Return of the 66 Bowl Sign

Beginning in 1959, travelers were treated each night to the animated series of strikes scored by the giant Neon Bowling Pin sign that once fronted Oklahoma City's late, lamented 66 Bowl.

Damaged by a storm in 1996, this roadside icon was rebuilt in identical fashion to resume its stand along 39th Expressway, until the unfortunate closing of the bowling alley in 2010, to be replaced by a grocery store.

Auctioned off along with the rest of the fixtures, the fate of this majestic sign was a mystery until it recently bowled 66 fans over by reappearing alongside the Mother Road once again, this time in Chandler, Oklahoma.

Owner Sid Hayes is building his forthcoming Route 66 Family Fun Center on the north side of W First Street/Route 66. His new enterprise will house a bowling alley along with mini golf, bumper cars, and a large collection of gas station memorabilia. Obviously, the famous 66 Bowl sign was a perfect fit.

Involved in the sign's latest resurrection was Reynolds Neon from OKC, and Derek Lawson of Luther, who installed the neon from the precarious perch of a hydraulic bucket. Once this delicate process was accomplished, Mr. Haynes and family and friends joined together for a test lighting on the evening of April 15th. Temporarily hooked up to a portable generator, the neon "ball" circled the giant bowling pin repeatedly, scoring a strike on the neon pins each time.

On April 30th of 2016 a large group of family, friends and Route 66 roadies met at Afton Oklahoma's famed Afton Station and Packard Museum in honor of the late Laurel Kane, who passed away earlier this year.

Laurel's blog "Ramblings of a Route 66 Business Owner," offered daily observations from Laurel about what it was like to be the owner of Afton Station at the station's website: http://postcardsfromtheroad.net/afton.shtml

The website stated: "it has been a busy time for us since purchasing a vintage 1930's D-X gas station on Route 66 in Afton, Oklahoma sixteen years ago (1998). A complete restoration was necessary in order to house a collection of vintage automobiles (mostly Packards, but a few others as well), a collection of **Route 66 memorabilia**, and a nice assortment of **souvenirs**, **maps**, **guide books** and other memorabilia for sale. Our two showrooms display about **17 vintage autos**.


We are an unofficial "rest stop" for weary travelers, and we are always ready to visit with folks from all over the world. Each year we average approximately 7,000 visitors from every state and 18 countries who enjoy our displays and appreciate the diversity of our merchandise for sale."

Laurel was also well known for her huge collection of postcards, many of which were on display at the station along with many relics of the original incarnation of nearby Buffalo Ranch.

Despite dealing with dialysis and other health issues, Laurel became known worldwide as an "Ambassador to the Mother Road" for her friendly greetings to all travelers who stopped by. These fortunate visitors left armed with Laurel's vast knowledge and recommendations about how to enjoy their trip down 66. David Kane, Laurel's ex-husband, and their daughter Sarah hosted the catered memorial for Laurel at the station, attended by a large number family and friends from across the country. Local resident Betty Wheatley, former operator of the Dairy Ranch and frequent volunteer at Afton Station was in attendance, along with Ron "Tattoo Man" Jones of Bartlesville, who often showed up to meet visitors, and Ron McCoy of Tulsa, who was a longtime volunteer at Afton Station and one of Laurel's closest friends. Touching memories of Laurel were the order of the afternoon.

Laurel's memory will be honored by the continuation of Afton Station as a tourist destination. David Kane plans to keep the Packard Museum open and Laurel's collection of 66 items as well as his vintage automobiles will be on display for a small charge.

Under the Mother Road in Chelsea

It's understandable if the idea of an underground pedestrian walkway below US 66 in a small town like Chelsea seems unnecessary now.

However, in the bustling days when 66 was a major transcontinental highway, it often was difficult for pedestrians to make it safely across the road.

Hence, many communities along Route 66 provided pedestrian tunnels under the pavement. Most have fallen out of use due to the reduction in traffic and have been hidden for decades. Towns like Odell, Illinois honor their tunnel, although it is not passable. Others still exist in El Reno and Sayre, among other places.

Now Chelsea' prime example is once again open to the foot going public, after a grand rededication ceremony April 30th of this year.

The restored, well-lit walkway even goes the old days one better, as it is now adorned with decorative murals of Chelsea are history and attractions.

Sponsored by Project Chelsea, these colorful murals were painted by area artist Ken Hollingshead of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, with help from 9-year-old Parker Stanbro of Chelsea. Hollingshead is quoted as saying: "I had a helper, nine-year-old Parker Stanbro, whose great-grandfather Fraley owned several of the business depicted in the mural. He was a fast and eager student."

Pictured in this underground art gallery are scenes such as the 1926 Pryor Creek Bridge on 66, the often photographed Chelsea Motel, the oldest of Chelsea's famed Sears kit houses, the first Oil Well in Oklahoma, and local farming and ranching tableaus.

The well-attended opening ceremony featured a car show and various dignitaries, including Cherokee Nation Tribal Counselor Keith Austin who presented a check to the Chelsea Chamber of Commerce.

The underpass crosses 66 on the west side of the intersection of 6th and Walnut (Route 66) at the stoplight. Visitors can find parking on 6th south of 66, or at the adjoining businesses.

Oklahoma Route 66 Hall of Fame Induction, 90th Anniversary Celebration, & Unveiling of Folk Art Exhibit

On August 6, 2016, the Oklahoma Route 66 Museum hosted the Route 66 Hall of Fame Induction and a celebration of the 90th Anniversary of Route 66. Along with these two events, the museum also unveiled a new folk art exhibit where art from artists across Oklahoma and Route 66 will be on display until next year.

Every two years, the Oklahoma Route 66 Association selects two people, one living and one deceased, to be inducted into the Oklahoma Route 66 Hall of Fame. These recipients have made outstanding contributions to the promotion, preservation, education or business along the Mother Road.

The 2016 inductees are Melvena Heisch, Deputy State Historic Preservation Officer, and the late Laurel Kane, a preservation advocate and owner of Afton Station.






