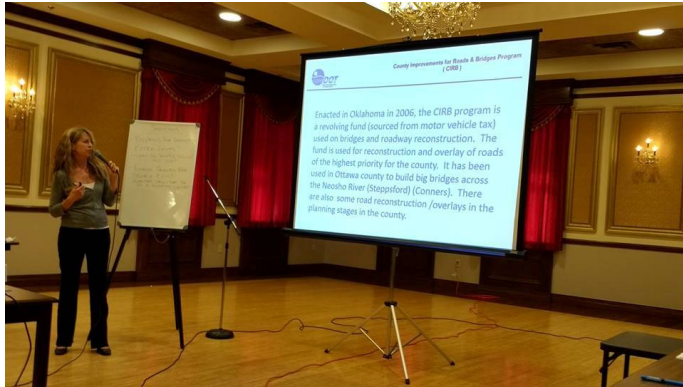

SAVE THE SIDEWALK HIGHWAY!

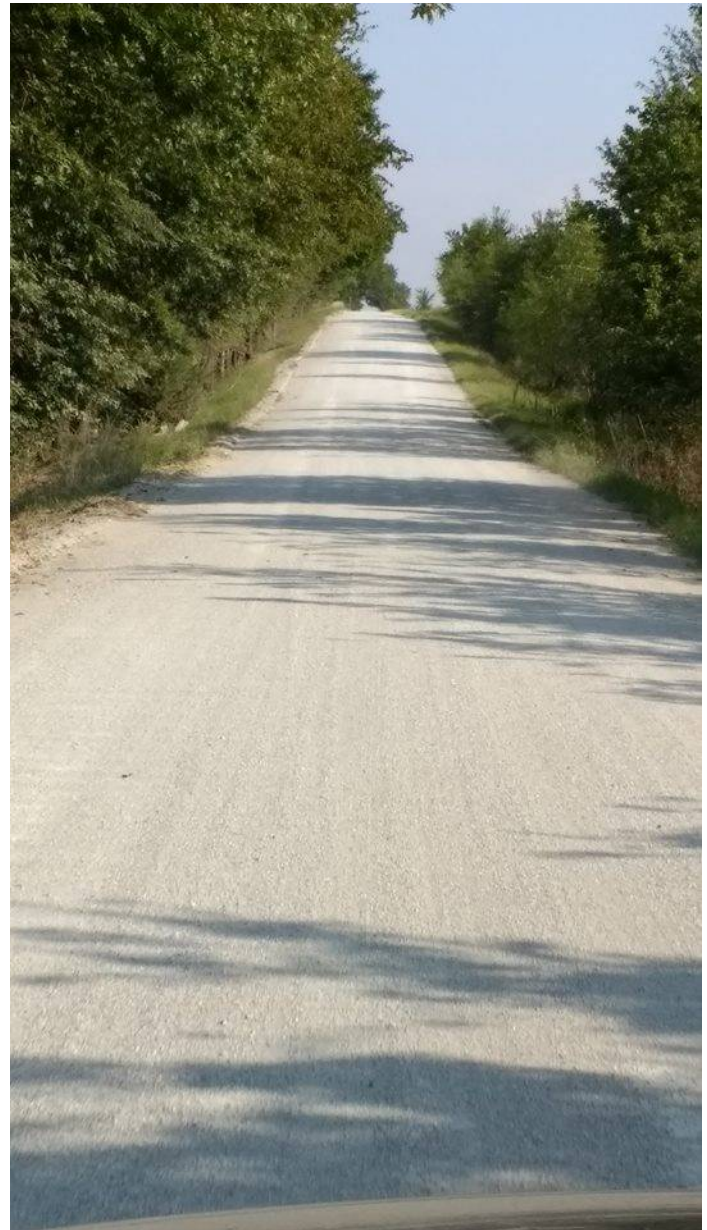
Kaisa Barthuli, Route 66 Corridor Program manager for the NPS, hosted an important meeting about Oklahoma's famous "Ribbon Road" held in Miami Oklahoma's opulent Coleman Theater, in itself an example of a stunning preservation success story.



The meeting's intent was not to come up with a concrete (or in this case "concrete and asphalt") plan for saving the rare remaining sections of 9 foot wide "Sidewalk Highway" lying between Miami and Afton, unique on 66.

The purpose was to have a conversation among the various interested parties concerning the fate of the historic road, including local representatives from Ottawa County and the city of Miami, plus landowners along the Ribbon Road, several members of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, and representatives from Kansas and Joplin, among others. All had a strong interest in preserving this stretch, the importance of which crosses state lines.

Kaisa delivered a PowerPoint presentation outlining the goals and accomplishments of the NPS 66 Corridor program, and a brief history of the section in question, which was Federal Aid Project number 8. There followed a give and take session concerning issues in preserving the road.



Local residents told of their frequent interactions with tourists who get lost trying to follow the gravel covered road, while county representatives spoke of the fact that previous signs erected to guide tourists were quickly stolen. Often heard from travelers was "Where is the Ribbon Road?" An emphasis was placed on the importance of 66 to the county and area communities, with one resident stating that "66 is our industry now."

Various possible solutions were offered, including a bypass road, paved shoulders, etc. But it was agreed that preservation of the original width and construction was the preferable outcome.

Going into this meeting Kaisa had plans to meet with the County Commissioners to discuss funding sources. She presented to all a range of funding options available to the county and city entities, including the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) and CIRB (County Improvement for Roads and Bridges) a revolving fund sourced from Motor vehicle taxes.

She also encouraged the local entities to apply for a grant from the 66 Corridor Program (which ends after 2019) for a "Historic Studies Report" covering the rare roadway. There is also the possibility of a "Cooperative Agreement" between the County and the NPS that does not require a competitive grant and is not cost sharing.

Also discussed were sources of possible funding for better signage, assuming they can be retained and not stolen.

Most everyone left this meeting with a clearer sense of the unique problems associated with preserving this unique pavement, and of the many measures that can be taken to obtain funds for this effort.

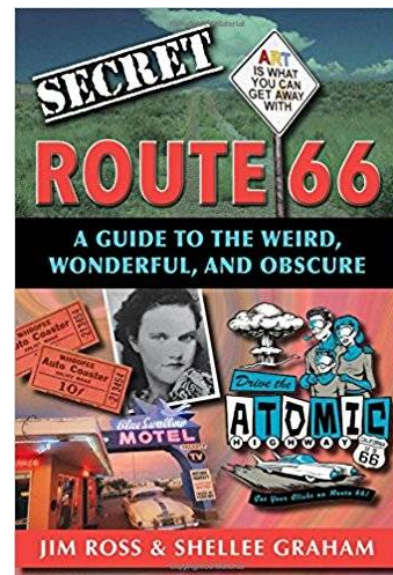

HISTORICAL MILITARY CONVOY TRAVELS DOWN ROUTE 66

On Saturday, September 16th a convoy left Chicago on Route 66. This wasn't any old convoy, though: this was a group of historic military vehicles taking the Mother Road all the way to California! Their journey through eight states would take about a month and, of course, they had to come through the Sooner State as a part of the trip! I met up with the convoy in Claremore mid-day on Monday the 25th of September at the Expo Center, where the group had stopped for a lunch break.



It was stunning to see so many immaculate old vehicles parked in the home town of Will Rogers. Jeeps, ambulances, cargo trucks, troop carriers, wagons, trailers, even an antique motorcycle. Most were from the American armed forces but there were several imported vehicles from abroad; there were representatives (both drivers and transport) from Australia & New Zealand. Some were veterans and others had restored vehicles in honor of veteran family members. Everyone was friendly and talked happily as I walked between the parked aisles of the rolling museum. Several local veterans had come out to greet the travelers, too; a few were too frail to walk and were being wheeled around

to share their memories with those that understood. It was really touching.



I met Janine McKluskey & her husband Dan, the Convoy Commander. It was great to meet in person finally, as we'd corresponded a few months earlier. Dan was pretty busy helping with minor repairs and keeping things organized, but Janine talked to me a bit about their crew. She also took me around and pointed out a few things I'd missed, like the recovery vehicles they had along for the inevitable breakdown. There was a fancy portable bathroom trailer they'd named the "White Castle." Many of the trailers had been retrofitted as recreational vehicles, providing unique lodging for their owners. I asked if they'd stopped at the J.M. Davis Arms Museum while in town but, alas, it was closed Mondays.

At 1:00 PM sharp, the convoy rounded up and headed towards Tulsa. I lit out a few minutes early so I could set up on the southwest side of town for photos of the convoy on the move. They had a police escort all the way out of Claremore! I followed along Route 66, watching motorists on both sides of the road marvel at the unexpected parade. Unfortunately, there was no police escort through Catoosa or Tulsa; the convoy broke up a bit as they rolled into town. The convoy is limited to 35 MPH so all the vehicles can

keep up, which made it easy for me to speed ahead and watch them pass several icons like the Meadow Gold sign. Several of the convoy drivers remarked at my speed (and ubiquity) as they noticed me at each new stakeout spot.



The destination of the day's drive was the VFW Post in Sapulpa. I pulled in at the tail end of the convoy, parked, and continued taking photos. Jerry McClanahan had come up from Chandler and we visited for a few minutes while we marveled. It was a wonderful experience and one I hope quite a few Route 66 travelers have had along the way.

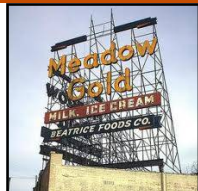
