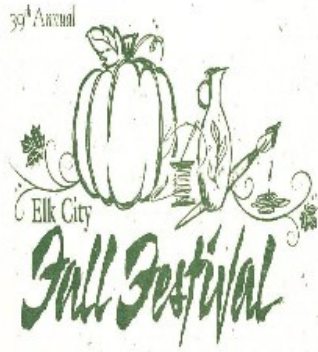

Oklahoma Route 66 Association Needs Volunteers & Funding

We are a not-for-profit organization made up of volunteers who are dedicated to the promotion and preservation of Route 66.

We serve as the non-governmental body that coordinates the statewide economic development, enhancement, improvement, preservation, and recognition of U. S. Route 66 in Oklahoma. In keeping with our mandate, we generate whatever finances and pressures we can to save Route 66 Landmarks from decay or destruction.

The Association is managed by a team of elected officers that serve (2) year terms. As of this writing the following positions are open:

Treasurer (Prefer Accounting) Western Vice President

The State is divided into Districts and several of the districts come up for election in 2013. The District Representatives are needed to help in the distribution of the Trip Guides, sell memberships, sell Trip Guide ads and work with the Route 66 businesses in their district. The District Representatives are required to attend the quarterly board meetings.

We have formed committees and we are in need of volunteers to serve on them. The volunteers needed include:

- Social Media—The website is currently a volunteer position. It needs to be updated and changed monthly.
- We have Facebook and twitter accounts that need to be monitored.

- Activities—Road Cruise Planners needed.
- District Calendar -Provide a list of activities in the presiding district which will be listed in the newsletter. Turn in Press Releases to the newsletter staff.

We publish a newsletter four times per year that is distributed to our membership located around the world. This job is currently handled by the secretary.

We also publish our Official Oklahoma Route 66 Association Trip Guide—that is updated every year. This Trip Guide takes approx. 80-100 man hours to produce. This is presently done by a volunteer and coordinated by the Executive Director. The District Representatives sell ads for this Trip Guide. It is very popular and if you will refer to the Impact Study produced by the State and published in the Oklahoma Route 66 Newsletter (last Issue) it has a very large circulation.

In spite of this and probably because of the challenging economic times the costs of producing the Trip Guide have gone up and the ad sales are declining.

At the 2012 July Quarterly Meeting the Board voted to raise the ad prices for the 2013 Trip Guide.

Pricing:

1/16 page \$40 1/8 page \$65

1/4 page \$130 1/2 page \$240

Full page \$480

With the exception of the Executive Director, which is a paid position, all other work is done by volunteers, most of which have full time jobs and

families. Probably just like you. But if you have an interest in preserving the Oklahoma Route 66, then please consider joining our group. Maybe you work for a Main Street or Chamber of Commerce and by joining our organization as a District Representative or by serving on a committee could further help your community.

Maybe you know someone who will be needing to log volunteer hours for their work, school or civic clubs. Please tell them about the OK Route 66 Association.
