Several visitors joined the Board of Directors at the 2013 Oklahoma Route 66 Association Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 27 at the Chandler Library Conference Room. A noon potluck provided food and fellowship leading up to the 1pm meeting.

Many important issues were discussed. The critical financial state of the Association was met with ideas to generate revenue, the most pressing being the implementation of corporate sponsorships. The Nowata Printing Company bid was accepted for publication of the 2013 Trip Guide. Local events for the upcoming season were presented by District Reps and other contributors. The introduction of the Association's new website was given, offering increased user friendly features and an exciting online presentation.

The Board of Directors 2013 election results are as follows: Brad Nickson, President and Tulsa District Rep; Blaine Davis, Eastern Vice President; and Mike Hickey, Western Vice President.

The Treasurer position remains open; Ron Burden, Lincoln District Rep; Wayne McCombs, Rogers/Delaware/Craig District Rep; Canadian/Caddo/Blaine District Rep remains open but will be temporarily covered by At Large Rep Jill Ann

Church; Custer/Washita/Beckham District Rep remains open; and one At Large Rep remains open.

The other Board of Directors members are: Deborah Blair, Secretary and Oklahoma District Rep; Frank Gierhart, Creek District Rep, ; Laurel Kane, Ottawa District Rep, and Emily Priddy, At-Large Rep.

The Board discussed rescheduling the spring quarterly meeting, due to conflicting schedules. 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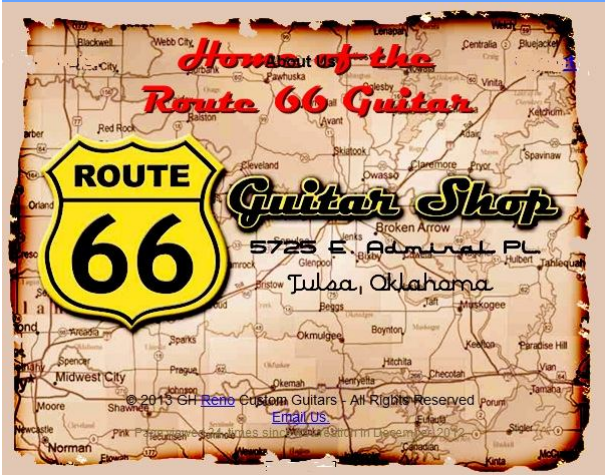

OK Route 66 Guitars Tulsa, Oklahoma

OK Route 66 Guitars in Tulsa, OK was born In early 2004. I visited their new website: <http://route66guitarshop.com> where owner Jerry Reno has posted his story.

He saw an advertisements for the "International Route 66 Festival", which was to be held in Tulsa, OK that year. They were touting big giveaways which included a Harley Davidson motorcycle and the wheels in Jerry's head started turning.

Why not build and donate a custom "Route 66" graphic custom guitar? He contacted the International Route 66 Festival made the pitch and they loved the idea.



The instrument Jerry produced was not your typical low end to medium quality promotional giveaway. He produced an instrument worthy of his brand name. This first Route 66 guitar was based on a customized, bolt-on, Telecaster™ style instrument sporting a chambered al-

der body, a quarter-sawn maple neck with an abalone inlaid "Get Your Kicks" Paul Ferro fingerboard. The headstock was Jerry's unique and functional 5+1 arrangement fitted with Sperzel tuning machines and the pickups are by Seymour Duncan. Everything on this guitar was either fabricated or sourced from USA sources.

The most unique and relevant feature of this instrument was the highly customized airbrushed graphics executed by Tulsa's own, Greg "Lil' Toot" Tuter which is comprised of a map of the historic Route 66 combined with the official festival logo. To top it all off, the lucky winner of this fine instrument received a customized "Route 66" Levi's gig bag to protect the instrument.

The G. H. Reno Brand provides exquisite construction, highly stylized custom instruments all of which Jerry Reno has steadily developed over the last 30 years. Jerry, with the help of his close machinist friend, John Shipley, came up with many novel devices

and methods that allowed him to streamline production in his shop yielding superior results. In particular, he perfected the process of the "fret job" or "refret". Any guitarist or bassist who has had the opportunity to play an instrument that has been fretted by Jerry will marvel at the feel and quality of the fretwork. This same attention can be found throughout any G.H. Reno constructed instrument.

OK Route 66 Guitars also offers a full line of hotrod inspired custom aftermarket parts. The same parts that Jerry developed for his custom instruments are available separately for those interested in upgrading their existing guitars. Alongside, Jerry continues to perform repairs on other brand instruments and he also operates his "Nu Frets" business where he has the ability to fret necks for other builders as well as refret existing necks.

The winner of this fabulous instrument at the International Route 66 Festival was truly lucky! Pictures of this one-of-a-kind instrument soon surfaced on



the internet and drew the attention of Jess McEntire of Mother Road Music in Nashville, TN. Jess is a country musician with a passion for the preservation of Route 66. Jess offers music

downloads and merchandise and channels a portion of the profits to other non-profit organizations that focus on the preservation of the historic highway.

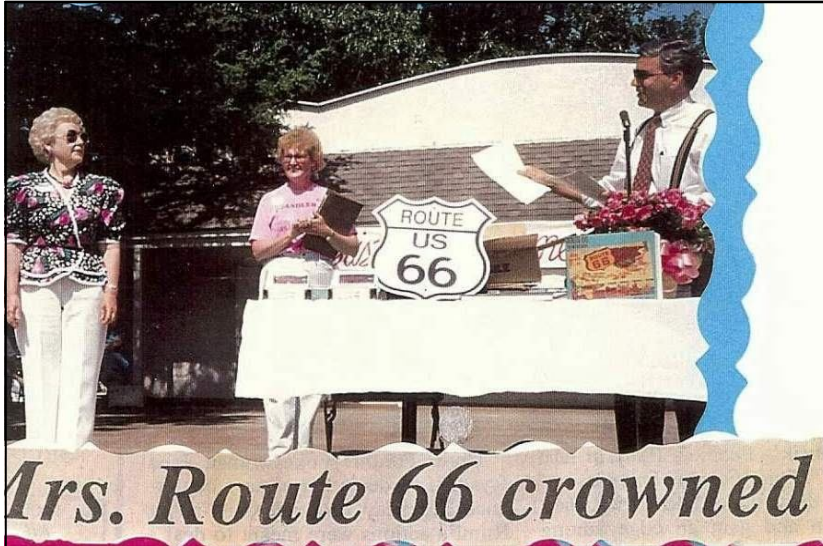

Recently David Stroup was visiting the Rock Café in Stroud, Oklahoma, for the first time in 55 years, when he let his mind wander down memory lane. He would visit his grandparents in Stroud and visit the movie theater that was only open on the weekends-but you could see a movie and get popcorn and a soft drink for 25 cents. He then remembered that his mother, Juanita Stroup, at one time was named Mrs. Route 66.

I talked to David Stroup this past week on the phone. He said, "I asked several people and no one seems to know how many years they had Mr. and Mrs. Route 66. It was a state wide essay and each County had a winner-mother won Creek County. She had the honor to be chosen the first Oklahoma Mrs. Route 66. Governor Walters presented the plaque.

Juanita and husband Ralph lived in Sapulpa, and Juanita worked on the Frisco Railroad in 1942 and later sold real estate. Ralph sold State Farm Insurance.

Juanita remembers Route 66 and the 1990 contest.: She says: US Route 66 lives in my mind and memories as well as countless other peoples. It was the nation's first interstate and a vast improvement over rutted farm roads that had linked America until that time. It was the "depression era's YELLOW BRICK ROAD to the land of opportunity."

When we would start on a vacation,

usually to California, we would pack enough sandwiches and fried chicken to last the entire trip. The Burma shave signs along Route 66 were always something to look forward to. We seldom saw two that read the same. "

The Oklahoma Route 66 Association and the Sapulpa Newspaper sponsored the essay contest. Each contestant had to be a minimum of "66" years old and had to write an essay of 260 words or less. They were to write of memories and places they encountered along the Mother Road.

Juanita received word that she had won the Creek County honor along with the newly crowned Mr. Route 66 Harley Allen. An old Brick that was made in

Sapulpa was engraved with her name and she received a certificate of Honor. Juanita said, "After getting my picture in the paper I felt real Honored." On June 10th, all county winners met at Bristow. Governor Walters told the county winners that as the winning essay was read if you realized that it was yours to come to the platform. Juanita said, " I felt like a queen for the day as I walked up there that day." For the state honor she received an Oklahoma shaped plaque with the title "Mrs. Oklahoma Route 66" engraved on it. Here is the winning essay :

GET YOUR KICKS ON ROUTE 66

The most magnificent landscapes of traveling are found on old Route 66. The fond memories are etched in my mind and I sincerely hope they will never fade away.

While traveling through New Mexico in 1957, we stopped at a roadside stand where Navajo Indian girls were selling necklaces made from seeds and nuts found in their area, also some colorful beads. They were shy and could not speak English too well. But were thankful we had purchased their jewelry.

While visiting my parents in Stroud, Oklahoma, who lived on Route 66, the sirens started blaring as there was a tornado sighted. We hurriedly ran to the closet, got our coats as it was pouring down rain, and headed for the storm cellar. To our amazement it was nearly full of people we had never seen before, as they were traveling on Route 66, heard the sirens, saw the cellar and made a fast dash for it. There was much wind damage, but we were thankful those in the cellar were safe.

We not only got our kicks, but pricks on Old 66, the first time we drove to California in 1952. As we went through the desert the cacti were in full bloom. My mother and I thought they were pretty. We parked the car and picked some of the flowers from the cactus bush. To our dismay, we had a hard time pulling out the painful, hard to see, prickles from our tender skin.

Central Oklahoma Telephone Co.

The beginnings of Central Oklahoma Telephone Co. (COTC) started in 1920 where the switchboard was located in the front room of a two-story house known as the Cimarron Hotel



which is now located on the same corner where Central Oklahoma Telephone offices are today. In 1936 Richard and Lillie Guest moved to Davenport to operate the Davenport Telephone Co.

In 1946, they purchased the system, and in 1953 Leroy "Dutch" Guest returned home to manage the company. The name was changed to Central Oklahoma Telephone Co., and a loan was secured from the Rural Electrification Administration (REA) to rebuild and convert to dial service. Over the next few years, the exchanges of Kendrick, Sparks, Agra, and Tryon in Lincoln County and Boley and Castle in Okfuskee County were added.

In the 1980's, the subsidiary company Vi-Tel, L.L.C. was formed to serve the Davenport community with cable TV service. Central Cellular, L.L.C., another subsidiary was formed to offer cellular service. Central Cellular partnered with Southwestern Bell Wireless (then Cingular, now AT&T) to offer a full line of cellular phones and accessories. COTC's Davenport Headquarters

was expanded in 1982.

More recently, COTC began offering telephone services to the town of Stroud in September, 2005 under the name of COTC Connections. Connections offers local and long distance services as well as high-speed DSL service.

Beginning in 2011, COTC started a \$2 million project to install buried fiber optic cables to all homes and businesses in the town of Davenport. This fiber-to-the-home (FTTH) project is the first of its kind in Lincoln County and will provide residents faster and more reliable Internet services and better CATV service. The buried lines will also be less susceptible to storm damage. COTC hopes to complete this project by the spring of 2012. Another part of this project is the upgrade of the central office switching equipment. In the fall of 2011, COTC replaced the existing Nortel DMS-10 digital switchboards with Genband C15 softswitches. With these new switches and the FTTH, COTC will be positioned to offer many new services as the telecommunications industry moves to the broadband IP world in the 21st Century.

attention when its chicken fried steak was featured on Guy Fieri's popular Food Network show Diners, Drive-Ins and Dives and in Gourmet Magazine.

Tally's Good Food Cafe, 102 S Yale Ave, Tulsa, OK 74112

Tally's Good Food Cafe in Tulsa is

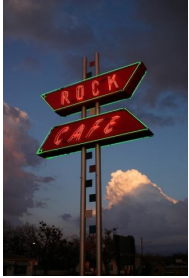

Route 66 town as small as Stroud. But you'll soon discover that this German dish is chicken fried steak's European cousin. This hand-breaded pork cutlet doused in a rich bacon-and-mushroom sauce and served with small, buttery dumplings is the Rock Cafe's signature dish.

Gar Wooly's, 1025 Broadway, Hwy. 66 Davenport, OK 74026



Travelers can't miss Gar Wooly's in Davenport which looks like part of an old Western movie set from the road. The restaurant is known for two things: chicken fried steak and Indian tacos.

POPS, 660 Historic U.S. 66, Arcadia, OK 73007



POPS, the newest Route 66 icon, opened in August 2007 with cutting-edge modern architecture and a monolithic 66-foot tall soda bottle

sculpture complete with LED light show. It holds the distinction of being the only place in Oklahoma (and probably the only place on the planet) where you can wash down a hefty serving of chicken fried steak with your choice of more than 500 flavors of soda. Be forewarned: If you go on a weekend, it may take an hour or more to get a table, but the experience and atmosphere are well worth the wait.

Cheever's, 2409 North Hudson Avenue, Oklahoma City, OK 73103

Situated in a former flower shop just off Route 66 (23rd street) in Oklahoma City, Cheever's offers an imaginative, upscale twist on the classic diner chicken fried steak. Cheever's chicken fried sirloin comes with jalapeno cream gravy and a side of red-skinned garlic mashed potatoes.



Ann's Chicken Fry House, 4106 Northwest 39th Street, Oklahoma City, OK 73112

When "chicken fry" is part of its name, you know a restaurant has to be good, and Ann's Chicken Fry House does not disappoint. Ann's Chicken Fry House has been attracting hungry Route 66 travelers since the 1970s. The kitschy décor includes some of the most interesting architectural neon in Oklahoma and

hundreds, if not thousands, of handwritten notes that have been left on the walls by previous visitors, some of whom are famous celebrities.

Lucille's Roadhouse, 1301 North Airport Road, Weatherford, OK 73096

Built in Weatherford in 2006, Lucille's accompan-



ies its chicken fried steak with mashed potatoes, gravy and a bit of history. The business is a tribute to the late Lucille "Mother of the Mother Road" Hamons, who for many years operated a historic Provine gas station on Route 66 just east of Weatherford.
