Bunion Derby Celebrated

Recently the famed “Bunion Derby” from 1928 was reenacted once again by the Oklahoma Route 66 Association.

The first big promotional event associated with U.S. 66, promoter C.C Pyle’s “First Annual International-Trans-Continental Foot Race Los Angeles to New York -1928” included Route 66 from Los Angeles to Chicago.

The approximately 3,400 mile race and \$25,000 cash prize was won by Andy Payne, a Cherokee from the little Route 66 town of Foyil, Oklahoma.

Quoted from the article by John Klein in the Tulsa World:

“The actual Bunion Derby was held just two years after the opening of Route 66 from Chicago to the Pacific Ocean,” said Rhys Martin, vice chairman of the Tulsa Route 66 Commission. “So it was significant because it helped to publicize the new road. It was a very big event that got a lot of publicity across the country. It was held to make sure people knew that the road was open.”

In that spirit of publicizing Historic Route 66 and reminding folks it is still here, on April 13-14 of 2018 a mechanized version of the foot race was held from the Texas state line at Texola to the Kansas border in celebration of the 90th anniversary.

The plaque paused a moment in its eastward trek (carried by organizer Carol Duncan) at Chandler's Route 66 Interpretive Center in the historic 1937 armory (home office of the OK 66 Association) where it was greeted by Doug Payne, race-winner Andy's nephew.

In true Route 66 spirit, a beautiful white Corvette driven by Doug Carlson carried the plaque to its overnight stop at Stroud, before the plaque finished up at the OK/KS line the next day.

Preservation of Roadside Architecture & Attractions Symposium

Tulsa has had a lot of Route 66 happenings in the last few months. Not only has a new gift shop opened on 11th street (Buck Atom's Cosmic Curios, near the iconic Meadow Gold sign) and the Tulsa Route 66 Commission continued with their plans to enhance neon signage along the Mother Road, but in April the city hosted the National Center for Preservation Technology and Training (NCPTT) for a symposium on Preservation of Roadside Architecture & Attractions.

As the Tulsa County Representative for the Association and Vice Chair of the Tulsa Route 66 Commission, I joined approximately 50 other attendees from around the country to learn about various efforts (both historic and ongoing) to preserve, restore, and bring awareness to various roadside relics both on and off Route 66.

We heard from a gentleman who helped restore the 9,000 square foot terrazzo Texaco highway map of New York State from the 1964 World's Fair. I listened to talks about Dinosaur Valley State Park, Oklahoma City neon signs, old Phillips 66 stations in the Midwest, Civil War-era cycloramas, various marketing initiatives, and more.

Our two keynote addresses were from author/historian Michael Wallis and Dylan Thuras from Atlas Obscura. I gave the last talk of the conference on Day 3, highlighting photography as a preservation tool. I learned a lot and made many new friends over three days. I was also very pleased to hear from folks that had never been to Tulsa how much they were enjoying their time in

the former Oil Capital of the World.

I also had the opportunity to lead two field excursions during the conference. Our first trip was a neon tour of Tulsa. We only had two hours set aside for our tour, so I had to make some tough decisions on what to show off...but it went really well. We saw the signage at Cain's Ballroom, the Atlas Life Building, the Meadow Gold pavilion, the Circle Cinema, Moody's Jewelry on Harvard, the Desert Hills Motel, and Sheridan Lanes bowling alley.

The second tour was a half-day trip on Route 66 from Tulsa to Foyil, OK. We had a wonderful time touring the Rose Bowl in Tulsa, the Blue Whale in Catoosa, and Totem Pole Park! We even stopped for pie and coffee at Hammett House in Claremore – a must-visit if you've never been. Overall, the symposium provided a great snapshot of what makes Route 66 so special, especially in Oklahoma.

And speaking of National Historic Trail designation (and forgive me for a bit of political news), the legislation passed the House of Representatives with a unanimous YES vote and is now making its way to the Senate and hopefully to President Trump's desk for signature. If you would like to read more about the legislation (along with full text of the bill), go to congress.gov and use the search features to find "HR 801".

Also, while you're at congress.gov, look up "HR 66" (titled "Route 66 Centennial Commission Act"). It's a piece of legislation to establish a commission for celebrating the 100th anniversary of Route 66 in the year 2026. As of last month this piece of legislation has made it out of committee and is awaiting a vote of the House.

And, in August (10th & 11th), we could use a few volunteers to help at the Birthplace of Route 66 Festival in Springfield, MO. It's nice to have some help. Gives everyone a chance to enjoy the festivities! And it's inside. In the air conditioning!

And a reminder for the motorcycle riders in the audience... Oklahoma now has an official specialty license plate for Route 66! More details can be found in the news section on our website. The office in Chandler has already received a few photos on the new plates on rider's motorcycles!

Maybe I'll see you in Shamrock or Springfield, MO...

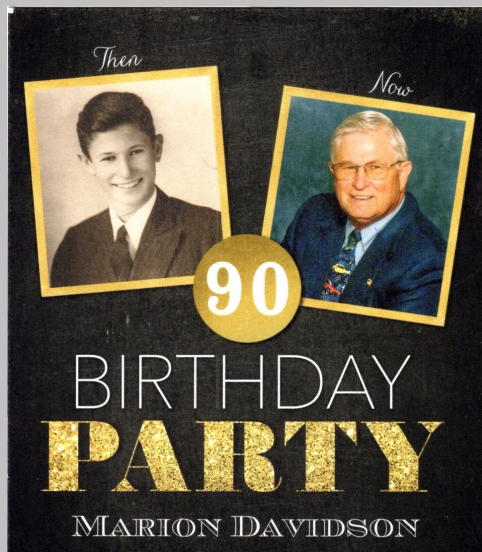
