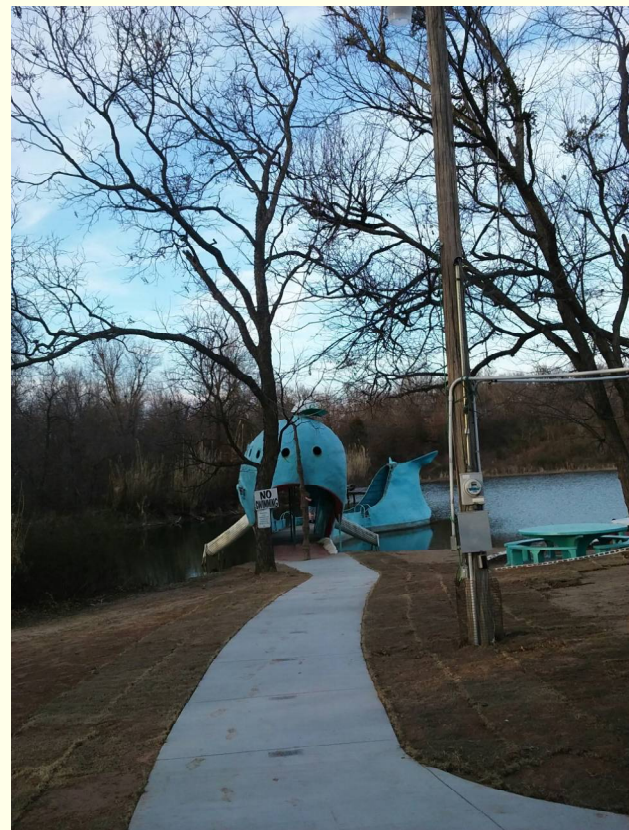
New Features at The Blue Whale

Built by Hugh Davis in the early 1970's, the Blue Whale of Catoosa is one of the most recognizable and photographed attractions on Route 66. Once abandoned, local volunteers, now known as the Fins of the Blue Whale, have rallied and saved the fate of the whale by painting the structure and cleaning the grounds. Picnic benches have been placed around the whale's little lake and the park now boasts a gift shop and public restrooms. Food trucks are usually present in the large parking area.

The annual Blue Tie Affair is the major fundraiser for the whale and the park. The project for 2015 was to raise money to create a brick sidewalk leading from the entrance gate of the park to the mouth of the whale. Called the Sidewalk Project, and completed in 2017, the walk is divided into 20 sections each containing granite paver bricks inscribed with three lines of text, chosen by the individual or group who paid for that section. Sod has been laid alongside the path and

grass seed is in place.

Route 66 Enthusiasts Wed at Chandler Museum

McClanahan is back home in Chandler where he maintains McJerry's Route 66 Gallery at the former Woody Keller home and shop site at 310 North Manvel Avenue. He is awaiting arrival of his bride later this year when her immigration proceedings are completed. The couple will reside in Chandler.

Mariko has travelled Route 66 alone a half dozen times or more. There will be no more trips alone, as she joins Jerry in exploring, researching and writing about the now historic old US highway – the love for it has brought them together.

Historic Baker's Café Destroyed by Fire

In the southwestern corner of Ottawa County lays a community that prospered from when it was established in 1886 well into the twentieth century. One of the many communities that make up the heart of Route 66, Afton was once a prosperous railroad town.

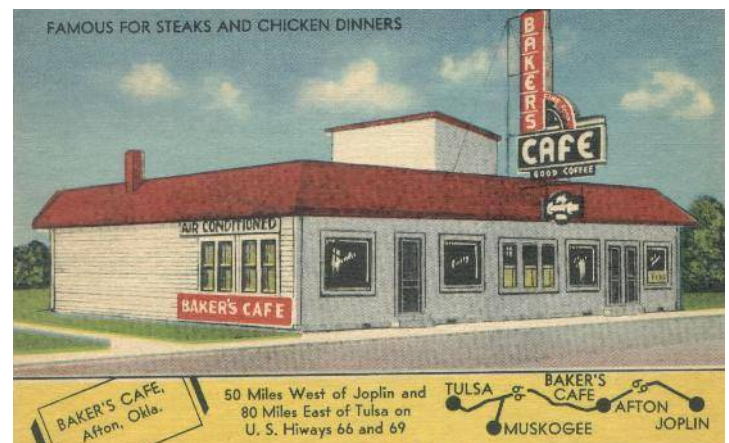
After crossing over the now famous Horse Creek Bridge into Afton, visitors found many cafes, movie theatres, banks, drug stores, lumber yard, ice house, grocery stores, department stores and service stations. Tourists were also drawn to the area to visit the famous Buffalo Ranch, Betty Wheatley's Dairy Ranch, and in later years, Laurel and David Kane's restored D-X Afton Station.

The former Baker's Café in downtown Afton holds many fond memories for travelers of Route 66 and those who grew up in this small town in northeastern Oklahoma. Known for its famous pies and "Good Coffee", the building that once housed the café right on Route 66 was completely destroyed by fire on February 12.

In more recent years the building has served the community as a day care center and was currently housing Afton Heat and Air. In its heyday, the café was operated by the Baker family of Afton.

The building was a complete loss, but the fire did not damage the surrounding buildings or overhead power lines.

The physical presence of this establishment may be gone, but the memories of enjoying a special meal or treat at the café and have fellowship with family and friends will be cherished for a lifetime.

Downtown Determined National Historic District

CLAREMORE – Three blocks of downtown Claremore received a new designation last month as the National Parks Service officially added the district to the National Register of Historic Places.

“We are so excited to receive this exclusive designation,” said Jessica Jackson, Claremore Main Street executive director. “Our volunteers have worked tirelessly on this project to benefit our district and further development in downtown Claremore.”

Included on the Register is the area between Route 66 and Muskogee Avenue and from 4th Street to the alley between Will Rogers Boulevard and Patti Page. The National Register of Historic Places is the official list of the Nation's historic places worthy of preservation.

The designation came after years of the research and application process by Claremore Main Street volunteers alongside the State Historic Preservation Office.

Main Street Board of Directors Treasurer Ray Brown and former executive director Cindy Bissett, along with other community members and volunteers, spent hours poring over research, talking to former residents and property owners and going through property records to complete the application and narrative.

“With the National Park Service designation, downtown Claremore has another major attraction to the City of Claremore,” Brown said. “With the historical structures downtown and the anticipated renovation, Claremore will attract even more people to the downtown area.”

“I was formally educated in demography and economic development; I have a lifetime interest in conducting research,” Brown said. “I love Claremore with its downtown area that is beautiful and historically significant, and I desire to see the City and its downtown area prosper.”

One of the major benefits of the designation to the National Register is that building owners will be able to make use of federal tax credits to revitalize or renovate their building, which would lead to some façade updates and upper floor development within the downtown district.”

Owners of qualifying buildings in the historic preservation district may receive federal and state tax credits up to 40 percent, “ Brown said. “Encouraging reinvestment creates for the owners more valuable assets which are very functional in today's commercial and social environment.”

Other benefits include the tourism perks and protection from federal government projects that may harm the district.

“The Downtown Claremore Historic District will join the Will Rogers Memorial Museum, the J.M. Davis Arms & Historical Museum, the Claremore Museum of History and many other attractions to become part of a true ‘destination center’ attracting visitors and encouraging business investment,” Brown said.

There are no regulations on property owners or what they can do to their buildings unless they wish to qualify for the tax credits.

“Being named to the National Register of Historic Places is quite an honor,” Jackson said. “We hope those travelers who love seeing historic sites will be sure to put us down as a stop. We have beautiful historic buildings, great culture and modern amenities perfect for any wanderer.”

The historic district is significant for its role in commerce in Claremore from 1890 to 1955. This area has been the center of commercial development in Claremore from shortly after its founding in the 1880s to the present.

The vast majority of the buildings were completed by the 1930s, with most commercial construction activity after this time being renovations.

The buildings in the Downtown Claremore Historic District reflect the commercial growth of this community, growth spurred by transportation routes like Route 66 and the two railroad systems, transportation related activities and the radium water bath industry.

Claremore’s district was one of eight new designations in the state and the only district included. In all, there are more than 90,000 properties nationwide included on the register.
